Children's Liturgy of the Word Catechists work with the children at the Saturday 5:00 p.m. mass to present and interpret the Gospel in a special way. Catechists escort children (through Grade 1) to Unity Hall, and follow a format of prayer, readings, and discussion until after the petitions, when they return to church. There is always enthusiastic participation on the part of the children.

Volunteer Time Commitment - The time commitment is minimal. A Catechist is scheduled once every 4 or 5 weeks (October through April only). Usually ½ to 1 hour will be needed to study the provided readings and background information, and to develop a plan for the reflection with the children.

#### **Liturgy Planning**

Four teams of 4-6 parishioners do seasonal and weekly liturgy planning. Our focus is on practical, real-life applications of scripture. Teams meet to reflect on the scriptures for assigned Sundays. Based on that reflection, notes are written for homilists' consideration, prayers are selected/written, general intercessions are written, and an ordo form is submitted. Representatives of each team and the parish staff do seasonal planning for Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter. We gather to reflect, pray and share our thoughts. *Volunteer Time Commitment – An annual planning schedule is prepared. Teams meet for 90 minutes every six weeks, at a time and place of their choosing, in addition to advance preparation and reflection, post-meeting writing, and organization of the ordo.*

Educated and formed Ministers of Care in our parish bring the gifts of Eucharist and companionship to those living in nursing homes, the permanently homebound, and parishioners who are patients in our local hospitals.
