Pastor's Notes

"Should you refuse mercy to others like yourself, yet seek pardon for your own sins?" Sirach 28:4

Simon Peter is having a moment in which he thinks that he understands what Jesus is teaching about forgiveness. In the tradition in which Pater was raised, to forgive someone who has wronged you three times would have been considered an extreme act of mercy. So, Peter doubles that number and adds one, proud of himself that he has come to understand this new law of love. Jesus challenges Peter to go as far as seventy times seven. In the time of Jesus, this was not to say 490 times, but rather to say always and forever.

Jesus then tells a parable of a man granted forgiveness for a large debt who refuses to extend the same forgiveness to one who owes him a much smaller amount. He makes it clear that our own hearts are open to receiving God's forgiveness only to the extent that we extend that forgiveness to others. Each time we pray the Our Father, we ask God "to forgive us as we forgive others." This is not about God's mercy, which is limitless and given freely. Rather it is about the capacity and openness of our hearts to receive God's mercy.

How do our hearts need to be stretched as we enter a new parish year together? Perhaps we are being challenged to

make peace with a friend or family member. Even if the other person is unwilling or unprepared to reconcile, God will give us the grace to let go of whatever we hold against the other person in our hearts – but only if we are willing to receive it. Perhaps we are part of a group within the parish called to let go of past conflicts and tensions with another parish group or individual; when we allow another person, or group, a new chance, miraculous things can happen. Perhaps there is someone who fears that she or he will not be welcome here because of something that they have heard in our voice or seen in our face: God will continue to breathe into us a welcoming spirit when we are willing to see what limits us. Perhaps there is a person or group in the public or political sphere who occupies our minds or hearts with judgments or biases that keep us from seeing or hearing clearly.

I know that I stand with Peter, overwhelmed with what Jesus asks of us. I also have experienced the incredible things God can do in my heart when I am willing to be stretched. May this be a year of heart-stretching for us all.

Scripture Reflection

Today's Gospel is about forgiveness, but have we ever had someone that hurt us badly that we just can't forgive? We all experience this from time to time in our life; we are unable to forgive someone who has hurt us badly; we experience an emotional block. This raises an agonizing question. How do we handle such a problem? What do we do when we can't forgive someone? How do we get rid of the emotional block that chokes off our best efforts to forgive? How do we carry out Jesus' instruction to forgive in today's gospel reading? How will we heed the warning in today's first reading, which says that if we refuse mercy to our brothers and sisters, what can we expect from God?

It is not on our own forgiveness that healing in our world hinges, but His. When Jesus commands us to love our enemies, He gives, along with the command, the grace we will need to forgive. And so, the first way to handle the problem of not being able to forgive someone is to ask Jesus for the grace to forgive.

The second way to handle the problem is hinted at in today's gospel reading. It is to do what the official failed to do. It is to sit ourselves down in God's presence and recall how much and how often God has forgiven us. He has forgiven us infinitely more than he is asking us to forgive others.

The very least we can do in return is to reach out a hand of forgiveness to our brothers and sisters.

For those who may not have seen our new financial page in last weekend's bulletin, I am running the below again with updated numbers...

Another fiscal year (July 1, 2017 - June 30, 2018) has begun! The bulletin announcement has been revamped to demonstrate how the parish is performing toward meeting our budget this year. The bar graph compares:

Pink: the amount of collections received at this point <u>last year</u> Green: the amount of collections received to date <u>this year</u> Orange: Our <u>total</u> budgeted collections, set to enable SFX to break even with expenses Blue: Our target for year-to-date collections

For example, this week, you would read the above bar graph as follows: Our parishioners donated \$303,578 at this point last year. This year to date, our parishioners have donated \$286,376 toward our budget of \$1,900,000 (which includes Christmas and Easter offerings). Our year-to-date target of \$350,308 is a simple average: our total budgeted Sunday offertory divided by 52 (simulating equal contributions throughout the 52 weeks of the year).

Our total budget of \$1,900,000 assumes a Sunday offertory increase of 4%. We are asking every parish household to prayerfully consider increasing their regular offering by at least 4%, and to consider electronic giving via direct withdrawal or credit card to provide us with a steady income throughout the year. The Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) withdrawal form can be found on the opposite page of this bulletin; credit card set-up can be completed online at our website at www.sfxlg.org.

Our children are back in the Day School or getting ready to begin Religious Education. Our Music Ministries are recruiting. The Ministry Fair for over 50 programs is coming up. All of these rely on the time, talent and treasure of the parish community. The generosity of our parishioners is truly a blessing for us all, as we share in the blessings that have come to fruition in the past year.

The financial results from the fiscal year ending June 30, 2017 are coming soon!

RCIA is a process of questioning and

conversation for non-Catholics who wish to know more about the Church, and for Catholics who have not received the sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation.

New this year: St. Cletus, St. John of the Cross and St. Francis Xavier have combined efforts, to present the best of our three programs to participants. Leaders from all three churches will walk with you throughout the process. If you have been thinking about becoming Catholic or completing your sacraments, please consider joining us.

How it works: We will meet on Tuesday evenings, from 7:00-8:30 pm, and on some Sundays at various times from September 19-April 24. There are 4 stages in the Process:

4. Mystagogy– a time to reflect on your experience, and what it means to live out your new life as part of the Body of Christ. April 10-24; meets primarily at St. Francis Xavier.
