

# **Pastor's Letter**

The tomb is empty, is empty! Come and touch the stone and folded shroud. Christ lives indeed, indeed. Alleluia! Believers, shout aloud. Sing Alleluia! The Tomb is Empty Sylvia G. Dunstan

**Christ is Risen! Indeed, He is Risen!** I learned this greeting and response as a young child. It is the traditional Orthodox Easter greeting that is exchanged when you meet or enter the home of another believer. I first learned the greeting and response in the dialect of my grandparents. It struck me that we Catholics had no similar Easter greeting. Yes, we sing hymns filled with "Alleluias" in church; but, once we walk out the doors, our greetings make no mention of Christ or his resurrection.

There is nothing wrong with greeting others with "Happy Easter!" and celebrating the arrival of the Easter Bunny who visits our homes early on Easter morning. Yet our greetings make no mention of the one event that is the reason for our celebration. **Christ is Risen!** He conquered the power of sin and death through his death on the Cross. He opened the path to heaven and gave us his own Body and Blood to keep us close and to strengthen us for the journey. The Easter egg reminds us of the tomb that brought forth life even though seemingly empty to the first witnesses encountered on Easter morning. Baskets filled with an abundance of treats are reminders of God's abundant blessings. For my Orthodox ancestors, the foods in the Easter basket are foods that had been given up gradually during the weeks of Lent, providing very sparse meals during Holy Week. Easter dinner is a return to bounty and grace.

Saturday night at the Easter Vigil, we welcomed Amber McAuley, Sam Ellian, Derek Lacosse, and Dominic O'Brien into the Church through Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. We received Jeremy Knickrehm, Jessica Chia, and Steve Friedle into the Catholic Church through Confirmation and Eucharist and completed the full initiation of Dan Kuzniar, Joe Zarlenga, and Owen Famulari through those same two Sacraments. These women and men are witnesses of the activity of the Spirit among us and the willingness of parishioners to invite them to enter more deeply into our journey with Jesus. Welcome, sisters and brothers now fully joined with us in Christ. May you continue to be a blessing for us.

However you spend this Easter day, I pray that it includes time to be joyful and time to give thanks. I thank <u>you</u> all who regularly bring life to our place of worship and life to our mission in Christ. Blessings to you who are new to us or who are with us only occasionally. To any who feel "on the fringe" this day for whatever reason, **your presence is a gift** to us. You make us richer and more complete by choosing to be with us; you belong here! I pray that you will always feel at home *in this space and among us*. This is central to the mission Christ has given us. Finally, welcome to you who are visiting with family or friends this Easter Sunday. It is good for us to be together. Christ is Risen! Indeed, He is Risen! Alleluia!






### Rectory Closed

(REFLECTION ON DIVINE MERCY, DIVINE MERCY CHAPLET PRAYER, SILENT ADORATION, AND BENEDICTION).

The Feast of Mercy or Divine Mercy Sunday has been celebrated in many countries, dioceses and parishes for many years. Pope John Paul II, the Cardinals, Bishops and Priests who have read the diary of St. Faustina have come to appreciate the significance of this feast. But now, ever since the Holy See had decreed that the "Second Sunday of Easter would be known as Divine Mercy Sunday," many more are seeking to go more deeply into the words of Our Lord to St. Faustina that were meant for all humanity.

Pope John Paul II in his homily at the canonization of Sr. Faustina on April 30, 2000 said: "Jesus shows His hands and His side. He points, that is, to the wounds of the Passion, especially the wound in His Heart, the source from which flows the great wave of mercy poured out on humanity".

The image of Jesus, The Divine Mercy, is to have a special place of honor on the Feast of Mercy, a visual reminder of all that Jesus did for us through His Passion, Death, and Resurrection...and a reminder, too, of what He asks of us in return—to trust Him and be merciful to others.

The Eucharist is the "Fountain of Life". The Eucharist is Jesus, Himself, the Living God, longing to pour Himself as Mercy into our hearts.
