

Pastor's Letter

Jesus said, "I chose you and appointed you to **go and bear fruit** that will remain."

John 15:16

"I chose you." Jesus makes it clear to the first disciples, and now to us, that <u>he</u> initiates our relationship with him. God <u>always</u> reaches out first; we then choose to accept or reject God's invitation. When we look closely at those he chooses, we might question his judgment; after all, one would deny him, and another betray him. It appears that Jesus was not aiming for the "perfect dozen." Some were educated; but most were laborers and possibly illiterate. Jesus looks into their hearts and sees their *potential*. In the same way, *Jesus has examined our hearts and called us*, <u>as we are</u>, to follow him. He waits for our response.

"I appointed you." Jesus not only called the first disciples to follow; he also <u>sent</u> them to carry the message of God's love and to bring healing and hope to all they encountered. He gave them a <u>mission</u> to share what they had found in him and to invite <u>all</u> into communion with Jesus – man <u>and</u> woman, Gentile <u>and</u> Jew, servant <u>and</u> free. The Risen Lord appoints us in the same way. In the Spirit, <u>we</u> are sent as <u>missionary disciples</u>, to bring the person and message of Jesus to others and then to welcome them into the community of believers. We are appointed to reach beyond barriers that would divide us; and embrace all as equally deserving of God's love.

"Go and bear fruit that will remain." Jesus challenged his first disciples to do much more than "increase their numbers." Their mission was not about gathering the most converts or impressing those to whom they would preach. They were to bear fruit that would remain – to reach those who would then produce the seeds of further fruit. Their mission was to invite others into a commitment that could cost them their reputations, if not their lives. The rapid growth of the early church, even in the face of punishment and martyrdom, suggests that their message pierced hearts and minds. Jesus asks the same of us today. We have been chosen to "go make a difference" in the lives of those most in need of God's love and care. We have been appointed to be the hands and heart of Jesus to family, friends, neighbors, and strangers alike.

This weekend we celebrate the fruits of a gift made twenty-five years ago. A collection of founding parishioners, guided by their pastor, Fr. Bill Stenzel, established an endowment that they hoped would grow to become an ongoing resource for the parish elementary school. Our former principal, Ms. Barbara Snopek, established a scholarship within the endowment fund. Fr. John Hoffman, our next pastor, encouraged ongoing contributions to the endowment. Earnings from the initial investments plus additional contributions have grown the St. Francis Xavier Educational Endowment to over \$1 million. Having achieved this milestone, a percentage of the endowment's annual earnings can now be used to enhance our programs and resources and to affirm the school staff in their mission. We thank you who planted the seeds and all since who have watered and helped this initial gift to grow and bear fruit as intended.

Last Sunday, our **School of Religious Education** celebrated the end of another year of faith formation for over 600 of our children. **Thank you** to our DRE, Elis Guidice, her assistant, Cindy Johnson, and <u>all</u> the women, men, and youth who served as volunteer catechists. This weekend, we celebrate **First Eucharist** for over 130 children in our parish elementary school and parish school of religious education. Please welcome them to the Eucharistic Table this weekend and make them feel at home among us. Sunday evening at 5:00 PM Mass, we celebrate our **graduating high school seniors**. We give thanks for the blessing you are and send you out to set the world on fire in whatever path you have chosen to follow in the fall.

Please note: As has been our tradition, there will be <u>no 5:00 PM Mass next Sunday</u>, **Mother's Day**. Spend the day with the mothers in your life, whether physically or spiritually. It is good to give thanks.

Celebrating a Milestone

Devoting time in prayer to God, sharing of talents, and giving of treasure have all combined for over 125 years to make St. Francis Xavier Church and School the place we are today. A sign of our vitality is the ability to financially steward our Catholic community for future decades; an endowment is one component of financial strength. Endowments benefit those who will be in our SFX community for centuries to come; donors' gifts continue to provide meaningful influence both now and 100 years from now.

Our parish has two endowments - one for the parish elementary school, and one for the parish in general. The SFX Educational Endowment began in 1999, when a group of about 30 inaugural parish families donated the seed capital. The Parish Endowment began in 2007.

The Finance Council and our pastors have stewarded the two endowments over the years, beginning with these first gifts entrusted to the parish. This weekend, we celebrate the attainment of our first milestone for the Educational Endowment: **\$1 million!** The purpose of this endowment is "to perpetuate, partially support, and uphold the educational ministries of St. Francis Xavier School." For about the past 15 years, we have allocated distributions of under \$5,000 annually to tuition assistance. This year, having reached the \$1 million milestone, we are pleased to announce that the first major distribution of 4% (\$40,000) will provide much deserved bonuses for teachers and staff. Ministry of Care is Planning to Expand

A Minister of Care is a person who brings the gift of the eucharist and friendship to fellow parishioners and others who are homebound, living in nursing homes, or recovering in the hospital. Our visits help those in need stay connected to the parish and our faith community.

It's a very rewarding ministry and I promise you will receive more than you'll give. The time required varies depending on the activity you choose. Perhaps a few minutes or more on a homebound visit to an hour or so conducting a Prayer and Communion Service or bringing the eucharist to those in the hospital. Those visiting the homebound schedule visits convenient for the minister and the person being visited. Nursing homes and the hospital have fixed schedules.

The Archdiocese requires new ministers to receive 12 hours of instruction prior to being commissioned. After training, you will "shadow" other ministers to learn about your chosen activity. When you are comfortable, you'll receive a quarterly schedule.
