


St. Agatha Needs School Supplies

Owen's Story of "Becoming Catholic"

God was not a large part of my life up until about 8 years ago. Regardless I was raised to do the right thing for the right reason. I was also told to work hard. However, I quickly found, I could never live up to the ideals I knew were right. Additionally I felt like I had a God shaped hole that I could never fill.

Catholic? And because I could never live up to these ideals I had become bitter and resentful at life. It seemed like I was always losing my temper. I was indignant and unhappy with life and afraid of everything. Where ever I was, or whatever I was doing, I usually felt lost and unsatisfied. Christianity was the last place I was willing to look for answers.

Around this time, my father gave me a book, I was sure I would never read. It was C.S. Lewis's Mere Christianity. As the years went on, I progressed further and further into the book. Truth had illuded me since I thought everyone was only looking out for their own interests, and any span of generosity was actually masked by selfishness and short lived. However, this book started to help. Eventually, it started to make more sense than it didn't. Not only that, it was beginning to cultivate in me something I had never had before. Not a conscience, or principles, but a relationship with the creator of the universe.

As I progressed, life felt brighter, more fulfilling, and right side up for a change. It wasn't perfect, but it worked, wasn't getting worse, or staying the same. I was finally able to handle life on life's terms. During this time, I also started going to church again.

As I started to engage with God more, I started to be lead deeper and deeper towards him. I landed finally at the Catholic Church. During O.C.I.A. formerly R.C.I.A. I met great friends, learned a lot, and solidified what I was coming to learn was the true, the good and the beautiful. Though I have a ways to go, this culminated in communion. Oxford dictionary defines communion as "the sharing or exchanging of intimate thoughts and feelings, especially when the exchange is on a mental or spiritual level". This is what I hope to share with others. The intimate relationship others can have with the one true God who is the pinnacle of vibrance, character, and unwavering love.


