

Pastor's Letter

*"Let us go on to the nearby villages, that I may preach there also.
For this purpose I have come."*

Mark 1:38

The first disciples of Jesus were from the area surrounding the town of Capernaum on the Sea of Galilee. In Mark's gospel, it is here that Jesus begins his proclamation of the kingdom of God and performs his first healings. Mark tells us that Jesus spent the entire day healing people from that town, and then went off by himself to pray. The first disciples thought that their town had acquired its own personal healer; one who would continue to cure their every illness. Yet Jesus teaches them that **his mission extends far beyond their hometown**. He has come to preach the kingdom to all who will listen, and to bring God's healing love wherever it is needed.

This is our mission as well. We begin by coming to know Jesus in Word and Eucharist and allowing him to shape us as a community of believers, his Body in the world. We are blessed to be part of a vibrant faith community situated in a broader community with ample resources and a commitment to care for those among us in need. These blessings provide a firm foundation for our mission, in which the Spirit sends us out to bring the good news of the kingdom to people and places *beyond* our community where it is most needed.

As was true in the time of Jesus, our mission will sometimes stir controversy. Our efforts to support the human dignity of immigrants by providing basic necessities of food and shelter stands apart from our political positions on how best to bring comprehensive reform to our broken immigration system. Our opposition to capital punishment and our efforts to uphold the dignity of prisoners is distinct from our opinions on other details of our criminal reform system. Our advocacy for the dignity of *every* human life from conception to natural death must never lead us to condemn or otherwise harm those who hold opposing views. And our insistence on the dignity of those whose lifestyles or behaviors are inconsistent with Church teachings is rooted in a belief that *judgement belongs to God alone*. Jesus challenges us to embrace *all* people as our sisters and brothers; our mission is to bring to *all* the message of God's love and God's embrace of all who seek God.

Living out our mission is especially challenging in a politically charged atmosphere that often attempts to force people into opposing "camps" and to judge some as more worthy of dignity than others. The early healings that Jesus performed brought amazement and hope. But as time went on, his actions also brought condemnation as Jesus continued to expand the boundaries of *whom* we must treat as brother or sister. Even the disciples closest to Jesus sometimes found his teachings and actions hard to accept. Pope Francis sets before us the image of a field tent, in which people arrive in need of healing and are tended to by those who continue to seek healing in their own lives. We are a home for imperfect, sinful people who care for one another, and who continue to open our hearts and minds to a loving God who embraces us in our imperfection.

This Friday evening, **Pillars Community Health will honor Linda Moran**, a longtime St. Francis Xavier parishioner. Over twenty years ago, Linda identified the need for a program to help children deal with the death of a family member or friend. Buddy's Place continues to provide that loving support to grieving children, ages 4 through 18. Thank you and congratulations to Linda, who has lived our mission in and beyond parish boundaries. You challenge us all to listen to what new things God may be asking of us.

This is the last full week before Lent begins. Ash Wednesday falls on Valentine's Day this year, so make plans to celebrate before it arrives.

Finding God in all things

St Ignatius was convinced that God could be found in every area of life, meaning that everything, from relationships to family, from happiness to suffering - everything - is a part of the spiritual life.

St. Francis Xavier Parish is offering an opportunity for you to participate in an adapted version of the Spiritual Exercises.

In stages, referred to as “weeks,” the retreatant contemplates various aspects of your own life, as well as the life, Passion, and Resurrection of Jesus.

Outline of obligations:

A commitment each day for about 45 minutes of prayer and reflection.

Availability to meet once a week for about an hour with an Ignatian "guide" who facilitates helpful sharing about the ongoing experiences. This will be a group gathering with others on the same journey

Scripture passages, Ignatius’s meditations and contemplations, or other exercises.

After the first meeting (in person), weekly meetings will occur over Zoom

5. Have you ever met with a spiritual director for ongoing spiritual direction? And, if so, when and how frequently?
6. Who is God for you?
7. Who are you for God?
8. How would you describe your relationship with God? Explain.
9. Describe your spiritual practices, prayer, and/or devotional life? Please be specific.
10. Please take time to describe an experience in your life when you felt especially close to God.
11. Was there a time, or are there times, when God seems particularly absent? Explain.
12. Has your relationship with God changed over the years and, if so, how? Explain.
13. Are you able to pray for at least 45 minutes each day for the 8 weeks of the 18th Annotation/Spiritual Exercises? (This is essential).
14. Do you have any concerns about making this 8-week experience of the Spiritual Exercises of Ignatius? If "yes," please share them.

PLEASE NOTE: An Ignatian Prayer Adventure will involve a significant commitment of time and energy on the part of the retreatant. In fact, the term "Exercises" is most appropriate because this unique experience of Christian faith and spirituality requires daily prayer and steady attention to the movements of the Holy Spirit. Thus, it requires a certain level of "spiritual stamina." You will be asked to devote at least 45 minutes per day in personal prayer and to meet once a week with the group in a meeting facilitated by the spiritual director. Past retreatants would undoubtedly tell you that the time put in yields great rewards, and that making the Spiritual Exercises of Ignatius of Loyola is a transforming experience in life; but there is no question that this, indeed, is a commitment. By submitting this application you are expressing an understanding and commitment to the requirement for daily prayer and weekly spiritual direction.

Through google translate, we learned of all they had to leave behind including family members, their home and jobs. They expressed deep gratitude for the warm welcome and all the items to set up their home but their greatest desire is to find work.

REFUGEE is a person who has fled their own country because they are at risk of serious human rights violations and persecution there. The risks to their safety and life were so great that they felt they had no choice but to leave and seek safety outside their country because their own government cannot or will not protect them from those dangers. Refugees have a right to international protection.

ASYLUM SEEKER is a person who has left their country and is seeking protection from persecution and serious human rights violations in another country, but who hasn't yet been legally recognized as a refugee and is waiting to receive a decision on their asylum claim. Seeking asylum is a human right. This means everyone should be allowed to enter another country to seek asylum.

There is no internationally accepted legal definition of a **MIGRANT**. Migrants are people staying outside their country of origin, who are not asylum seekers or refugees. Some migrants leave their country because they want to work, study or join family, for example. Others feel they must leave because of poverty, political unrest, gang violence, natural disasters or other serious circumstances that exist there.





Ogden Avenue will soon be designated a 20 mph School Zone between Ashland Avenue and Gilbert Avenue on school days. The change will make safer this highly trafficked area, which is traveled by so many area children and families. It will help to slow down traffic and call further attention to the presence of children in the stretch of Ogden Avenue that holds five schools. We have been told that the permanent signs should be installed in approximately two weeks.
