Pastor's Notes

If you remove from your midst false accusation and malicious speech; if you bestow your bread on the hungry and satisfy the afflicted; then light shall rise for you in the darkness, and gloom shall become for you like midday. Isaiah 58:9-10

What is the type of fast the Lord desires? In responding to this question, the prophet Isaiah intimately unites religious practice and social justice. There is nothing wrong with pious practices that draw us deeper into relationship with Jesus, the Creator, or the Spirit. But such practices shed no light in our world unless that deeper relationship leads us to active care and concern for our sisters and brothers in need. This might be comfort at a moment of grieving; encouragement in a moment of despair; or presence in a period of loneliness. This could be the need for a sense of dignity, worth, or awareness of being God's beloved child. Or this may be a need for the basics of food, shelter, and protection from harm. Any might be the people in darkness to whom we are called to bring light.

Yet proclaiming the challenge of Isaiah, which is echoed today in Christ's call for us to be salt and light for others, often leads to opposition and resistance when gospel demands are perceived as political stances. Each of the two major political parties in our nation have used scripture to support a specific position, program, or outlook on society. This can lead to the cynicism of nonbelievers and dissension among or within groups of Christians. Neither the prophets nor Jesus intended their message to support specific solutions to societal problems and basic human needs. One can be

faithful to the gospel of Jesus Christ and come to different conclusions as to the most effective approach to practical realities.

Jesus proclaims that we are the salt of the earth and the light of the world, and that our light must shine before others. We are called to an inner attitude that places God at the center of our lives and that views each human person, from conception to natural death, as beloved child of God with an equal right to dignity and respect. This attitude does not lead us to agree instantly on solutions to realities that bring darkness to our world by disregarding or discarding any human life. We are called to be the Body in Christ, a people of diverse gifts and perspectives, who invite Christ to bring us into communion that shines out to others in our respect for one another in our God-given diversity.

With the first primaries and caucuses, the 2020 election season has officially begun. What will we, as a people of faith, bring to the conversations and debates that are sure to occur within our families, our neighborhoods, and our places of work and leisure? How will our communion in Christ bring salt to issues that cannot be ignored or disregarded and light to that which may be covered over or hidden in darkness? How will our disagreements with one another reflect kindness, respect, and an openness to learn from one another how God is calling us to act for the common good?

Will we choose to be light?

2020 Annual Catholic Appeal Come, follow me...and heal our world."

Please spend some time this week reflecting on the beneficiaries of the Annual Catholic Appeal (on the opposite page). The Annual Catholic Appeal is much different than a one-time special collection. It is a pledged campaign commitment in which you can make a gift payable in installments.

Each pledge makes a difference because all parishes participate in the campaign and the gifts of many enable our archdiocese to deliver needed ministries and services to answer Jesus' call to "Come, follow me...and heal the world."

This year's goal for SFX is \$128,969. This amount is a 1% increase over last year's goal, based on our annual parish income. The Archdiocese has reduced the percentage for parishes with average household income less than \$40,000, and increased others to offset this. Approximately 90% of any amount contributed above our goal, will come back to the parish as a rebate. For the 2019 Appeal, we received about \$14,000 which has been set aside for roofing and tuck pointing projects.

If you received your pledge form in the mail, please complete it and mail it back or bring it to Mass next weekend. We will conduct the annual in-pew pledge process for all parishioners at all Masses next weekend.


SpeakOut Illinois Conference






