# Pastor's Notes

Upon you the Lord shines. Nations shall walk by your light. Isaiah 60:2,3

Sunday evening is the twelfth night of Christmas, when we celebrate the light of Christ, revealed to the world beyond the people of Israel through the arrival of magi guided by a brilliant star. This Epiphany fulfills a prophecy spoken long before by Isaiah and other prophets. God's desire was not to be a light only for the chosen people of Israel. God's light in them was meant to one day shine out to draw all people from every part of the earth. Yet the star leads the magi beyond the lofty city of Jerusalem to its small "suburb" of Bethlehem. This was the town of the young shepherd David who would become Israel's great king. It is in a humble dwelling of Bethlehem, not in the Temple or lofty palaces of Jerusalem, from which God's light shines out to all people.

Until the end of the last century, most Orthodox Christians waited until the Epiphany to celebrate the arrival of the Christ Child. The twelve days of Christmas were a time of family visits and gatherings. Epiphany was the day for exchanging gifts and great feasts (a great tradition for this child of Catholic and Orthodox grandparents who got two Christmas celebrations each year). Many cultures hold this day as special, including Puerto Rican Christians, for whom Tres Reyes remains a day of exchanging presents and special celebrations. The traditions of Epiphany remind us that the Messiah had been viewed by most as the Savior of Israel, who eventually would bring all peoples to worship in Jerusalem. We believe that from his birth, Christ became a light for all peoples, drawing them to a humble home in the shadow of Jerusalem. Christ is revealed to those, especially the poor in spirit, who seek him in unexpected places.

January 5 begins National Migration Week, which calls us to a deeper awareness of the struggles, hopes, and needs of immigrants and refugees throughout the world. While working together for the political solution that best serves the common good, we are challenged to keep our hearts and minds open to the human dignity of those of any age who seek safety and opportunity for their family. I believe that God's light always shines in the brightest joys and the darkest shadows. This message dwells at the heart of Christmas and underlies our journey of faith. We are called to bring Christ's light to those who dwell in the shadows caused by death, illness, loss, or confusion. We are sent to comfort those who feel separated from God or the Church for any reason, and to invite them to rediscover the warmth of God's love. Our mission is to welcome all who come to our doors and to encourage those who have been away to come home. This is our belief, our mission, and God's promise in each moment and in every circumstance.

As I announced just before Christmas, Fr. Karol Tybor, who was to become our associate pastor on January 1st, has decided to return to Poland to care for his aging parents. I am sad that he will not be with us; I affirm his decision to follow where the Lord is leading him. Together we will discover where the Lord is leading us.

As we put away the lights of Christmas decorations, may we carry in our hearts the light of Christ that ever shines.

# The best opportunity of the year to support Catholic schools

To increase the funds available for tax credit scholarships\*, several donors partnered to create a **matching gift pool**. Every dollar donated to this program through the scholarship granting organization Empower Illinois between Dec. 1, 2019 and Feb. 29, 2020 and designated to a school operated by the Archdiocese of Chicago will be matched with two dollars from this pool (limitations apply). The program will end when all matching funds have been depleted or on Feb. 29, 2020, whichever comes first.

Example: A taxpayer donates \$2,000 to Empower Illinois through the match program. The taxpayer will be eligible to claim a \$1,500 tax credit when he/she files their previous year's taxes. The donation creates \$6,000 in scholarship support (after the \$4,000 match). For the net cost of \$500 (\$2,000 donation less \$1,500 tax credit), this donor will provide a student with a \$6,000 scholarship to attend a Catholic school of his/her choice.

<sup>\*</sup>The Illinois tax credit scholarship program provides a 75 percent state income tax credit to individuals who contribute money to fund scholarships for students from low-income families to attend private schools. Eligible students may use these scholarships to attend a non-public school of their choice, including the more than 200 Archdiocese of Chicago Catholic schools in Cook and Lake counties.


