## **Pastor's Letter**

#### Do not conform yourselves to this age but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may discern what is the will of God Romans 12:2

Jesus praised Peter last week for his declaration of faith and named him the rock upon which Jesus will build the church. Yet when Jesus speaks of the rejection, suffering, and death that he will soon undergo, Jesus challenges Peter not to be caught up in the ways of this world. Peter had presumed that the Christ would triumph by avoiding suffering and death; that would define an earthly Messiah and certainly be expected of the Son of God. Jesus insists that Peter go deeper and realize that it is through experiencing suffering and death, not by avoiding them, that God will conquer the power of both.

We are called to witness to this truth. Our most powerful witness is not when all seems to be going our way and we seem beyond harm. On the contrary, it is when we experience rejection, failure, serious illness, personal or world tragedy, and a death that comes tragically or too soon that we can become the most powerful witnesses to who Jesus is and what his death means for us. God sent God's Son to save the world <u>not</u> by taking away the consequences of an imperfect world in which human beings often misuse the free will God has given us. Rather, Jesus died and rose to conquer the power of sin and death to separate us from the love of God and our life in Christ. We bring this message of hope to others not through naive phrases or denial of suffering. We witness to our faith as we face the darkness present in our world and the difficult moments in our personal and family lives. And we walk this journey together that we may be strengthened not only by Word and Eucharist, but by our coming together with and for one another.

Our parish Elementary School has begun a new year filled with hope and the witness of a strong and faithful administration and faculty. Our parish School of Religious Education will begin this week with the faithful witness of parishioners serving as catechists and assistants. We are inviting high school juniors and seniors to participate in the next Kairos Retreat. In collaboration with St. John of the Cross, we are exploring ways to keep our ministry to teens alive until we have found our next youth minister. *That Man is You* begins another year of formation and sharing for all men of the parish. And our parish Evangelization Team is looking at ways we can support and nourish the faith of all parishioners in the months ahead. May the Spirit inspire and guide us!

Thank you to the members of the parish Men's Club and Women's Club, who provided a great evening of food and fun for all ages at the Parish Block Party. It was great to see parishioners of all ages connect with friends and make new friends as the children tried their hands at the offered games and created new ones.

Blessings to all who labor, especially essential workers, on this Labor Day. This is a weekend to be especially aware of those who often are invisible to us yet who make possible so much of what we take for granted. Express a word of thanks when the opportunity presents itself.

In honor of Most Rev. John Manz, who lived his life to the fullest by serving others and advocating for workers' rights, Arise Chicago re-presents Bishop Manz's Labor Day message from 2019.

#### Most Rev. John R. Manz Auxiliary Bishop of Chicago

Over Labor Day weekend, I invite you to reflect on the tenets of our faith that proclaim that all workers have sacred worth and, therefore, they deserve dignity and respect. Catholic Social Teaching further instructs us that all workers should have safe work conditions and family-sustaining wages. Yet, as we know, the income gap between the wealthiest and poorest among us continues to grow, resulting in many of our hard-working families living below the poverty line.

In response to the growing income inequality around us, Pope Francis recently instructed, "We can no longer wait to solve the structural causes of poverty, to heal our society from a sickness that can only lead to new crises. Markets and financial speculation should not enjoy absolute autonomy. Unless we solve the problems of the poor we shall not resolve the world's problems. We need programs, mechanisms and processes that lead to a better distribution of resources, the creation of jobs and all-around promotion of those who are excluded."

Over this holiday weekend I hope you will reflect on how we as Catholics are called upon to end the exploitation of workers. The Archdiocese is proud to be a partner with Arise Chicago, a 28 year-old interfaith organization that boasts Msgr. Jack Egan as one of its co-founders. Arise teaches workers their rights, builds leadership skills, and advocates for public policy changes—all of which transform lives and communities. www.arisechicago.org This weekend, in partnership with the Chicago Federation of Labor (CFL), Arise Chicago has prepared speakers in over 100 services, lifting up the sacred link between work and faith.

As a part of our Labor Day reflection, we need to turn away from the idolatry of wealth that can deceive us into believing that we are self-sufficient, and instead embrace the truth that we are all divinely connected to each other. We cannot live in a world without car mechanics, shoe salespersons, teachers, hotel workers, grocery store clerks, nurses, etc. I invite you to honor through your prayers and actions the dignity of workers, especially those who you encounter in your daily interactions. Reflect on how each of us, through our work, contribute our unique God-given gifts to the common good of humanity. Hold in prayer all of those longing for jobs and all of those who labor under poor working conditions. Our interconnectedness in faith and our dependence on each other in life give us a lot to celebrate together! Blessed Labor Day!

### Ministry of Care is Planning to Expand

A Minister of Care is a person who brings the gift of the eucharist and friendship to fellow parishioners and others who are homebound, living in nursing homes, or recovering in the hospital. Our visits help those in need stay connected to the parish and our faith community.

It's a very rewarding ministry and I promise you will receive more than you'll give. The time required varies depending on the activity you choose. Perhaps a few minutes or more on a homebound visit to an hour or so conducting a Prayer and Communion Service or bringing the eucharist to those in the hospital. Those visiting the homebound schedule visits convenient for the minister and the person being visited. Nursing homes and the hospital have fixed schedules.

The Archdiocese requires new ministers to receive 12 hours of instruction prior to being commissioned. After training, you will "shadow" other ministers to learn about your chosen activity. When you are comfortable, you'll receive a quarterly schedule.

## **St. Phoebe Celebration: Weekend of September 9-10**

Next weekend marks both the feast of St Phoebe and the end of the year of St. Phoebe (Sep 3, 2022—Sep 3, 2023) in which we prayerfully listened and discerned with the Holy Spirit on the topic of women in the diaconate as part of the global Synod on Synodality.



## On the weekend of September 9 & 10, we invite those attending mass to:

- ⇒ PRAY through the intercession of St Phoebe for the Synod and the delegation going to Rome,
- ⇒ CELEBRATE women's gifts and contributions to the Church,
- $\Rightarrow$  **HEAR** women of the parish reflect on scripture and
- ⇒ BEAR WITNESS to the critical and urgent need to re-think women's participation in the Church.



I commend to you our sister Phoebe, [diakonos] of the church at Cenchreae. Letter of St. Paul to the Romans 16:1

"Growing up, I never heard about St. Phoebe. She, like so many women of the early church, was lost to me for a long time...

Not until my late 20s do I recall Phoebe's name surfacing in my consciousness and even then, I couldn't place her beyond the heading "women of the early church." The reasons she remained in the shadows of my consciousness are as much a reflection of my own life and learning as of the institutions that have taught me and their conscious and unconscious influence on our wider perspectives as individuals and a church.

Phoebe appears in Paul's letter to the Romans, in which he exhorts the Romans: "I commend to you our sister Phoebe,

a deacon of the church in Cenchreae." Paul writes, "I ask you to receive her in the Lord in a way worthy of his people and to give her any help she may need from you, for she has been the benefactor of many people, including me" (Romans 16:1-2).

Brief though it is, this introduction is full of import. In these two verses, Paul provides critical information about the woman he has entrusted to deliver his letter to Rome.

Calling her sister, deacon and benefactor, Paul signals that Phoebe is his co-worker in the kingdom. He has chosen her to convey his message and it is his hope that they, like her, will come to believe and to support the Christian mission. By identifying Phoebe as a deacon, Paul indicates that she was a preacher and teacher of the faith and gives us the earliest written record of women's ordained ministry in the church..."
