Pastor's Letter

We are the clay and you are the potter: we are all the work of your hands. Isaiah 64:7

Be watchful!

This weekend, the church begins a new year in which we will journey with the Gospel of Mark. This is the first and the shortest of the four gospels embraced by the early church. He writes in a time of turmoil and confusion. Persecution is widespread and the destruction of Jerusalem seems imminent. In this reality, the gospel begins with John the Baptist calling all to prepare the way for the Lord, whose arrival is imminent. Throughout the gospel is the call to be watchful and alert.

Isaiah speaks of us today as clay in the hands of the potter. How might God be reshaping us or smoothing some rough edges as we prepare to celebrate the wonder of God become one like us? A work of pottery can be reshaped many times until it is placed in the kiln. Are we open to what God wants to do in and through us in these days.

The calendar this year gives us only twenty-two days from the First Sunday of Advent until Christmas Eve. This echoes the sense of urgency of the early Christian community, many of whom thought that the second coming of Christ was about to occur. It is time to turn toward the light and clear away all that might keep us from welcoming Jesus into our hearts and homes.

This weekend, we distribute tags from our **Giving Tree**. Each tag offers a way to share some of our material wealth with an individual, family, or community in need. Items must be returned by the following Sunday to allow time for distribution to those who will be receiving gifts from us. We ask God in these days to shape us as missionary disciples who announce God's coming among us in our acts of service and generosity. Through prayer and action, we connect ourselves to the world beyond our sometimes-limited vision. We seek to encounter Christ as he makes himself known to us in those we serve.

This Sunday, we celebrate the **Feast Day of St. Francis Xavier**, our patron. On Friday, the children of our elementary school went out to various places in Chicago and the surrounding area for a Day of Service. On Saturday, many of the families who participate in our School of Religious Education also dedicated the day to service. They took up the call of St. Francis Xavier to "go set the world on fire" with the Spirit of God's loving kindness. They lead us in preparing a way for the Lord who desires to live anew in our hearts and our world.

Next Sunday, **all** are invited to participate in a tradition that is from both our past and recent history. The **Yule Flip Pancake Breakfast** calls us together as families to enjoy food and fellowship and to give children the opportunity to participate in a variety of crafts and activities in Santa's Workshop. Set aside some time to relax and spend time together.

Our First Week of Advent ends with a celebration of Mary, conceived without sin in the womb of her mother Anna. Mary was offered a special grace so that God might do great things through her, if only she would allow that grace to flow through her. Her conception begins the story of salvation long before anyone was to know of God's work among us.

Reflection For the 1st Sunday of Advent

In today's second reading, Saint Paul gives thanks to God for the people of Corinth, for their faith in Christ and their spiritual gifts. As we begin this season of Advent, one way we can draw closer to God and invite him more fully into our homes and our hearts is by seeking out the Christian witnesses in our lives – those friends, family, and community members whose faith strengthens our own.

The life of our parish's own patron Saint Francis Xavier, whose feast day is today, illustrates the transformative power of Christian friendship. Saint Francis was thinking only of worldly success when he first met his college roommate Saint Ignatius Loyola and even laughed at Saint Ignatius' efforts to convert his fellow students to Christianity. But through the powerful witness of Saint Ignatius, only five years later, Saint Ignatius, Saint Francis, and five others began their plans for missionary work and founded what would eventually become the Jesuit order.

Let us then seek out opportunities to follow in Saint Paul and Saint Francis' footsteps – to find, give thanks for, and ask God to bless the people in our lives whose love for Christ transforms everyone around them. And we ask God also to give us the strength to be that Christian witness for others.

The Christmas Wafer (also known as "Oplatki") is available at the Rectory.

The word "Bethlehem" means "the house of bread." The breaking of the bread is a sign of charity, unity and friendship. Religious family customs bring the truths of faith into the home. One of these beautiful Christmas Eve customs is the Christmas Wafer. The thin wafer bearing the Christmas characters is broken by the head of the family and distributed to each member.



With a simple prayer for God's grace and the welfare of all members of the family, those present as well as those who are absent, the head of the house breaks the wafer and distributes it, one piece to each person at the table. While doing so, each member of the family is kissed and wished a joyful feast. Members then greet one another in the same way.

The spiritual lesson in this age-old custom is that the unity of the family is grounded in God's love for us. May you experience unity and love through this simple celebration.


Lauren Desmond

St. Francis Xavier Information about Our Patron Saint

"The dangers to which I am exposed and the tasks I undertake for God are springs of spiritual joy, so much so that these islands are the places in all the world for a man to lose his sight by excess of weeping; but they are tears of joy."

- Born 1506, in Navarre, Spain.
- Educated at the University of Paris in the 1530s, where he met Ignatius of Loyola.
- In 1541, was appointed apostolic nuncio (an ambassador of the Church) to Asia, and left for Portuguese Goa. The voyage took 15 months.
- In his parting letter to Ignatius, he wrote: *"For what is left of this life, I am well assured, it will be by letter only that we shall be together in the other we shall embrace face to face."*
- Through his preaching he won many conversions, almost all among poor, tribal, and lower-caste peoples.
- In his travels, he tended to the needs of the sick and infirm, revitalized the liturgical and sacramental life of already existing Christian populations, and drew people to faith in Jesus Christ.
- In 1546, he explored other islands in southern Asia. Then, in 1549, he moved on to Japan, where he made a hundred converts in a year at Kagoshima. By the time he left three years later, there were 2,000 Japanese Christians.
- In 1552, Francis left for mission work in China. He became ill on the way, and died almost alone on the island of Shang-chwan, six miles off the coast of mainland China.
- His death was on December 3, 1552 at the age of forty-six.
- St. Francis Xavier remains one of the greatest missionaries in the history of the Church.
- He was canonized in 1622, along with Ignatius of Loyola, Teresa of Avila, and Philip Neri.
- In 1927 he was declared the patron saint of foreign missions.

We pray:

Creator God inspired by the example of St. Francis, we pray to you for the courage to be missionaries, reaching out and leading others to Jesus. Like St. Francis may we help those in need, may we live a life rooted in prayer and may we bring Christ to all those we meet. This we ask through your Son, our Lord, Jesus Christ. Amen.


