Pastor's Letter

They saw the child with Mary, his mother, and did him homage.

And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod,
they departed for their country by another way.

Matthew 2:11a,12

The magi end their quest in the humble home of a young family in which they find Jesus, no longer an infant, but a little child. They bow before him and offer their precious gifts from the East. When they began their quest, they knew nothing about Israel or the prophecies concerning the birth of a savior. They were awed at the appearance of a star in the night sky that meant to them that something wonderful had happened. They set out on a long journey with the guidance of those who themselves are oblivious to what has occurred in their midst. In the Bethlehem home of Mary and Joseph, their hearts are opened and their lives forever changed. They allow themselves to be guided by the voice of the Spirit, who steers them clear of Herod and his treachery.

How do we leave the Christmas season this year? How has the celebration of God becoming one with us in Jesus directed our path as we journey into a new year? As we put away the decorations for another year, are we aware of ways in which our lives are a bit different for having gone through another Christmas? It may be the result of a treasured gift, a healed relationship, or a sense of peace in allowing God's love into our lives. As we enter this new year, are we attentive to the Spirit, who continues to speak to us in dreams and guide us safely home?

In the words of the poem below, "now the work of Christmas begins." We journey from Christmas carrying precious treasures: the light of the Star to guide our path and the love of God made flesh who dwells in our hearts. With the magi, we share these gifts in our mission to those who have not yet heard. By now you have seen the "squares" that offer an opportunity to grow closer to God this winter. We ask you to hand them to family, friends, and neighbors who may be on a quest of their own. A team of parishioners has been eagerly preparing to offer "Alpha" as an opportunity for individuals to explore questions and to explore answers among other seekers. But the ability of Alpha to become that blessing relies on your willingness to extend the invitation to others or yourself. To whom is the Spirit guiding you to extend the invitation? Invite them to try it.


Now the Work of Christmas Begins
