Pastor's Letter

Peter asked Jesus, "Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive?"

As many as seven times?"

Jesus answered, "I say to you, not seven times, but seventy-seven times."

Matthew 18:21

It was awesome! I am inspired and enlightened by the five women who offered their reflections on the scriptures last weekend. Each of them approached the scriptures from a different perspective and brought to life the words of Jesus. As much as I love to preach each weekend, I also love to listen to the preaching of another as they speak from the same scriptures. I value this even more when the preacher is someone whose life experience is different than my own due to gender, race, or life experience. This weekend we were given a great gift from **Martie Lukanich, Sr. Marci Hermesdorf, Maggie McMahon, Maureen Windmoeller, and Katie McCarthy**. Thank you to the entire parish team that coordinated the details of the weekend. Perhaps they inspired some young women among us to consider a future as leaders and ministers in the Church.

This week, Jesus takes his teachings on how to live in loving relationship with one another *one step further*. Peter again thinks he understands the teaching; he proudly asks Jesus if he is to forgive a person as many as *seven* times. At the time of Jesus, forgiving a person *once* might be considered more than was necessary; *forgiving a second time was unthinkable*. By extending it to seven times, Peter thinks he has understood how much farther the love of neighbor must go. Jesus' response of "seventy-seven times" is not intended to provide an exact number. Rather, such a number would equate to infinity for Peter. **Our forgiveness of others must be countless**, as is God's mercy toward us.

Jesus taught us to pray, "Forgive us our sins, *as we forgive those who trespass against us*." It is only to the extent that we open our hearts in loving forgiveness of another that we open our hearts to receive the forgiveness God desires to share with us. *It is not that God punishes us* for our failures to forgive, as does the king in the parable. Rather our God loving and eagerly desires that we accept God's mercy. The reality of the human heart is that we remain closed to God's forgiveness while we are refusing to offer that same gift to one who has harmed us. *The other person does not need to apologize or even be sorry for what they have done*. **Forgiveness is the act of love that opens our heart to God's love.**

The same is true of our struggle to forgive ourselves. We may fear that God has not forgiven us for some past act. We must lovingly forgive ourselves to open our hearts to the forgiveness that God wants to share with us. The second great commandment of love is *both to love ourselves and to love our neighbor as ourselves*. This love is not selfish; it is our gratitude for the gift of our life.

Next weekend, we will be asked, "Who do you say that St. Francis Xavier Parish is?" We will each be asked to provide three distinct words that best answer this question. Take some time this week to ponder what three words you will choose.

Offertory Report

Total Sunday Collection

July 1 through August 31, 2023: \$250,263

After a brief summer hiatus for the "Your Gift, God's Hands" article, we return to report on the impact your offertory donations have on the mission here at St. Francis Xavier Parish. Sometimes, significant capital improvements to our buildings are essential. This summer, it was literally the roof over our heads! We are so grateful for our parish savings, which enabled us to do a project costing almost \$700,000 without a major capital campaign. In addition to our savings, we received generous contributions to the building fund from a few parishioners over the past few months. Fundraisers hosted by the Catholic Women's Club and the Men's Club over the past two years brought in over \$50,000 as well.

Two 3rd floor, south-facing classrooms received new windows as part of this project, which provided major enhancements to ventilation, air conditioning, and aesthetics. As Laura Walls shares, *"The classroom looks so brand new and fresh! The students were so excited about the new state-of-the-art air conditioners, especially on those very hot first days of school."*
