Pastor's Letter

I rejoice heartily in the Lord, in my God is the joy of my soul.
Isaiah 61:10

Rejoice!

What brings joy to your heart? Is it the songs of the “toddler choirs at Sunday morning Mass? Or the stillness of the neighborhood on a soft snowy evening? Is it the excitement of children when they speak of Santa’s visit and wonder how he will get in if you have no chimney? Is it finding just the right gift for someone special in your life? Or is it simply knowing that all you love are home safe?

The candle of the Third Sunday of Advent is different from the others. God loves us so deeply that God sent Jesus, the Son, to teach us how to love one another and to offer humankind a new beginning in our relationship with God. The rose candle of week three bids us to let gift of God’s love into our hearts and then let its joy go out to others. This is not a week to hold back, as if there were nothing to be joyful about until Christmas Day. The joy of Christmas never leaves us when we open our hearts to receive it.

My earliest Christmas memories are of a tree, appearing out of nowhere, fully decorated, on Christmas morning. It was one more present from Santa. After a few years, however, our parents informed us that Santa had left them a note. It said that he thought we were now old enough to share in the joy of decorating the tree, and that from now on dad would get the tree for us to begin. My Irish mother’s rule was that we could not begin to decorate the tree until we had lit the rose candle. So the lighting of this candle was a joyful moment for us children, even as dad tried to be patient in figuring out which of the colored bulbs needed to be replaced so that the entire string would light up. (If you’re too young to know what I am talking about, ask your elders.)

Perhaps one way to connect with the joy of this season is to bring to mind and heart memories of Christmases past: that special toy that was our constant companion; the ornament from an early Christmas or that has been passed on over generations; a Christmas when everyone was able to be together; or the last Christmas we spent with someone close to us. We remember, but not to think as if the good times are behind us; we remember to look ahead in hope to what may surprise, delight, or tough our hearts in the week ahead.

Of course, Christmas is not a time of rejoicing for everyone among us. Christmas holds a wide range of emotions, some easy to remember and some difficult to recall. We might be aware of those who are no longer with us around the tree. Tensions within the family may make it difficult for us to come together in one place at the same time; or families may have to travel to see some relatives while unable to be with others. We need to be sensitive to those around us for whom this Christmas may be a time of mixed blessings and offer them gentle comfort and hope for days to come.

This week I honor one more Christmas tradition. I will accompany a friend to Goodman Theatre’s production of “A Christmas Carol” and be touched once more by a man whose heart is revived by the memories of what has been, the realization of what is, and the possibilities of what may yet be. **Choose joy and hope this week!** God is with us.

OPLATKI

The Christmas Wafer (also known as "Oplatki") is available at the Rectory.



The word "Bethlehem" means "the house of bread." The breaking of the bread is a sign of charity, unity and friendship. Religious family customs bring the truths of faith into the home. One of these beautiful Christmas Eve customs is the Christmas Wafer. The thin wafer bearing the Christmas characters is broken by the head of the family and distributed to each member. With a simple prayer for God's grace and the welfare of all members of the family, those present as well as those who are absent, the head of the house breaks the wafer and distributes it, one piece to each person at the table. While doing so, each member of the family is kissed and wished a joyful feast. Members then greet one another in the same way.

The spiritual lesson in this age-old custom is that the unity of the family is grounded in God's love for us. May you experience unity and love through this simple celebration.

SAFE AND SOBER HOLIDAYS

Did you know that 10-13% of all people in any community live with the disease of alcoholism or other chemical dependence? This includes 10-13% of our parish community. Each person who lives with a chemically dependent person also has a disease that negatively affects the lives of at least four other persons. 40% of the members of any community know someone, or are concerned about someone, or are angry at someone who lives with this progressive and potentially fatal disease.

If you care about someone who has a drinking or other drug problem, I encourage you to get help for yourself. Go to ALANON if you are affected by someone's chemical dependency. Go to FAMILIES ANONYMOUS if you are the relative or friend of a young person with drug problems. Go to ADULT CHILDREN OF ALCOHOLICS if you are the adult son or daughter of someone with an alcohol or other drug problem. *Get help for yourself before* you attempt to intervene in the life of someone who is addicted. This is the best gift you can give to someone who is dependent on alcohol or another drug.

Here are some healthy guidelines for holiday drinking and entertaining.

HOLIDAY DRINKING GUIDELINES

1. Drink only if you can. If you have been told not to drink, or if you take medication that does not mix with alcohol, don't drink.

Just one drink can hurt you.

2. Don't drink more than one drink per hour. If you can drink more than this without feeling any effect, it may be a symptom of the disease of alcoholism.

A high tolerance for alcohol is a sign of disease – not a good thing.

3. Don't drink if you "don't drink." Don't take a beverage to avoid hurting your host or hostess.

Not drinking is okay.

4. Alcohol mixes better with the gasoline in a car than with the driver. If you plan on having a "really good time?" then plan on not driving.

Drunk drivers can kill people.

HOLIDAY ENTERTAINING GUIDELINES

1. Never tell a guest, "Aw, c'mon. One drink won't hurt you. It's Christmas!"

The calendar has no effect on the effects of alcohol.

2. Don't serve more than one drink per hour to any guest. Minimize the time before serving food.

Don't poison your guests.

3. Don't give a guest who "doesn't drink" a hard time. Don't argue when someone says, "No thanks."

Provide non-alcoholic refreshments and let your guests choose.

4. Hot coffee or cold towels only make a person more awake. If a guest is drunk, do not let them drive. Get them a ride or cab or let them sleep it off.

Drunk drivers can kill people.

Surviving the Holidays

Some family situations can make the holidays difficult. For example,

- there's no money
- the kids are at the other parent's house
- a loved one has died this past year

These top ten tips for "Surviving the Holidays" can help you exchange the dread, anxiety, or loneliness for a time of inner peace and hope.

1. Have realistic expectations.

This year WILL be different; resist trying to make it the same as other years.

2. Know you can stay home this year.

This year you may feel like staying at home, which is a normal part of grief and healing. Many people may insist—maybe even push—to get you out. Be honest with yourself. If you are overwhelmed and need the security of solace, give yourself permission to stay in. If you go to the party and are ambushed by extreme emotions, give yourself permission to thank the host and leave early.

3. Do something special for yourself.

Plan a time close to Christmas day to go to a good movie, do a little window shopping, drop into church for a prayer, or enjoy a special treat. It doesn't have to be lavish. If you'd rather stay home, then download a favorite movie, cook a favorite meal, and cozy up in a way that comforts you.

4. Do something for someone else.

One of the best ways to come out of our misery is to help someone else. Volunteering restores many to the reality that God is good and there are many things for which to be thankful. Some focus their attention on Christmas presents for the children.

5. Keep it simple.

Having a Christmas tree may cheer up some; but for others it will be too depressing. Sending Christmas cards can be very therapeutic; but for some it is a time-consuming and unnecessary expense. Re-examine *everything* you used to do during the holidays; keep what works and let go of the rest.

6. Keep in touch with the children.

Children crave routines and rituals, which give them a sense of security—especially holiday customs. Keep as many of the holiday routines that *they* best love. Ask what *their* favorites are and help them focus on the fun.

7. Don't celebrate with your ex.

Unless it's been years, the kids are older, *and* you really do get along well. It sounds good that you should all be able to get along at the holidays—but it's most often a myth. In most cases it confuses everyone, especially the children.

8. Help the children buy a present for their other parent.

Imagine how difficult it can be to get a present for mom or dad without any help. Some things should never change: like encouraging children to love, honor, and respect both parents.

9. Draw close to God.

This holiday is about the answer to every person's prayer: God come to us in the flesh. Let Mary's kind eyes fall upon you and Joseph's strong gaze give you hope.

10. Go to Christmas Mass and rejoice in your heart.

On Christmas day your emotions may be extremely tender; the tears may flow, and the cries of your heart may mix with the strains of "Silent Night." But come. Come as you are. Know that you are loved. Know that there is hope. Know that there *will* be resurrection and salvation. *This* is the hope of these holidays.

O come, let us adore our God made flesh in Jesus.

Giving Treasure - Frequently Asked Questions

Considering which method of giving is right for you? Curious about ways in which St. Francis parishioners give? Check out the FAQ below.

What method of giving is most cost-effective for the parish?

Online donations from your bank checking or savings account. The processing fees for these are about 0.5%, as compared to credit card fees of 3.5%. For example, an annual donation of \$1,000 via bank account provides support of \$995, compared to \$965 from credit card. We are happy to report that the largest percentage of last year's Sunday offertory funds (32%) came from this method of giving. To give in this method, scan the QR code below or [Click Here](#).

If I want to give using my credit card, can I cover the higher transaction fee?

Yes – now you can! This is new to Give Central, our online giving processor. Log into your Give Central account and select "I would like to cover the processing fee" when you make or change your contribution. Currently, about 22% of our annual Sunday offertory is received from this method. To give in this method, scan the QR code below or [Click Here](#).

Can I continue using my offertory envelopes?

Absolutely. We continue to receive 30% of our Sunday offertory in this way. We are looking at ways to reduce the cost of printing and mailing, and there may be future changes to the number of envelopes and frequency of mailing.

How important is my Christmas or Easter donation?

Very important! These two special donations totaled 10% (\$215,000) of our funding last year. While all parishioners receive the envelopes with Fr. Bill's Christmas and Easter reflections, you can alternatively set up online giving right now using the QR code below or [Clicking Here](#).

Are there any other methods to give to offertory?

This month, we highlight the extraordinary efforts to beautify our worship space during Advent and Christmas. Our Facilities Department teamed up with the Art & Environment Committee to prepare our church for liturgies from the first Sunday of Advent through the Epiphany on January 6 and 7. While some traditions continue (the Advent wreath, creche, Christmas trees), this year we have new "behind the scenes" technology which enlightens in either blue or pink behind the altar. This new lighting no longer stands on the floor of the narrow aisleway (safer!) and it operates with LED bulbs (economical and eco-friendly!) and an I-pad. In addition, take a look at the outdoor lighting along Spring Avenue, which also was newly installed to light up the grounds and façade of the church.

Each December, our church is a welcome beacon of hope and community when hundreds return to LaGrange to celebrate Christmas with family. As Celine Heraty, the leader of our Arts and Environment Committee, says: "Creating warm and welcoming worship spaces allows our parish families to experience the Liturgy in a beautiful and prayerful setting that includes all elements of design. Lighting and color are key to achieving this goal and St. Francis has always been a leader using background lighting to create an ambiance for each liturgical season."




What is Alpha?




