Pastor's Letter

"This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand."

Mark 1:15

On Monday, December 18, the Vatican released *Fiducia Supplicans*, a document that allows for the blessing of Catholics who are living in a union not recognized by the Catholic Church as the Sacrament of Marriage. This includes divorced Catholics who remarried without obtaining an annulment and all Catholics in same-sex civil marriages. It marks a significant change in Catholic pastoral care without changing the teaching and understanding of the Church regarding the Sacrament of Marriage. How do we appreciate the significance of this change, and how do we carry the message to friends or family members who moved away from the Catholic Church because past statements of some Catholic leaders used unnecessarily harsh language and led to hurt, alienation, and judgment among LGBTQ+ Catholics? The same has been true over the years for divorced and remarried Catholics. Christ calls us to embrace *all* as sisters and brothers. We are each challenged to follow God's call, and no one does this perfectly. Christ's commands of love require compassion and humility rather than judgment.

James Martin, a Jesuit theologian, emphasizes three points about *Fiducia Supplicans*. *"First, it is the first time that a Vatican document treats same-sex couples with such pastoral care.... Second, ... a great deal has in fact changed. Before this document was issued, there was no permission for bishops, priests, and deacons to bless couples in same-sex unions in any setting. This document establishes, with some limitations, that they can.... Third, it is a major step because it continues Pope Francis' continual outreach to L.G.B.T.Q. people.... I welcome this new declaration and see it as a much-needed pastoral response to Catholic same-sex couples in loving, committed and self-sacrificing relationships who desire God's presence and help in their lives."* (America magazine, online edition, 12/18/2023)

There has been no change to the Catholic understanding of the Sacrament of Marriage, in which a Catholic enters a committed, one-time, lifelong union with someone of the opposite gender. However, the possibility of *blessing* persons in a same-sex union, or who divorced and remarried without obtaining an annulment, recognizes that *God is at work in their lives*. It asks that those being blessed remain open to the movement of the Spirit and provides a broader understanding of blessings in the Church. Blessings are not limited to the celebration of a Sacrament or other liturgy. As stated in *Fiducia Supplicans*:

- "Blessings lead us to grasp God's presence in all the events of life and remind us that ,, human beings are invited to seek God, to love him, and to serve him faithfully."
- "Indeed, the grace of God works in the lives of those who do not claim to be righteous but who acknowledge themselves humbly as sinners, like everyone else."
- "God never turns away anyone who approaches him! ,, a blessing ... is a seed of the Holy Spirit that must be nurtured, not hindered."
- "Blessings have as their recipients: people; objects of worship and devotion; sacred images; places of life, of work, and suffering; the fruits of the earth and human toil; and all created realities that refer back to the Creator, praising and blessing him by their beauty."

The blessing that a priest or deacon may now offer invites an openness to God's movement in a couple's life and asks the indwelling of the Spirit in the mind and heart of those being blessed. I am grateful we now can offer these blessings. Pope Francis has offered us all an opportunity for healing and further dialogue. May we as Church continue to grow in our understanding and compassion toward all.

Alpha begins this Monday evening; you can still participate. **Conversations in the Spirit**, a synodal-style conversation about the Church, happens in ten days. I encourage you to bring your voice to the table. The Spirit continues to be alive in the Church through us!

Ministry of Care is Planning to Expand

A Minister of Care is a person who brings the gift of the eucharist and friendship to fellow parishioners and others who are homebound, living in nursing homes, or recovering in the hospital. Our visits help those in need stay connected to the parish and our faith community.

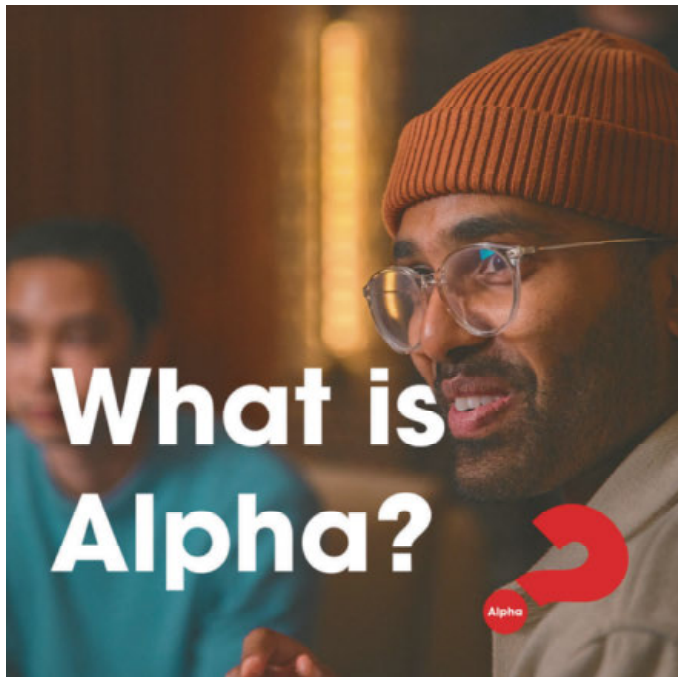
It's a very rewarding ministry and I promise you will receive more than you'll give. The time required varies depending on the activity you choose. Perhaps a few minutes or more on a homebound visit to an hour or so conducting a Prayer and Communion Service or bringing the eucharist to those in the hospital. Those visiting the homebound schedule visits convenient for the minister and the person being visited. Nursing homes and the hospital have fixed schedules.

The Archdiocese requires new ministers to receive 12 hours of instruction prior to being commissioned. After training, you will "shadow" other ministers to learn about your chosen activity. When you are comfortable, you'll receive a quarterly schedule.

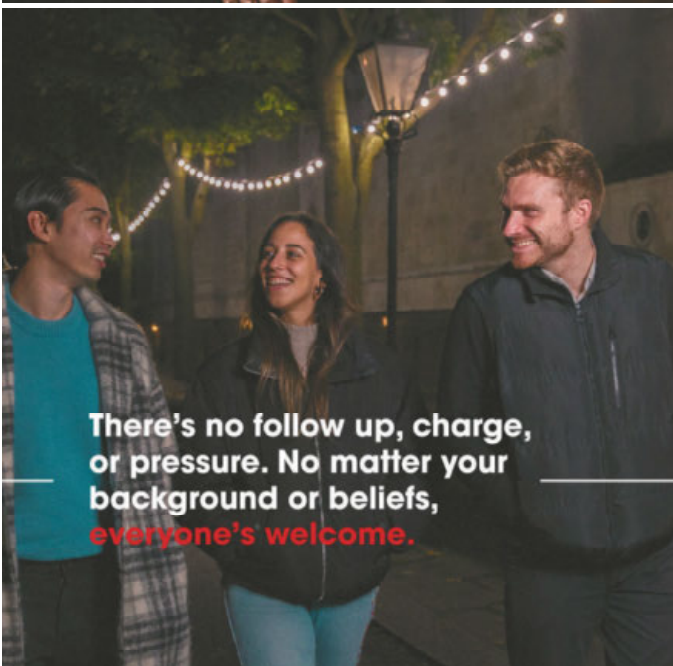
What is Alpha?

This month, we highlight the Resource Department in our elementary school. One of our Resource teachers, Kim Mattucci, has worn many hats during her time at St. Francis Xavier. As a graduate from the class of '73, to her 24 years as a teacher and as a parent of four SFX graduates, she is a longtime member of the SFX family. The last 13 years she has served as a Resource teacher and sees her role as her mission. Kim shares: "There is no place I would rather be. I have the best job in the world, at the best place in the world. Who could ask for more? If you are a part of SFX, you know and can feel that deep connection we all have. We don't just talk about being a family, we actually ARE a family."

St. Francis Xavier School uses iReady testing in the fall, winter and spring to help identify any students who might benefit from additional support. Diagnostic testing provides data in math and reading domains that helps teachers provide differentiated instruction, connect with students, and reinforce additional learning support in small groups.

Kim brings passion and commitment into building relationships with the students she works with as a Resource Teacher – a vital role that not all Catholic schools have. "When we bond with our students, they will perform to the best of their abilities. If they know we are here to help them and support them, they will give their very best because they know they are getting the very best from us!"

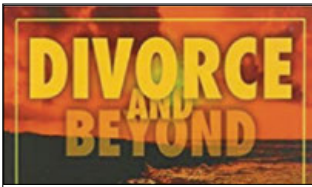

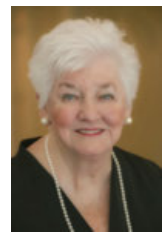
