Pastor's Letter

Be doers of the word and not hearers only. Religion that is pure and undefiled before God is to care for orphans and widows. James 1:22,27

Protecting the vulnerable in society is a core value in Mosaic law. In the time of Jesus, this especially included widows and orphans, who could not adequately provide for themselves without husbands or adult sons. It also extended to foreigners who could not find adequate work to support their families. The people of Israel lived as a community responsible for <u>all</u> who were part of their community, friend and stranger alike. The spiritual health of the community was measured by how well the community met the needs of those most in need.

The apostle James emphasizes the importance of this practice for the early Christian community. He addresses those who would eloquently proclaim the teachings of Jesus yet not put them into practice. Jesus had explicitly extended love of neighbor to include one's enemy, which made the challenge to an active love even more challenging. Early Jewish Christians had to embrace relatives and friends who had expelled them from the synagogues; they had to accept Gentile Christians whom they once viewed as pagans. The disciple of Jesus was to be known less by eloquent words than by care for those most in need: friend, stranger, or enemy.

We disciples of Jesus continue to be challenged by the command to respond to the needs of the most vulnerable among us. In the image of the seamless garment presented by Cardinal Bernardin, the challenge extends to the child in the womb and the child living in poverty or threat of harm. It extends to the person without a job, or without a job adequate to provide for their household. It includes those seeking safety and stability for their families, without regard to their immigration status or past mistakes.

Such outreach is <u>not</u> a matter of our politics or opinions on the systems or structures that will best resolve the larger issues. It is the consequence of our faith in Jesus and his call to be missionary disciples who practice what Jesus preached. We can care for the immigrant seeking asylum <u>and</u> differ on how best to determine their status as citizens. We can provide food to those unable to provide adequate food for their households <u>and</u> advocate for different solutions to the issues of hunger, homelessness, and underemployment. We can show compassion to women and couples experiencing difficulties surrounding pregnancy <u>and</u> differ on how best to advocate for the unborn in sometimes complex medical and practical circumstances. In every situation, we <u>must</u> face the challenge to see the "other" as sister or brother; to respond to their immediate and critical needs because we <u>all</u> belong God's one family.

This weekend we offer thanks for the often unseen women and men who labor in so many ways that make life as we know it possible. For over a century, the social teachings of the Catholic Church have advocated for the dignity of all human labor and the fair treatment of workers. Respecting the dignity of the laborer grew in importance as we moved from a largely family-based farm society to an institutional industrial society. Over time, workers gained the right to safe working conditions, reasonable hours and wages, protection of children, and equal opportunity based on ability and willingness to work hard. I encourage us to take time to be aware of and perhaps personally greet the laborers in restaurants, on our streets, and in our stores; we can also call to mind those who labor unseen on night shifts, in food preparation, and on the other end of customer service lines.





Ministry of Care is Planning to Expand

A Minister of Care is a person who brings the gift of the eucharist and friendship to fellow parishioners and others who are homebound, living in nursing homes, or recovering in the hospital. Our visits help those in need stay connected to the parish and our faith community.

It's a very rewarding ministry and I promise you will receive more than you'll give. The time required varies depending on the activity you choose. Perhaps a few minutes or more on a homebound visit to an hour or so conducting a Prayer and Communion Service or bringing the eucharist to those in the hospital. Those visiting the homebound schedule visits convenient for the minister and the person being visited. Nursing homes and the hospital have fixed schedules.

The Archdiocese requires new ministers to receive 12 hours of instruction prior to being commissioned. After training, you will "shadow" other ministers to learn about your chosen activity. When you are comfortable, you'll receive a quarterly schedule.

One day training is available at LaGrange Hospital on Saturday, September 21st from 8:30am -4:00pm, lunch will be provided.


National Make-A-Will Month. Please Remember St. Francis Xavier Parish/School in Your Will or Trust

Please consider making a gift from your individual retirement plan (IRA) that benefits you and our parish. A qualified charitable distribution (QCD) allows individuals age 70¹/₂ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to make a direct transfer of funds from their IRA to qualified charities, tax-free.

There are three main benefits of giving with a QCD:

- 1) If you are 73 years old or older, the amount you transfer can satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution.
- The amount transferred directly to charity does not generate taxable income, which may reduce your annual income level. This may help lower your Medicare premiums and decrease the amount of Social Security that is subject to tax.
- 3) Your gift will be immediately used, allowing you to see the impact of your gift now.


