Pastor's Notes

"Beloved, we are God's children now; what we shall be has not yet been revealed." 1 John 3:2

John invites us into an awareness of who we are *in the present moment*. We *are* God's beloved children *now*; not because of any effort or merit of our own, but because of the love that God has bestowed on us freely and graciously. When we allow this love into our hearts, we enter a journey, the destination of which has not yet been revealed, but that will shape us as a pure reflection of God's love and light.

The invitation to journey in faith was heard in some way by each of the three adults who were baptized and the five adults of our community who entered full communion with the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil. I am inspired when I hear their faith stories and the diverse ways God has spoken to them and invited them into the journey of faith. Their stories invite us each to recall key moments in our own lives that have inspired, challenged, and encouraged us on our journey of God's beloved children who are becoming the fullness of who God calls us to be. Our response to God's call is our vocation, whether as spouse, parent, teacher, caretaker, priest, lawyer, deacon, student, religious, organizer, peacemaker, or leader. And whatever form our vocation takes in this present moment is part of our journey to the fullness of who we will be.

This Saturday we celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation of 170 high school teens. We encourage their willingness to move deeper into the journey of faith with us. We commit ourselves as a faith community to provide an environment in which their faith and selfunderstanding will continue to grow and to be guided by the Gospel. The research of Catholic sociologists reveals that the extent to which we engage youth in their high school years is the greatest determinant of their active involvement in the church as adults. Our Quest program, guided by our Coordinator of Youth Ministries, Olivia Hollman, and a large team of adult volunteers, is both a core tenet of our parish Prophetic Plan and our commitment to the present and future of our youth. May they continue to find among us a community that encourages, challenges, nurtures, and listens to them as they walk the journey of faith with us.

Thank you for your patience, participation, and cooperation on this bi-annual weekend on which a tent occupies one of our two parking lots. A special thanks to Ogden Avenue School for use of their lot, and to our neighbors for their sacrifices. Our campus returns to "normal" on Monday afternoon. This weekend also brings the annual celebration of Earth Day. May we all renew our commitment to care for the earth as stewards of God's creation.

Scripture Reflection

The two great symbols of Christ are given to us in today's Gospel from John. The first symbol is the "Good Shepherd."

About 20 years ago, I visited some of the catacombs that surround Rome. As I entered there in front of me was a stone statue of a young man carrying a young lamb. That shepherd, I discovered, was imaged in many places throughout the various rooms that I went through. A guide mentioned that this image of the shepherd was the first great sign of Christ and the Christian in the early Church. They loved that image of Jesus caring for the weakest among us. Seeing the shepherd reminded them of the words from today's Gospel: "I am the Good Shepherd. A good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep." "...I know mine and mine know me."

The second great symbol is the Cross, especially Christ on the cross.

When I was at the parish of Infant Jesus of Prague, we were remodeling the inside of the church. A question came up, "should we have a cross with Jesus dying or Jesus in resurrection." Both had been popular at the time. We decided to have one made that had elements of both. The artist who created the crucifix had Jesus making two movements, depending on what perspective you were looking at. Seen in one way, Christ was placing himself on the cross. Seen from another way, Christ was being lifted from the cross. In other words, the entire Paschal Mystery was revealed in this one sculpture. Today's Gospel speaks of this symbol too. "This is why the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again." The cross has become for Christians everywhere a sign of Christs love for us, His suffering and death and His resurrection.

Today, both symbols are given to us to express Christ's love for us and His invitation for us all to die to selfishness and sin and rise to a life with the Father that will never end.



ST FRANCIS XAVIER FOOD PANTRY mission is twofold: (1) provide supplemental nutritious food assistance to those in need in a safe, respectful and prayerful environment, and (2) partner with our community to support the pantry through food drives and volunteer opportunities. We serve an average of 90 families (or approximately 275 individuals) each week. Each family receives non-perishable and perishable food as well as toilet paper. We also provide "specials" when available, including: coffee, tea, snacks, condiments, baking goods, personal hygiene products, baby items, laundry and dish detergent and paper towels. Our homeless clients receive a bag specially packed to meet their needs (ready- to-eat, pop-top cans, paper plates, bowls, utensils, cold drinks, etc.). Leftover perishables are donated to the Constance Morris House, a home for abused women and children. We also share food with BEDS Plus, an overnight shelter organization. We have about 25 weekly volunteers who assist with food pick-ups and preparing and packing the food bags. We are so grateful for the ongoing support of our generous community!

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS LAGRANGE COUNCIL 6483 partners with local community groups to distribute flyers and collect food in the community and deliver it to local food pantries. Projects helps local teens get community service hours and helps the food pantry to provide nutritional assistance to local residents of the community. Aligning the needs of the local council, local community groups, the local food pantry and local residents benefits all of us when we work together. Experiencing the cooperation and generosity of the community and volunteers renews my faith in God and my neighbors, and our ability to make the world a better place.


