Pastor's Letter

"Would that all the people of the Lord were prophets." Numbers 11:29

Last week's argument among the disciples about who would have the higher places in the kingdom is reflected this weekend by the jealousy of the first prophets of Israel in the desert. Two men, Eldad and Medad, were prophesying among the people, even though they had not attended the ceremony at which the spirit of the Lord had come down upon the others. Young Joshua asks Moses to stop these two from prophesying. Moses responds with a wish that *all* might receive the spirit of prophesy from the Lord.

How do we encourage others to share their gifts and talents? Do we sometimes discourage others or set excessive qualifications for belonging? Or do we *recognize talents and gifts* in others and *encourage them to share their talents* with the community? Do we *welcome new members into ministries* to which we belong, *introduce them to others*, and do all we can to *ensure that they feel part of the group*, even if their talents may outshine our own? Are we *open to new ways that the Spirit may be moving* among us? Do we resist the temptation to want things "the way they always have been"?

"Whoever is not against us is for us," Jesus insists. For those of us already on "the way," we must not only welcome the newest member, but separate ourselves from any thoughts, attitudes, or actions that are contrary to the commandments of love. *The promises of our Baptism must be seen in our daily living*, including our willingness to confess our faults and trust that God's loving mercy will *always* heal and strengthen us. We are given to each other *to lift each other up*; and we are sent from our weekly gathering *to uphold the dignity and gifts of those not yet among us* – especially young people and those who feel separated from God for any reason whatsoever. That is the work of the *missionary disciple*.

Each summer, Cardinal Cupich asks each pastor to consult parish leadership and nominate a parishioner for the **Archdiocesan Christifideles Award**. This award is bestowed upon a Catholic layperson from each parish who has demonstrated, by their participation in parish life, the personal and ministerial renewal called for by the Papal Exhortation, *Christifideles Laici*, which calls the laity to the vocation of responsibility for the Church's life springing from the gift and mission of their baptism. The individual must be a practicing Catholic who manifests an understanding of the teachings of the Church and has been graced with a life formed in the Catholic spiritual tradition. It must have been demonstrated that the individual has used their talents to deepen the life of the Church in the parish and/or has served in an extraordinary way the ministry of the parish.

The consensus of the Parish Pastoral Council this year was to nominate Tony Pangan for the 2024 Christifideles Award. Tony is active in many areas of parish life. He has served on the Parish Pastoral Council and now serves on the pastor Leadership Team. He serves on the parish Alpha Team and Evangelization Group. Tony is a member of one of the parish choirs and a regular cantor on weekends. All this and more while serving in a full-time medical practice. As one parishioner stated, "We are constantly saying, 'Wait - Tony's doing that too?'" Tony will receive the award from the Cardinal in a ceremony at Holy Name Cathedral this Sunday afternoon.

Thank you, Tony and your wife Aileen. Congratulations on your well-deserved recognition!






