Pastor's Letter

"My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"
Mark 15:34

These are the last words of Jesus in the Gospel of Mark. What we now read as the last twelve verses of the gospel are believed to have been added some time later. Scholars think that Mark had intended to emphasize the power of the resurrection to gradually transform the trembling, bewilderment, and fear of the first witnesses to the empty tomb into a vibrant community of believers who would become confident and bold witnesses to the Resurrected Christ. Perhaps the early Christians insisted that Mark amend his gospel and tell the rest of the story. After all, isn't it much harder to sit with the bewilderment of suffering, death, and an empty tomb for which there is no easy explanation?

Throughout the first half of Mark's gospel, Jesus heals the sick and drives out demons. In each instance, he asks the healed person not to tell anyone; of course, they cannot keep their good fortune to themselves. However, Mark uses this device not to present the "humility" of Jesus, as much as this is true. Rather, Mark presents Jesus insisting that his mission involves both healing and suffering, glory and passion. At the midpoint of Mark's gospel, Jesus is transfigured before a few of his disciples as he converses with Moses and Elijah. It is a vision of glory that will come only through his loving sacrifice.

Jesus leads his disciples down from the mountain; they wonder what he means when Jesus refers to "rising from the dead." From that point forward, Jesus sets his face toward Jerusalem. Several times he attempts to explain to his disciples that in Jerusalem he will be rejected, undergo much suffering, and die on a cross. Yet they are unable to accept what he is saying. Quite the opposite, they change the subject; they argue about who will have the best "place" when Jesus comes into his kingdom. It is easy to predict that they will abandon him in his hour of suffering.

The mission of Jesus was to reveal God's deep love for us: both through restoring people to wholeness and through becoming the sacrifice that would bring us life. His death on the Cross changed everything. But Mark shows us that, even as we were being restored to life through his death, the crowd mocked and jeered; and all but a few of his followers had fled in fear. The death of Jesus brings to fulfillment what God was willing to do to save us; yet the mission of proclaiming what Jesus had done for us would be handed on to those who would come to believe: to this day and until the end of time as we know it.

So, **what is our witness to others as we move through this Holy Week?** Do we proclaim Christ crucified and God's victory over sin and death as our reason to hope? Will we participate in the opportunities of this week to be present to what Jesus has done for us through his self-giving, both in the Eucharist and on the Cross? Will we proclaim to those in despair or who feel abandoned that **God is at their side**. Are we willing to accompany them on their journey with Christ through passion to new glory?

Many parishioners offer their time and talent through the music, environment, proclamation, and coordination of the services in which we journey with Jesus on the three holiest days of the Church year. **Join us** to the extent you are able. **Invite your family, friends, and neighbors** to join us for the celebrations of Easter Sunday. Be ready and willing **to make room and to welcome** the visitors, travelers, and newcomers who occupy your "regular" seats. Help them to feel welcome among us.



What better to feature this month than the sacred Triduum? This year, the Triduum starts on Thursday evening (March 28) and lasts three days. Despite my decades of Catholicism, I had no idea what went into a parish preparing for these three most holy of days until I started working at St. Francis Xavier almost 10 years ago.

On Holy Thursday, *every parish staff member* has responsibilities as we prepare and celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper. Lent officially ends that afternoon, and we enter into a "direct expression of our service to one another and the world" and a liturgy of "the Eucharistic banquet itself." My duties include preparing the six hand-washing stations with bowls of water and hand towels. Members of staff tend these stations in an act of service which we will never forget – to pour water over your hands as we say, "As Jesus has done for us, so we will do for others." Amen!

On Good Friday, the Facilities team and our pastoral staff work with our Arts and Environment group, sacristans, musicians, liturgy team members, and lighting coordinators to prepare the church for this most solemn day of the year. A 6-foot high cross is brought into church for the veneration. We begin the Service of the Lord's Passion in silence, and "the passion narratives are proclaimed in full so that all see vividly the love of Christ for each person.... It is the glorious, the life-giving cross that the faithful venerate with song, prayer, and kneeling." Our deacons lead us through the passion narrative. Over the service's approximately 90 minutes, the depth of God's love surrounds all in the church and we worship in awe of Jesus' sacrifice for our salvation.

On the morning of Holy Saturday, we "make ready for this night's great Vigil." To name just a few preparations: beautifying the church, Unity Hall, and gymnasium; practicing with those who will be fully initiated as Catholics; setting up the lighting; and staffing enough ushers and Eucharistic Ministers to receive 3,000 people. In the midst of the Vigil Service, Easter arrives: our souls absorb the hymn *Jesus Christ is Risen Today*. We celebrate the joyful Eucharist and give thanks for Jesus' Resurrection. **How did I not realize the breadth of coordination required, and the depth of the grace received, in preparing for and partaking in each day of the Triduum?**

Your offertory and Easter donations are an important part of bringing the Triduum to life here at St. Francis Xavier Parish! God bless you for your stewardship!



The Feast of Mercy or Divine Mercy Sunday has been celebrated in many countries, dioceses and parishes for many years. Pope John Paul II, the Cardinals, Bishops and Priests who have read the diary of St. Faustina have come to appreciate the significance of this feast. But now, ever since the Holy See had decreed that the "Second Sunday of Easter would be known as Divine Mercy Sunday," many more are seeking to go more deeply into the words of Our Lord to St. Faustina that were meant for all humanity.

Pope John Paul II in his homily at the canonization of Sr. Faustina on April 30, 2000 said: "Jesus shows His hands and His side. He points, that is, to the wounds of the Passion, especially the wound in His Heart, the source from which flows the great wave of mercy poured out on humanity".

The image of Jesus, The Divine Mercy, is to have a special place of honor on the Feast of Mercy, a visual reminder of all that Jesus did for us through His Passion, Death, and Resurrection...and a reminder, too, of what He asks of us in return—to trust Him and be merciful to others.

The Eucharist is the "Fountain of Life". The Eucharist is Jesus, Himself, the Living God, longing to pour Himself as Mercy into our hearts.
