

Pastor's Notes

"Whatever you did for one of these least ones, you did for me." Matthew 25:40

This year, our liturgical year overlaps with an intense season of planning, preparing, and gathering which can overwhelm and overtake so many lives. Each year I ask myself, "How can I do things more simply this year?" "What can I do or not do so that my heart and mind will be ready to celebrate the season of Christmas, rather than greet the day with tired relief that it is 'finally over'?" "Are there ways for me to be more focused on bringing light into the darkness in the lives of those near and far who struggle with illness, poverty, or fear?"

We enter Advent each year with the celebration of the feast day of our patron, Saint Francis Xavier. We hear his challenge to "Go set the world on fire!" Children in our parish elementary school will give their time and energy to a day of service this Friday. Children in our religious education program are gathering toys and food for families in need. Our youth distribute tags next weekend, and then sort and organize gifts that will go to families on the west side of Chicago. And many among us are engaged in special activities through the parish, community, or world organizations that serve those in need. Such activities are not "extra work." They are the very heart of preparing for Christmas as they direct our hearts to the presence of Christ in the last and the least among us.

This Monday evening is the annual distribution of tickets for the 3:00 and 5:00 PM Christmas Eve Masses for Families with Young Children in the parish church, and for the parish 3:00 PM Mass at the Motherhouse Chapel of the Congregation of St. Joseph. In recent years, we have been able to accommodate all who come to the 5:00 PM Mass <u>at the Motherhouse</u>; therefore, people will not need a ticket for that Mass. I appreciate the fact that requiring tickets to attend Mass does not convey the hospitality that we try to express throughout the year. Would that we had enough space to accommodate all who wanted to gather at each of these three Masses. Your patience and understanding are blessings for us all.

As we experience the pull of a busy "holiday" season around us, may our gatherings each weekend keep our minds and hearts focused on the "holy days" of the Advent season – a time of proclaiming the light in the darkness as we prepare to embrace the wonder and mystery of God, who chose to become one like us and one with us.

Scripture Reflection

The world would be **better off**, if people tried to **become better**. And people would **become better** if they stopped trying to **be better off**. For when **everybody** tries to become better off **nobody** is better off. But when **everybody** tries to **become better**, everybody **is** better off." (Peter Maurin)

Neither the just nor the unjust in today's gospel have any idea as to when they fed, clothed, or sheltered Jesus or neglected him. Both the just and the unjust needed to ask, "When did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and welcome you or naked and clothe you? When did we see you ill or in prison, and visit you?" Jesus' answer to them, calls us to minister to others. "I say to you, whatever you did for one of the least of mine, you did for me." Jesus' answer calls us to **become better** so that the **world** would **be better off**.

Today, as we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King, we find Jesus identifying himself with the poor, the refugee, the marginalized, the outcast. Jesus also identifies himself with our own family, our friends, our co-workers. Jesus' call for us to minister to others extends to the relationships we experience every day. Jesus calls us to treat *all people* with compassion and love.

How can we be sure that we are living and being as Jesus calls us to live and be? There is no single right way. However, we can begin by examining the relationship we have with the people we see every day. In our common everyday relationships with family and friends, we may not experience people who are physically hungry, homeless, or naked. Instead, Jesus' gospel message to us today is to forgive our family members and friends when they make us angry, listen to them when they are lonely, and laugh with them when they are down.

Jesus is also very clear in his message to us that we also must minister to the least in society. Some of us choose to answer this call by working B.E.D.S. or contributing to or working the Food Pantry, while others write to our legislators on gun control, aid to the hungry and the homeless in society, and still others write Christmas cards to the imprisoned. These actions are those of charity and social justice. Charity that directly helps people makes us feel good, and rightly so. Social justice addresses the root cause of a problem and attempts to change that cause. Charity and social justice actions are in response to Jesus' call to us to minister with both feet - the foot of charity and the foot of justice. Our faith in Jesus commits us to minister to others through both charity and justice.

Are you willing to follow Jesus and walk with both feet so that the world would be better off?



Children's Liturgy of the Word

The Word of the Lord has a message for children as well as adults. Children's Liturgy of the Word offers the children an experience to hear the scripture in words that they can understand. Here at St. Francis we are fortunate and proud to have adult volunteers and Presiders of Liturgy who journey with our children so that they can experience the Word of the Lord with a message that is relevant and fitting for them.

Our Saturday evening 5:00 pm. Mass offers the opportunity for children in Grades Kindergarten— Fourth to experience hearing and reflecting on the Word of the Lord in a way that is an empowering experience. Children in these grades are invited to follow their Reflectors of the Word to a prayer space away from the gathered assembly to hear the Scriptures in words they can understand.

Children's Liturgy of the Word "kicked off" the school year on Saturday, October 14. Allen Sterwalt, our Director of Music, along with our Cherub Choir and SF Choristers (Children in Grades 1-8) led us in prayer with music. **Children's Liturgy of the Word takes place in church whenever the children's choirs lead us in song/prayer.** The Scriptures we hear will then be taken from the Children's Lectionary and the homily will be given in a way that children are able to relate to a little more readily. The children in Grades K thru 4 will go to their prayer space on the Saturdays that the choirs are not singing.

Christmas Eve Masses Schedule For Children in Church

This year, on Christmas Eve, we will once again celebrate 3:00 and 5:00 liturgies planned for children. Again, tickets will be issued to parishioners for these two masses. These tickets will be available in church on the Monday evening after Thanksgiving.

On Monday, November 27

- 1. Doors of church will open at **5:30 pm**.
- 2. Know the Mass for which you want tickets. As you enter church, obtain a number for that Mass.
- 3. You will be asked to sit in numerical order, beginning with the last row in church.
- 4. At **6:00** a drawing will decide the first number that will be called for picking up tickets. Following the number decided by the drawing, all numbers after this first number will be called in consecutive order.
- 5. Anyone coming in after the beginning number is picked will be given a different set of numbers, which will be called numerically AFTER the initial numbers have been exhausted.

There is no need for anyone to arrive earlier than 5:30 pm. A drawing will decide the number that begins the distribution of tickets. The drawing will take place at 6:00 pm.

Christmas Eve Masses at Motherhouse Chapel

Immediately after the distribution of tickets for 3:00 and 5:00 masses in church, taking place on November 27th, we will distribute the tickets for the Sisters of St. Joseph Chapel. This year you will only need tickets for the 3:00 mass at the Motherhouse.

Please arrive at church at 6:30 pm and we will follow the exact same procedure as above.

No need to arrive earlier than 6:30 pm, as distribution will begin at 6:45 pm.



The Christmas Wafer

The Christmas Wafer (also known as "Oplatki") is available in the Rectory during office hours Monday through Friday 9:00 am until 8:30 pm, Saturday from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm and on Sunday between 9:00 am to 2:00 pm.



The word "Bethlehem" means "the house of bread." The breaking of the bread is a sign of charity, unity and friendship. Religious family customs bring the truths of faith into the home. One of these beautiful Christmas Eve customs is the Christmas Wafer. The thin wafer bearing the Christmas characters is broken by the head of the family and distributed to each member. With a simple prayer for God's grace and the welfare of all members of the family, those present as well as those who are absent, the head of the house breaks the wafer and distributes it, one piece to each person at the table. While doing so, each member of the family is kissed and wished a joyful feast. Members then greet one another in the same way.

The spiritual lesson in this age-old custom is that the unity of the family is grounded in God's love for us. May you experience unity and love through this simple celebration.
