Pastor's Letter

"Where I am, there also will my servant be." John 12:26



On the Sundays of Lent, I have been naming the five areas of ongoing development for a *missionary disciple*. No one is fully developed in all five areas; nor can we focus on all five areas at once. The five areas appear in the graphic as a wheel, suggesting that our lives as missionary disciples are *a pattern of growing* in all five areas. We need not proceed in any specific order. At any point, we begin wherever we feel the Spirit inviting us to move deeper.

The fifth and final focus of a missionary disciple is **WITNESS**. You might at first think of this as part of what we do in ministry as we each actively live out our specific call to serve the mission of Jesus. However, **witness** is

not primarily about what we do in ministry. The **witness** of a missionary disciple is a general *way of being* as we live our faith in our circles of family, friends, colleagues, and strangers. **Witness** is what people see, hear, and sense when they are around us. Missionary disciples **witness** through the stories they share of their experiences with God in general or Jesus in particular. We **witness** when we live the teachings of Jesus in everyday moments. **Witness** is *a way of living that reveals God to others and/or invites them* to learn more about the Jesus whom we follow.

Is what those we serve through our Food Pantry experience our **witness** every Tuesday morning as an expression of care for our sisters and brothers in Christ who are in need: not only of the food we share but the smiles and kind words they receive as they drive through the line. **Witness** is the act of someone who talks about their experience after a Sunday Mass and invites others to join them next week. **Witness** is not being afraid if others see us setting aside time for prayer, or even inviting others to pray with us. **Witness** is being consistent in the decisions we make in our attitudes and actions toward other people – especially those who annoy us or whose life choices we may not understand. **Witness** happens when we forgive those who have harmed us or openly mock our shortcomings; because we are assured that the grace of God's forgiveness will flow into our hearts the moment we confess what we have done or failed to do, let go of our desire to judge or get even, and express our desire for God's grace.

During the weeks of Lent, all parish children in grades two through four are given the opportunity to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation; the same for all children in the elementary school from fifth through eighth grade. **Monday night at 7:00 PM** is *an opportunity for all other parishioners* to celebrate this Sacrament of healing and reunion with God. **St. Francis Xavier is hosting the second of two Area Lent Reconciliation services.** The Sacrament of Reconciliation is *not about shame or judgment* (even if someone in the past made you think or feel this). Reconciliation is about naming the places in my life in need of God's healing love, so that the forgiveness that God has already offered me can enter my heart and draw me closer to God and others. Celebrating as a community allows us to support and encourage one another in coming to know that we <u>all</u> belong here; we <u>all</u> are God's beloved children, sisters and brothers to one another in Christ.

When I sin, God forgives me, right away, no matter what! Take those words to heart. We need only admit our need and desire for the loving grace of forgiveness for it to enter our hearts. Open your heart to the love that Jesus so deeply desires to share with you.


Reflection for the 5th Sunday of Lent

Today concludes Jesus' public ministry. Shortly we will enter Holy Week. He prepares us for what is coming. The first reading is hopeful. 



THE FEAST OF MERCY (Divine Mercy Sunday)

(REFLECTION ON DIVINE MERCY, DIVINE MERCY CHAPLET PRAYER, SILENT ADORATION, AND BENEDICTION).

The Feast of Mercy or Divine Mercy Sunday has been celebrated in many countries, dioceses and parishes for many years. Pope John Paul II, the Cardinals, Bishops and Priests who have read the diary of St. Faustina have come to appreciate the significance of this feast. But now, ever since the Holy See had decreed that the "Second Sunday of Easter would be known as Divine Mercy Sunday," many more are seeking to go more deeply into the words of Our Lord to St. Faustina that were meant for all humanity.

Pope John Paul II in his homily at the canonization of Sr. Faustina on April 30, 2000 said: "Jesus shows His hands and His side. He points, that is, to the wounds of the Passion, especially the wound in His Heart, the source from which flows the great wave of mercy poured out on humanity".

The image of Jesus, The Divine Mercy, is to have a special place of honor on the Feast of Mercy, a visual reminder of all that Jesus did for us through His Passion, Death, and Resurrection...and a reminder, too, of what He asks of us in return—to trust Him and be merciful to others.

The Eucharist is the "Fountain of Life". The Eucharist is Jesus, Himself, the Living God, longing to pour Himself as Mercy into our hearts.






