Pastor's Letter

Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. Philippians 4:6-7

I experienced my first eight-day silent retreat in January 1987 on the Atlantic Coast in Gloucester, Massachusetts. I was feeling somewhat lost in my life and deeply desired to reconnect with Jesus. It took *five days of climbing huge oceanside boulders* before I decided to just *lie down on one of those boulders and be still*. Within a short while, I powerfully encountered the depth of the love of Jesus for me in a way that is far beyond anything I could express in words. All that the Lord was asking of me was that I *be still* and *let <u>him</u> come <u>to me</u>. Thirty-six years later, now sitting in the foothills of the Rocky Mountains, I melted into the silence within a few hours of my arrival. God is good!*

Stillness of spirit is the attitude into which St. Paul invites us this weekend. He teaches us to begin with prayers of thanksgiving for the blessings in our life, and only then to move on to the people and situations into which we invite God's loving presence. This is the path to peace of mind and heart that is beyond our understanding. **Jesus is seeking us.** He lived, died, rose, and continues to live among us and be present to us. *God seeks us* and waits for us to be still and be open to God's presence.

Several weeks ago, I was joined by three members of our parish staff and over 1,000 men and women from across the Archdiocese for a Day of Spiritual Renewal. The day powerfully reminded us that when we proclaim the resurrection of Jesus, we proclaim that **Jesus lives** – not as a figure in history or a character in the stories of scripture; but *in <u>this</u> moment*. He becomes present to us in the Eucharist and becomes present to the world through the community of believers who carry his message in word and action.

Jesus wants to be known. He wants to walk with us. He wants to guide us when we are troubled and embrace us when we feel lost or alone. He wants to share our joys and encourage our dreams. He wants to sit with us as we watch the sun rise or set, take in our surroundings on a beautiful day, or speak from the bottom of our hearts. And he wants us to tell the stories of our relationship with him so that, through us, others may come to know him. Sometimes he comes to us as we reflect on the blessings in our life. Sometimes he speaks to us as we share our concerns or pray for people or situations in need of prayer. Sometimes all we need to do is to *be still*.

Give yourself the blessing of being with Jesus today. Give thanks, offer a prayer, or just be still. Jesus will find you. And he is waiting to be found.

Happy "October National Holiday", whatever name you give it or without a name at all. Autumn days are too precious to let pass unnoticed.

My name is BC Shelly, and I am returning to St. Francis Xavier as the psychotherapycounseling intern through the Claret Center. I am a fifth-year doctoral student from Adler University pursuing a Psy.D. in Clinical Psychology with an emphasis in Neuropsychology.
