Pastor's Letter

"Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength.

You shall love your neighbor as yourself.

There is no other commandment greater than these."

Mark 12:29-31

Jesus and his disciples have entered the holy city of Jerusalem as we enter the final chapters of Mark's gospel. He is confronted by a series of challenges, many motivated by a desire to catch Jesus in something that they can use against him. A scholar of the law asks Jesus, "Which is *the first among all the commandments*?" By the time of Jesus, the original ten commandments given to Moses on Mount Sinai had grown to include *hundreds* of laws covering many details of daily life. It is not clear whether the scribe's intent is to test Jesus or whether he genuinely seeks wisdom. Jesus quotes the Torah, the holiest scriptures of the Jewish people. **Total love of God** with <u>all</u> one's heart, soul, and strength comes **before all else**. Jesus adds "all of one's <u>mind</u>" to the original words of Moses, rooting even the study and discussion of the commandments in love of God.

Jesus goes even further and names the <u>second</u> greatest commandment: to love one's neighbor as oneself. Placing <u>all</u> other laws under one of these two commandments, he makes it clear that <u>all</u> human behavior must be guided by these two commandments of love. Most in the crowd probably agreed with the scribe who affirms what Jesus has said. However, tensions arise in the Gospel of Luke, when the scribe takes the conversation one step further, asking, "And **who is my neighbor?**" Jesus responds to him with the parable of the Good Samaritan, making it clear that **the neighbor is everyone** in need of our assistance. Jesus insists that his disciples cannot set boundaries between those "worthy" of our love and those whom we can deem "unworthy." Jesus redefines what it means to be among the "chosen" people as having a greater responsibility to reach out to those who have not yet learned of God's love for them.

The challenge to love <u>all</u> others as our sisters and brothers may prove especially challenging for some this week. We have lived through months of harsh words, creating enemies, and being encouraged to fear the consequences of one candidate or the other winning an election that may be decided by very narrow margins. <u>All</u> those who have been seeking political office are beloved daughters and sons of God whom God has commanded us to love with the same love we have for ourselves and those closest to us. In our human weakness, we all may struggle at times to express this in our words, actions, and attitudes. This is our charge and our challenge as missionary disciples. And this is something we do only through prayer and the help of God's grace. May we witness the love of Jesus this week in our thoughts, words, and actions.

This Saturday evening, we pause at Mass to remember those who have died and have been in our prayers during this past year. We gather to comfort those still grieving with the pain of their loss, especially the parents among us who lost a child. I encourage you to dedicate some time in prayer this week for the relatives and close friends of those whose names appear on the cover of the bulletin this week. We live in hope of the moment when we all will be together again in the never-ending joy of God's kingdom.

Dear St. Francis Xavier Parish,

Last year, I wrote to you about Reverend William Killeen, a retired priest who served in your parish as an associate pastor from May 2011 to June 2019. The Archdiocese had received an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor while Father Killeen was assigned to St. Patricia Parish more than 40 years ago. In keeping with our child protection policies, the allegation was reported to civil authorities and the person making the allegation was offered the services of our Victim Assistance Ministry. Father Killeen cooperated with my direction to remain out of ministry while the allegation was investigated.

The Archdiocese Independent Review Board met this week to evaluate the results of the investigation. They determined that there is not a reasonable cause to believe Father Killeen sexually abused a minor. In addition, the Board recommended that Father Killeen be returned to ministry and that the file be closed. After prayerful consideration, I have accepted their recommendations and restored Father Killeen's faculties to minister in the Archdiocese of Chicago.

The welfare of the children entrusted to our care is our paramount consideration. Consequently, we take seriously all allegations of sexual misconduct. It is to the credit of our priests that they support our child protection policies. They understand that only by applying a meticulous and impartial process to all allegations can we remain committed to our work of assisting survivors and, with the help of independent advisors, thoroughly evaluate all allegations.

At the same time, I am committed to restoring the good name of those so accused if the case is unsubstantiated. To that end, I publicly affirm that Father Killeen is a priest in good standing and express sincere appreciation for his many years of service to the People of God in the Archdiocese of Chicago. This period away from ministry has been challenging for him. He deserves our respect and gratitude and I hope you will join me in thanking him for his long-standing dedication.

In closing, I encourage anyone who believes they have been abused by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee to come forward. You will be received with respect and compassion. To report abuse please refer to the Archdiocesan website at www.archchicago.org.



Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship

The following is an excerpt from a document of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, "Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship", which guides Catholics in how to make conscience-based decisions on political issues, including choosing candidates for public office. Let us look to the example of the Good Samaritan. Jesus' parable summons us to rediscover our vocation as citizens of our respective nations and of the entire world, builders of a new social bond. This summons is ever new, yet it is grounded in a fundamental law of our being: we are called to direct society to the pursuit of the common good and, with this purpose in mind, to persevere in consolidating its political and social order, its fabric of relations, its human goals. (Pope Francis, Fratelli Tutti, no. 66)

As Catholics and Americans, we are blessed to be able to participate in our nation's political and public life. Our freedoms respect the dignity of individuals and their consciences and allow us to come together for the common good. Election seasons, therefore, should contain a sense of gratitude and hope. Our love for this country, our patriotism, properly impels us to vote.

But increasingly, it seems, election seasons are a time of anxiety and spiritual trial. Political rhetoric is increasingly angry, seeking to motivate primarily through division and hatred. Fear can be an effective tool for raising money. The most heated arguments online often get the most clicks. Demonizing the other can win votes.

We propose once more the moral framework of Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship precisely as pastors, inspired by the Good Samaritan, with the hope of binding these wounds and healing these bitter divisions. This document is not based on personalities or partisanship, the latest news cycle, or what's trending on social media. Instead, it reflects the perennial role of the Church in public life in proclaiming timeless principles: the infinite worth and dignity of every human life, the common good, solidarity, and subsidiarity. Not sure what these mean? We invite you to read a copy of *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship* and learn more.

Allowing your conscience to be stretched and formed by these reflections can give you peace! They point to Jesus' challenge to show mercy to those in need, just as the Good Samaritan. As Pope Francis writes, "Here, all our distinctions, labels and masks fall away: it is the moment of truth. Will we bend down to touch and heal the wounds of others?" (Fratelli Tutti, no. 70.) Let this be in our hearts when we talk about politics and make political choices.

Our Registration for the In Person Program is now closed, but registrations for our 1 – 8 Online Program is still open until November 30th.







Our Sharing Parish is part of a new parish with a new name: St. Simon of Cyrene

For many years, St. Agatha Parish, on Chicago's west side, has been our sharing parish. We have celebrated Mass with the people of St. Agatha at both locations, supported their Christmas outreach through toy showers and our Giving Tree, attended Peace Circles together, and provided financial support to their children enrolling in Catholic schools. Fr. Larry Dowling served as pastor until he retired in June.

In July 2022, as part of the Renew My Church process, St. Agatha and St. Martin de Porres Parishes combined to become St. Simon of Cyrene Catholic Parish with ministry sites at both locations. Fr. Thadeo Mgimba was appointed pastor in July 2024. It so happens that we had a sharing parish connection with Fr. Thadeo when he was pastor of Ascension/St. Susanna in Harvey (which was closed in the Renew My Church process). We are delighted to reestablish our connection with Fr. Thadeo and to continue our sharing parish partnership with the renamed faith community of St. Simon of Cyrene.



SFX supporters of the 125th Anniversary Capital Campaign will recall that \$750,000 of the funds raised were used to establish an Educational Endowment Fund to benefit St. Agatha children. The earnings from that endowment have assisted dozens of students since its inception. With input from Fr. Bill Tkachuk, Fr. Larry Dowling, and Fr. Thadeo, the endowment funds will now be used to provide scholarships for students who are parishioners of the "new" St. Simon of Cyrene Parish. Surplus funds in any given year will be used to assist students of three area Catholic elementary schools (St. Angela, St. Catherine-St. Lucy, and St. Malachy) following a recommendation from the corresponding school principal.









Greetings Fr. Bill and the Faith Community of SFX,

I am grateful for this opportunity to extend my heartfelt thanks to the Lord for His goodness and enduring mercy. I send warm greetings from the community of hope, faith, and love at St. Simon of Cyrene.

First, I would like to introduce myself. My name is Fr. Thadeo Mgimba, from St. Simon of Cyrene, a new parish born from the unification of St. Agatha and St. Martin de Porres Parishes on July 1, 2022. My name might be familiar to some of you, as I previously served as a pastor at another sharing parish of SFX that has since closed—Ascension-St. Susanna Parish in Harvey, IL. It is a true blessing to reconnect with you through this renewed partnership between St. Simon of Cyrene and SFX.

St. Simon of Cyrene is now in its third year since its formation. As you may know, the process of merging parishes is complex. It requires a great deal of patience, attentive listening, and a lot of prayers. The most challenging aspect has been bringing people together, as many of us struggle with change. It

takes time for people to embrace change and the new identity of the parish. Some of us are still struggling to adapt to the changes brought by this process of unification. However, we continue to patiently pray and work together toward the goal of unity. Change is never easy, yet through faith, we remain hopeful.

The unification of our parish has brought with it nine buildings, some of which need capital improvements. This journey requires us to evaluate our buildings and determine which ones we can use for our mission and which we may need to sell. Many of these buildings hold sentimental value for our parishioners, making it a difficult decision to decide which we can keep and which we can let it go. I ask for your prayers that we can make these decisions soon, as the cost of maintaining them has a significant impact on our budget. Please pray for us.

Our parish is blessed with a spirit of resilience, though like many, we face challenges. In our previous October counts, we had about 500 individuals registered as attending services, though the reality is that roughly 250 join us regularly for Sunday Masses. To build a thriving church for the future, we recognize the need for a renewed focus on evangelization to bring more people to church and to celebrate more sacraments.

In partnership with the Archdiocese of Chicago, we have agreed to implement the Alpha Program as a means of evangelization. Deacon Greg Shumpert has graciously taken on this mission, working closely with the Archdiocese. Together, we plan to launch the Alpha program next year, aiming to revitalize the faith of our community and reach those seeking God. For now, Deacon Greg is leading seminars to introduce the importance of evangelization to all parish groups and ministries, with the goal of building a strong, dedicated Evangelization Team. Please pray for us, that we may reach and attract more young people to reconsider their faith and return to the Church.

Our Religious Education program and Sunday School classes began two weeks ago. Though the number of students is small, we are blessed to have passionate and committed catechists who deeply love their faith, the children, and the mission of passing on the teachings of Christ to the next generation. We currently have around twenty students in our Sunday School program and ten students in the Religious Education program. On November 3rd, Bishop Joseph Perry will join us to confirm six of our high school freshmen. This is an exciting time for these young people, and I ask for your prayers as they take this important step in their journey of faith.

Through our outreach office, we serve the community with two food pantries, led by Deacon William Pouncy, and a clothing ministry that provides for those in need. Our food pantries serve approximately 130 to 150 individuals each week, translating to about 520 to 600 people per month. Our dedicated volunteers embody the call of Christ, serving each guest with love and dignity, in the spirit of His words, "Whatever you do for the least of these brothers and sisters, you do it for me."

Additionally, at St. Agatha Church, we have partnered with the 548 Foundation, which trains 75 young men and women as solar panel installation technicians through a 13-week program. This initiative provides valuable job opportunities in the solar installation industry, offering hope and a future for our youth. We are also collaborating with Music Inc., an organization that provides music education as an extracurricular and after-school program. Currently, Music Inc. serves 45 students, ranging in age from 4 to 18, fostering creativity and a love for the arts.

St. Francis Xavier Peace & Justice Event Stateville Calling Documentary & Discussion November 10, 2024 3:00-5:00pm Unity Hall (between the Church & School)

We will show *Stateville Calling*, a 50 minute documentary exploring parole reform and the struggle of aging inmates in Illinois followed by a discussion with Bill Ryan and Arkee Chaney.

Bill Ryan is a resident of Plymouth Place, who has spent the last several decades befriending and advocating on behalf of a group of men and women incarcerated for life, helping to abolish the death penalty in Illinois, publishing a newspaper written by prisoners, and ceaselessly negotiating with victim's advocates, legislators and lobbyists from both sides of the aisle.

"Art saved me" said Arkee Chaney about his 33 years in Illinois prisons. Arkee had been sentenced to life without the possibility of parole (LWOP) after being convicted of stealing \$110 in three different burglaries. While incarcerated, Arkee met Dr. Margaret Burroughs, the founder of the DuSable Museum and a volunteer art teacher at Stateville Prison. Dr. Burroughs encouraged Arkee's natural artistic ability. He began painting regularly in his cell and soon was teaching others to create art as well. Eventually the Illinois Prison Review board recommended his sentence be reduced to time served, Governor Pritzker approved, and Arkee was released from prison. Having no living family members who were able to take him in, Arkee came to live with Bill Ryan for two years. During that time, he continued to paint and create ceramics, setting up in Bill's garage, which became his art studio. We will display some of Arkee's art.

The film illustrates the forces that created our system, and surveys the competing arguments and data points at play to equip viewers to decide for themselves what should be done about criminal justice in Illinois.
