Pastor's Letter

The jar of flour did not go empty, nor the jug of oil run dry.

1 Kings 17:16

Two widows appear in this weekend's scriptures. The first is a younger woman with a young son whose resources have run out during a drought. She is about to prepare what she believes will be their final meal. Yet when she encounters a traveler asking her for something to eat, she offers to prepare something for him, unaware that it is the prophet Elijah who has made this request. Her extreme generosity and hospitality to a stranger become a blessing that provides food for her and her son until the drought has ended. The second widow comes to the temple to place what little she has in the service of God through the ministers of the temple. She is not aware that she is being observed by Jesus, let alone becoming a visual aid for what Jesus is attempting to teach his disciples.

The amount that a person donates is less important than the attitude of the giver. Am I willing to offer what I have and help another person, even if my means are limited? Am I willing to do so even if the other person is a stranger and may have no way to repay me? Am I willing to act out of kindness rather than fail to act out of fear? And am I willing to do so without reward or recognition for what I have done? This Saturday is a day of service for families with children in our **School of Religious Education**. Families were invited to follow the example of the two above widows by collecting shelf-stable foods and packing grocery bags for those receiving assistance through the BEDS Plus program in our area. Their efforts will benefit other families whom they will never meet but to whom they are connected through their loving service.

Bishop Robert Casey will be with us next Saturday to confer the **Sacrament of Confirmation** for over 100 of our parish youth. These young men and women completed two years of catechesis in seventh and eighth grade and attended a retreat day in late October. Their use of the gifts that the Spirit will bestow on them is a blessing for us and for those whom they will serve and inspire.

This Sunday at the 9:00AM Mass we welcome the men and women who are participating in this year's **Order of Christian Initiation for Adults (OCIA)**. Today's Welcome Rite is the first public declaration of their intent to receive one or more of the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist) as part of becoming full members of the Roman Catholic Church. Please keep them in your prayers as they journey toward the Easter Vigil on Saturday, April 19.

This Sunday at the 11:00AM Mass we commission the members of the **Parish Pastoral Council** for the next year. The PPC supports, enlivens, and advances the mission of the parish, and serves as a consultative group to the parish pastor and pastoral staff. The PPC is a sounding-board for the pastor and offers input and advice on various issues that relate to the life and wellbeing of the parish. Issues may be brought to the PPC by the pastor, members of the PPC, or other parishioners. The PPC is drawn from a cross-section of the parish and provides the pastor with a collective wisdom from which he can draw in the exercise of his pastoral leadership of the parish. Thank you to those who have agreed to serve on the PPC for this year (* including three new members).

Your Gift, God's Hands Offertory Report



Last weekend, the Saturday 5pm Mass remembered all those who have died and have been in our prayers during this past year. While all Masses include prayer for the faithfully departed, the universal Church directs her thoughts especially towards them each year on November 2.

Deacon Phil Gianatasio reflects: "One of the ideas that is expressed in the Order of Christian Funerals deals with the unique relationship each person has had with the deceased. Our relationship with the deceased has not disappeared but rather has changed. We can still communicate with the person who has died; we are still connected. We can pray to God for this person. We can share whatever we want to, like seeking advice, or just how much we still love them. Every time we gather as a community for Mass, there is an opportunity for us to pray for all those who have died. Here at St. Francis Xavier, the liturgy of the All Soul's Day Mass is especially focused on loved ones of parishioners who have died in the past twelve months. It is our hope that, gathered as community, we are all comforted as we grieve with the pain of loss. It is our hope that through prayer, our new relationship with our loved ones will strengthen our relationship with Jesus himself until we are all in God's kingdom."








St. Francis Xavier Peace & Justice Event Stateville Calling Documentary & Discussion November 10, 2024 3:00-5:00pm Unity Hall (between the Church & School)

We will show *Stateville Calling*, a 50 minute documentary exploring parole reform and the struggle of aging inmates in Illinois followed by a discussion with Bill Ryan and Arkee Chaney.

Bill Ryan is a resident of Plymouth Place, who has spent the last several decades befriending and advocating on behalf of a group of men and women incarcerated for life, helping to abolish the death penalty in Illinois, publishing a newspaper written by prisoners, and ceaselessly negotiating with victim's advocates, legislators and lobbyists from both sides of the aisle.

"Art saved me" said Arkee Chaney about his 33 years in Illinois prisons. Arkee had been sentenced to life without the possibility of parole (LWOP) after being convicted of stealing \$110 in three different burglaries. While incarcerated, Arkee met Dr. Margaret Burroughs, the founder of the DuSable Museum and a volunteer art teacher at Stateville Prison. Dr. Burroughs encouraged Arkee's natural artistic ability. He began painting regularly in his cell and soon was teaching others to create art as well. Eventually the Illinois Prison Review board recommended his sentence be reduced to time served, Governor Pritzker approved, and Arkee was released from prison. Having no living family members who were able to take him in, Arkee came to live with Bill Ryan for two years. During that time, he continued to paint and create ceramics, setting up in Bill's garage, which became his art studio. We will display some of Arkee's art.

The film illustrates the forces that created our system, and surveys the competing arguments and data points at play to equip viewers to decide for themselves what should be done about criminal justice in Illinois.




