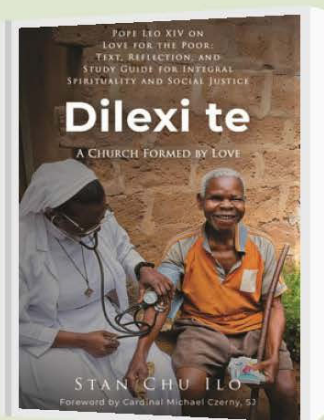

Music Notes...A New Look for Our Cantors!

At our 5:00 p.m.-Sat. (Vigil), 7:30 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. Masses, our cantors have begun wearing a liturgical musicians “alb”. In many Catholic churches today, liturgical musicians are returning to, or continuing, a renewal of traditional sacred vesture — albs, cassocks, choir robes, and other garments historically associated with reverence in worship. At the same time, some of these same church communities and musicians – including St. Francis Xavier - remain deeply committed to promoting progressive and relevant social concerns: racial justice, care for migrants, environmental stewardship, economic equity, disability inclusion, and the dignity of LGBTQ persons...to name a few.

To some of us, I realize this combination appears contradictory. Traditional liturgical clothing is often associated with theological conservatism, while progressive advocacy is frequently linked to more contemporary worship styles. Yet within Catholicism, these realities are not necessarily in conflict. In fact, I see the renewed use of traditional vesture, especially for the “cantor”, as entirely consistent with a broader commitment to human dignity and social transformation rooted in the Gospel.

The “alb” has long symbolized baptismal promise, renewal, and the shared dignity of all the faithful. Worn by clergy and lay music minister leaders serving at the altar, it represents not personal status but participation in sacred service and toward the communal act of worship. The cantor’s ministry during worship is to engage and inspire the praying assembly into the multiple sung parts of the Mass throughout. I believe that this specific vesture can encourage a more prayerful connection between cantor and assembly, as well as promote unity among our cantors. This can help all of us center more attention on prayer and sacrament rather than personal branding.

I would like to go a bit further and say that sacred vesture for our cantors may also aid in their own personal spiritual transcendence in liturgy. Personally, I have truly experienced a positive change in mind, body and Spirit since wearing an organist “cassock”...allowing me to focus on the prayer more fully. In an era shaped by constant performance culture and digital self-promotion, albs can serve as a visual reminder that when we walk into our most beautiful and inspiring church space, we are here to envelop ourselves into something bigger.

The St. Francis Xavier Church Music Ministry continues to sing the Gospel through themes of justice and solidarity into church life through music ministry inclusion, music selection, prayer leadership, and community engagement. Our “contemporary” song often includes themes of equality, unity, liberation, peacemaking, ecological responsibility, and care for the marginalized. Progressive social concerns are not looked at as political trends but as expressions of Catholic moral teaching.

As the Director of Music, I believe in softening the culture-war divide imposed from outside the Church...the idea that one must choose between incense and activism, chant and compassion, or reverence and reform. I am proud to say that our parish is a church community for everyone...no matter what your liturgy style preference is, or where you are in your faith journey...and that we will continue to pray and live our mission: **Belong, Believe, Be Love.**

God’s blessings to all of you. Let’s keep singing!

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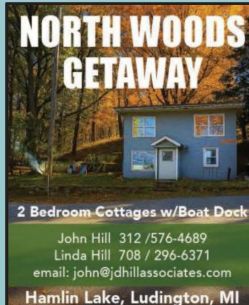

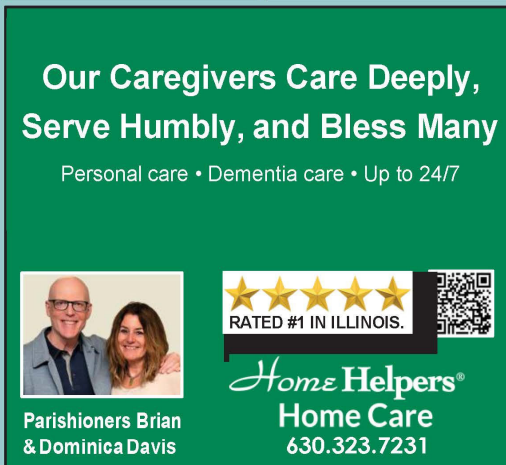
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
