

Pastor's Notes

"My house shall be called a house for all peoples."
Isaiah 56:7

My custom is to begin the pastor's column with an excerpt from the weekend scriptures and go from there. Isaiah sets a great tone for my first column as pastor of St. Francis Xavier Parish. The dream of Isaiah was a challenge to many up to and beyond the time of Jesus. These women and men thought that the people of Israel had priority passage into the house of God, and that others were to be admitted only after all the people of Israel were safely inside. "Sure, God will let the others in some day; but certainly not now." Jesus constantly challenged religious authorities and others of this belief that God welcomed all to the banquet and, like Jesus, was eager to dine with them.

So, what is happening in today's gospel? How can Jesus say to a woman pleading for her tormented daughter, "It is not right to take the food of the children and throw it to the dogs"? Some scholars suggest that Jesus is openly struggling with a cultural bias that he had heard spoken since his childhood. I tend to agree with those who suggest that Jesus is forcing his disciples and others to hear the cruelty within words that any of those around him might have spoken without thought or compassion for the humanity of those they had come to think of as unworthy of care.

One week ago, we as a nation faced the remnants of racism that was woven into the fabric of America from the beginning and that remains part of our ongoing struggle to seek understanding and compassion for the persons whose experience we can only come to know through their eyes. Whether as citizens of a nation or community or members of a faith community, who is the woman pleading for her daughter whom we might be quick to dismiss as undeserving of our welcome or compassion?

Since first serving among you almost 30 years ago, I have known this to be a community of welcome and compassion. How is Jesus challenging us to stretch even further in our outreach to those not yet among us, or not yet among us on a regular basis? Who is it most difficult for me to welcome into this house for all peoples as my sister or brother?

We are about to enter a new parish year with the beginning of our formation programs for children, youth, and adults; our planning and leadership councils; and our many social gatherings. How will we allow God to stretch us just a bit further this year in hospitality and compassion? How will we grow in our mission to pray, to learn, and to serve? I look forward to what the Spirit has in store for us!

Scripture Reflection

The Canaanite woman's cry to Jesus was that he "have pity on me" (not on her daughter, although that is surely implied in the request). Her love for her daughter and her great desire that she be healed could not be separated from herself—she and her daughter were one in the need for healing and life. Her daughter was welcomed into her heart in love, and this was the source of her great faith and persistence. This gives us an insight into our inclusivity and ministry: we must be so "at one" with others that their plight is our own plight. Ministry is more than doing for another; it implies an empathy with another that discloses the unity we share as members of the Body of Christ. One dimension of living the Gospel is that we work to increase our unity with one another, which in turn draws us to reach out to others in mercy and compassion, welcome and inclusivity.



Dear Father,

This spring I brought to the attention of the Presbyteral Council the request for a onetime special collection to complete the work on the National Shrine of the Basilica of the Immaculate Conception. Located in Washington, DC, the National Shrine has been a century in the making since the laying of its foundation stone in 1920. Mary's Shrine, as it is often called, is the largest Roman Catholic Church in North America and is one of the ten largest churches in the world. The Council agreed that this was a project worthy of our support.

You will soon be receiving materials to support this special second collection for the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, which will take place the weekend of August 27, 2017. The specific purpose of this collection is to complete the Trinity Dome, the central and largest dome of the Basilica. This "Crowning Jewel" will be adorned in mosaic and will depict the Most Holy Trinity, the Blessed Virgin Mary as the Immaculate Conception, and a procession of saints who have an association with America and the Basilica. The Nicene Creed will encircle the base of the dome, while the dome's pendentives will feature the four evangelists: Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. The Trinity Dome will complete the work of the Greater Upper Church according to its original iconographic scheme and bring to a close construction of the Basilica. Given that this is an initiative of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), we need to join in solidarity with the other dioceses in this country and do our part. No doubt many of you and your parishioners have visited the Shrine over the years and know of its importance for our country. As you know the Blessed Mother, as the Immaculate Conception is our national patron whom we celebrate on December 8 each year.


