

Pastor's Letter

"Be vigilant at all times and pray."

Luke 21:36

This year, Advent begins with **a call to vigilance**. This is not the vigilance of a sentry who warns of an approaching enemy. Rather, Advent vigilance is a *conscious decision to watch for the presence of God* in every waking moment of each and every day. We go out as a communion of hope rather than a people of fear. As we prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus as one like us, we attune our senses to the *present coming* of Jesus into our lives. Jesus first came two thousand years ago as a child in a manger; and he will come in glory at the end of time and space as we know it. We live amid the "in between" comings of Jesus into the events of today and into our individual and communal lives.

Advent invites us to *be awake and alert* to the presence of God in our *daily* thoughts and activities. We light the candles of a wreath to remember God's light shining into the deepening darkness of early winter. We hang lights and ornaments and greenery to proclaim the joy of God's presence *here and now*. We think of people who are special to us, and we write cards and choose presents to express our gratitude for the ways in which they make God present to us. We sing carols that tell of the wonder of God's love, of angels sweetly singing on high, of a night of heavenly peace, and of the call to come and behold the king of angels lying in a manger.

Advent invites us, in a special way, to set aside *time to be still* amid all the many activities of the season. We are called to have the *ears of the shepherds* who heard the song of angels in the night while others were sleeping. We are called to open to the *wonder of the magi* who set out on a long journey to discover the meaning of an awesome star in the heavens. We are invited into the presence of God who acts in unexpected ways. Our God chose to become a vulnerable infant who grew up to become our teacher, our healer, and our Savior. Next Saturday, we come together with believers in our two neighboring parishes for a communal celebration of God's loving mercy. **What unexpected ways does God desire to enter into our hearts and lives amid the stillness?**

Advent also brings **the feast of our patron, St. Francis Xavier**. Francis set out from his native Spain almost five hundred years ago to fulfill a mission that St. Ignatius himself could not fulfill as the founder of a new community of religious men. Francis sailed to Japan, India, and areas near China to proclaim the message of Jesus and to set the world on fire. He lived the life of a missionary disciple, and he calls us, under his patronage, to proclaim the good news through *our own words and deeds*.

The Friday before our patron's feast is **Service Day**, a special day for the students at St. Francis Xavier Elementary School. This Friday, our children will travel throughout the Chicago area and engage in service projects related to their grade's specific service focus. Some will prepare food packages to feed the hungry or care packages for veterans who are ill. Others will sing to the elderly, go bowling with the other abled, or spend time with children in communities with limited resources. The Service Day tradition has become core to the identity and mission of our parish school. Each year our children amaze me with the experiences they share at the end of the day.

Next Sunday, plan to arrive early and hungry for the Third Annual Yule Flip Pancake Breakfast in Joyce Hall. You will be served pancakes and sausage by members of our Knights of Columbus group and by students in our School of Religious Education. The gym will hold a variety of activities for children and the opportunity for a visit with Santa. I hope to see you there!


ADVENT COMMUNAL RECONCILIATION SERVICE

OPLATKI

The Christmas Wafer (also known as "Oplatki") is available at the Rectory.



The word "Bethlehem" means "the house of bread." The breaking of the bread is a sign of charity, unity and friendship. Religious family customs bring the truths of faith into the home. One of these beautiful Christmas Eve customs is the Christmas Wafer. The thin wafer bearing the Christmas characters is broken by the head of the family and distributed to each member. With a simple prayer for God's grace and the welfare of all members of the family, those present as well as those who are absent, the head of the house breaks the wafer and distributes it, one piece to each person at the table. While doing so, each member of the family is kissed and wished a joyful feast. Members then greet one another in the same way.

The spiritual lesson in this age-old custom is that the unity of the family is grounded in God's love for us. May you experience unity and love through this simple celebration.



Church Pipe Organ Opportunity

Dear Parishioners,

We are excited to share a unique opportunity to complete our beloved pipe organ at St. Francis Xavier. As many of you know, our pipe organ is a work in progress. Previous fundraising efforts funded most of the initial installation. Between 2003 and 2022, we received donations that allowed us to install all but one of the components in the original design for the organ. These components were not included in the initial installation due to the need to allocate capital funds to replace the boiler that heats the entire campus. We are sharing this history openly with our community to ensure transparency in our history and our future plans.

The final component to complete the organ is the Trompette Royale, a distinguished addition to the Great 8' register. This component will amplify our music ministry and provide an inspiring sound experience for our community. The total cost to finish the organ, including all preparations and installation, is \$122,000.

If we are able to raise at least \$100,000 in commitments from our parish family, we can sign a contract to install the Trompette Royale and complete our organ in its full glory. Note that we are asking only for a commitment at this stage; please do not send any funds until we confirm sufficient support to proceed.

Those interested in committing to this meaningful project should email us at organ@sfxlg.org. Once we determine that we have enough pledges, we will provide further information to finalize the funding and begin work. The installation process, led by Berghaus Pipe Organ Builders, includes new electro-pneumatic chests, winding, a reservoir, and a blower. The Trompette Royale will be housed in the original organ chamber, and enhancements, including advanced expression controls, will allow for a nuanced, beautiful sound quality across all registers.

Thank you for considering this important request. With your support, we can enrich our worship experience for generations to come.

Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)

For our seniors over the age of 70½

A Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) allows individuals age 70½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to make a direct, tax-free transfer of funds from their IRA to qualified charities, such as St. Francis Xavier Parish. This is a unique opportunity to make a significant impact while also benefiting from potential tax advantages through a QCD.

Here are some key benefits of making a QCD from your IRA:

- Reduce your taxable income:** The amount transferred directly to charity does not generate taxable income, which may reduce your annual income level. This may help lower your Medicare premiums and decrease the amount of Social Security subject to tax.
- Fulfill your RMD:** If you are 73 years old or older, your QCD can satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution.
- Simplicity:** The process is straightforward—just instruct your IRA custodian to make the gift directly to us.
- Make a Difference:** Your QCD will make an immediate impact on our mission to *belong, believe, and be love*.

As we reflect on the blessings of the past year, we invite you to consider making a QCD to St. Francis Xavier Parish. If you would like to ensure your contribution is received in the current tax year, it is best to initiate your QCD prior to December 10.
