# **Pastor's Letter**

### Jesus said, "Whoever wishes to come after me must take up your cross and follow me." Mark 8:34

This weekend we enter the heart of Mark's gospel. Up to this point, Jesus has been performing miraculous cures and feeding multitudes of people from only a few loaves of bread. On each occasion, Jesus has told people not to tell anyone else what they have witnessed. However, people are so awed by these miracles that they have been *telling everyone who will listen*. Today, we learn why Jesus was asking them to keep these miracles a secret. Jesus is much more than a miracle worker. We cannot understand *Jesus the Christ* until we experience his suffering and face his death on the cross before we rejoice in his resurrection from death. He has come to heal our souls, and not our physical ills and hungers. And his mission will demand a high price.

**"Who do people say that I am?**" Jesus asks his disciples as they walk the road. Peter boldly proclaims Jesus as the Christ. But he does not yet realize all that this means. As Jesus begins to speak of his suffering and death on a cross, Peter takes Jesus aside and attempts to redirect him and the severity of his words. Jesus responds, "Get behind me, Satan." Those who will be his disciples must go beyond the limits of human understanding before we can know Jesus and witness to others on his behalf.

Jesus teaches that the *missionary disciple* is one who is willing to deny oneself and take up their cross; to lose their life for the sake of the gospel. Throughout our history, many paid the price of faithful discipleship through martyrdom. However, this is not the only way; the missionary disciple is the one who surrenders their life to God and to whatever God asks of them. Our human instinct is to chart our own course without interference from others. So, to surrender my own wishes and desires, or at least to place God's desires above my own <u>is</u> to take up a cross. It is to allow my wants to die *if that is what is necessary to do what God asks of me*. It is to trust that in taking up this cross to follow Jesus, I will be led to a new and richer life that I can proclaim and share with others.

Our programs of religious formation for people of <u>all</u> ages are underway. The **parish Elementary School** has completed its third week, and our **School of Religious Education** held their first session this past week. Both programs for our children are developing opportunities for parents to grow in faith along with their children. **Alpha** has begun on Monday evening for adults seeking a place to share a meal and share questions of faith and meaning with others who also are questioning. **That Man Is You** began on Tuesday evening for all adult men who seek to grow in faith through learning and sharing with other men. *TMIY remains open to new participants.* Stay informed through the weekly bulletin and the parish website for additional opportunities for adult faith formation as we move through the year. Thanks to Maggie McMahon and Elis Guidice and their parishioner teams who make this all possible.

Finally, thank you to the four women who shred their reflections on the scriptures last weekend: Heather Fitzpatrick, Martie Lukanich, Katie Mulcahey, and Maureen Windmoeller. Each woman inspired me with their thoughts and nourished my spirit from perspectives too often not heard within the Church. St. Francis Xavier Parish is gifted with *many* such voices --- lay women *and men*. The Holy Spirit has blessed this faith community with the hope and gifts to offer a vision of church to engage our youth and those still outside our doors or on the edges. That is the work and promise of the Holy Spirit. **Thanks be to God!**

# Ministry of Care is Planning to Expand

A Minister of Care is a person who brings the gift of the eucharist and friendship to fellow parishioners and others who are homebound, living in nursing homes, or recovering in the hospital. Our visits help those in need stay connected to the parish and our faith community.

It's a very rewarding ministry and I promise you will receive more than you'll give. The time required varies depending on the activity you choose. Perhaps a few minutes or more on a homebound visit to an hour or so conducting a Prayer and Communion Service or bringing the eucharist to those in the hospital. Those visiting the homebound schedule visits convenient for the minister and the person being visited. Nursing homes and the hospital have fixed schedules.

The Archdiocese requires new ministers to receive 12 hours of instruction prior to being commissioned. After training, you will "shadow" other ministers to learn about your chosen activity. When you are comfortable, you'll receive a quarterly schedule.

**One day training is available at LaGrange Hospital** on Saturday, September 21st from 8:30am until 4:00pm, lunch will be provided.






