Pastor's Letter

Jesus said to his disciples, "Remain in me, as I remain in you."

John 15:4

"I remain in you." Jesus speaks to those gathered with him at the Last Supper, and Jesus speaks these words to us, gathered with him at the ongoing banquet of the Eucharist. He speaks in the present tense and without condition. Jesus remains in us. His love dwells in the hearts of those he loves, <u>our</u> hearts, because that is what love does. We can do nothing to earn or deserve his presence in us; nor can we do anything to lose this love. Jesus desires to be in relationship with each of us in a very personal way. Yet his desire alone is not enough.

A relationship requires <u>two</u> persons who <u>both</u> freely choose to be in relationship with the other. The invitation of Jesus to remain in him is an invitation for us *to enter into this relationship with him*. He does not want to be a character in a book or the subject of great stories that are told about him. He wants to be with us now; to walk with us on our journey *here and now* as our companion and guide. But since the desire for a relationship is rooted in love, Jesus will not force a response to his invitation to dwell in him and *become both lover and beloved*.

Jesus assures us that, if we choose to remain in him, we will bear fruit beyond our imagining. He is the vine rooted in the Father and growing in the Holy Spirit. We are branches joined to the Father and the Spirit through our life in Jesus and his life in us. When we choose to remain in him, we grow, bloom, and bear fruit as he lives in and through us.

How do we remain in him? The apostle John writes clearly and simply again this week. We remain in Jesus when we "love not in word or speech but *in deed and truth.*" *We remain in him* when we allow his love in us to bear fruit in and through our service to our sisters and brothers, especially those in need. *We remain in him* when we choose to see each person as a beloved child of God and seek the grace to love them as God loves them. *We remain in him* when we act to protect the dignity of every human life, especially the unborn, the elderly, the refugee, the homeless, those with physical or mental limitations, and those condemned to death.

The blossoms of spring reflect the glory of God in all of creation. Trees burst forth with bright pink and white flowers. Tulips reveal a broad range of pastels, hyacinths release their fragrance, and daffodils add bold yellows to the mix. Over the past few weeks, Cathie Skokna and her team of Edythe Ministers have been tilling the soil, planting a variety of perennials, and planning the annuals that will be added as the weather permits. The Edythe Garden Ministry was established thirty years ago by Cathie's mother, Edythe. Over the past year, many gardeners have volunteered their talents, time, and even some plantings from their own gardens. Pause to take in the beauty of their efforts on your way in and out of church.

On Sunday afternoon, families participating in our **School of Religious Education** gather to celebrate the end of another year of growing in grace. Thank you to our Director of Religious Education, Elis Guidice, and her assistant, Cindy Johnson. Blessings to <u>all</u> our volunteer catechists who guide our children through word and witness.

Next weekend brings two special celebrations. Our children who have been preparing over the past year will celebrate **First Communion** at one of two Saturday Masses. Please make an effort to welcome and congratulate them as they worship among us on Sunday. (They are invited to wear their First Communion outfits, so they may be easy to spot.) At the Sunday 5:00 PM Mass, we will celebrate our **graduating high school seniors**. They have been encouraged to wear either a jersey from the college they will be attending in the fall or something that represents the next step in their life and learning. They have blessed us with their presence, their service, and their questions.

SFX Educational Endowment Celebrating a Milestone

We have some wonderful news to share with you! Back in 1999, a group of about 30 inaugural parish families donated the seed capital to establish the SFX Educational Endowment. The purpose of this endowment is "to perpetuate, partially support, and uphold the educational ministries of St. Francis Xavier School." For the past 25 years, the Finance Council and our pastors have stewarded this endowment, including these first gifts entrusted to the parish, and we have just reached our first milestone: \$1 million! This amount was established internally as a benchmark to reach before regular distributions of the earnings could be made to the school – ensuring the longevity of the endowment's corpus and cementing the impact of the gifts. We are pleased to announce that the first major distribution of 4% (\$40,000) will be used for much deserved bonuses for teachers and staff.

During each weekend Mass on May 4 and 5, we will celebrate the attainment of this milestone with our church family.


Vacation Bible School Registration is Opened Until Sunday, May 5th!
