

Pastor's Letter

Rejoice in the Lord always. Your kindness should be known to all. The Lord is near. By prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God.

Then the peace of God will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.

Philippians 4: 4-7

Rejoice! Joy dwells in the heart of Advent. Yet, joy requires that we *make room for it* in our heart and our home. Some will decorate with a Christmas tree of tiny lights reflecting off shiny ornaments. Others will decorate outdoor trees with popcorn strings and berries to attract and feed the birds and small animals. Colored and white lights brighten the night from the eaves and windows of houses. The rose-colored candle of the Advent wreath builds anticipation. Some families will set up a manger scene that awaits the arrival of the Christ Child. Christmas decorations need not be elaborate or expensive. A small tree set on a table, or a bowl of scented pinecones may be enough to awaken our sense of expectation and hope.

Saint Paul proclaims acts of kindness as a path to joy. They are available to us in many ways. We may choose presents for those we love or prepare gifts for a family with limited resources. We might gather to sing Christmas carols or offer a prayer as we light another candle on the Advent wreath. Many will donate or volunteer for a charity or deliver Christmas cookies to a homebound neighbor. Joy arises when we name and give thanks for the gifts and blessings in our lives and give forward by wishing the same for others. Advent joy leads to a peace that takes root in our hearts when we ask God for the grace to let go of any resentments or judgements that darken our thoughts. The added blessing is that Advent joy is meant to be contagious!

Peace and joy also are meant to be hallmarks of our holiday celebrations. That requires us to avoid sensitive or controversial topics or stories that are best left unspoken. This Advent presents special challenges after an election season in which politicians on all sides have labeled "others" as dangerous or "the enemy." Our children and young people are learning from our example even in those moments when we think they are not paying attention. We are teaching them by what we say ourselves and what we allow others to say in our presence. We offer them options when they see us politely changing the subject of conversation or objecting to harsh rhetoric. We offer them a positive response when we seek points of agreement that build harmony among family and friends.

Fr. Bill Stenzel, one of my mentors, increased my awareness of how addictions and dysfunctional behaviors in families can become especially problematic during the holidays. Each Advent, he published some guidelines for both using and serving alcohol at holiday parties. You will find those guidelines elsewhere in this bulletin. Alcohol can enhance our joy; it can also increase the tensions at a gathering when abused. This is a good time to be mindful of the limits of alcohol in enhancing a joyful moment. I became certified as an addictions counselor to be available to those who experience issues with alcohol or other substance abuse in their families. You know how to contact me.

The parish staff will have our annual holiday gathering this Monday afternoon. The parish offices will close at noon and reopen on Tuesday morning at 8:30.

Advent and Christmas are a time for joy. May the joy of God's love for us bless our hearts, our homes, and our gatherings in these days.

Reflection For the 3rd Sunday of Advent

Today we see that the Advent prophet, John the Baptist, lays the foundation for Jesus' teachings: to act honestly with each other and to share with those in need. All three of John's questioners are considered marginalized people as opposed to the religious authorities. John's responses teach justice and mercy on behalf of the poor and marginalized. This is how we prepare ourselves for the Coming of the Lord.



Calling all Shepherds and Angels

Our 3PM and 5PM Christmas Eve Masses on Tuesday, December 24th are especially for families with children. We ask that all children who are interested dress up as an angel or a shepherd to be a part of the Gospel Reading. Angels can wear white clothing or wings and a halo. Shepherds can wear a robe and tie a towel over their heads. You don't need to go purchase a costume, so just be creative and use materials you have in your homes. During the Gospel your children will be called forward to participate in the dramatization of the Gospel. We hope to see all of you at Mass.

OPLATKI

The Christmas Wafer (also known as "Oplatki") is available at the Rectory.

The word "Bethlehem" means "the house of bread." The breaking of the bread is a sign of charity, unity and friendship. Religious family customs bring the truths of faith into the home. One of these beautiful Christmas Eve customs is the Christmas Wafer. The thin wafer bearing the Christmas characters is broken by the head of the family and distributed to each member. With a simple



prayer for God's grace and the welfare of all members of the family, those present as well as those who are absent, the head of the house breaks the wafer and distributes it, one piece to each person at the table. While doing so, each member of the family is kissed and wished a joyful feast. Members then greet one another in the same way.

The spiritual lesson in this age-old custom is that the unity of the family is grounded in God's love for us. May you experience unity and love through this simple celebration.

PLEASE PARK WITH CONSIDERATION FOR OUR NEIGHBORS



We recently learned that some of our neighbors on Spring Avenue have had their driveway blocked by those attending Mass, stopping by the office, or dropping off/picking up school children. Please be considerate of our neighbors when parking on either Spring or Waiola Avenues. Even if you only intend to be parked for a few minutes, that may be the time that a neighbor needs to use their driveway. Your cooperation helps to make us a good neighbor.

HOLIDAY DRINKING GUIDELINES

1. Drink <u>only if you can</u>. If you have been told not to drink, or if you take medications that do not mix with alcohol, <u>don't drink</u>.

Just one drink can hurt you.

2. Don't drink more than <u>one drink per hour</u>. If you can drink more than this without feeling <u>any</u> effect, your body's safety controls may not be functioning properly.

A high tolerance for alcohol can be a sign of disease, which is <u>not</u> a good thing.

- 3. Don't drink if you "don't drink." Don't accept a beverage that you don't want.

 Not drinking is okay.
- 4. Alcohol and driving do not mix. If you plan to drink <u>without</u> moderation, **Plan how you will get home.**

HOLIDAY ENTERTAINING GUIDELINES

- 1. Never tell a guest, "C'mon. One drink won't hurt you. It's Christmas!"

 The calendar has no effect on the effects of alcohol.
- 2. Don't serve more than <u>one drink per hour</u> to your guests. Have food available. **Serve your guests responsibly.**
- 3. Don't give a hard time to a guest who "doesn't drink." "No thanks" is answer enough.

 Provide non-alcoholic refreshments and let your guests choose.
- 4. Hot coffee or cold towels make a person more awake but <u>not</u> sober. If a guest is drunk, <u>do not let them drive</u>. Take their keys, get them a ride, or let them sleep it off.

Drunk drivers can kill people.

Church Pipe Organ Opportunity

Dear Parishioners,

We are excited to share a unique opportunity to complete our beloved pipe organ at St. Francis Xavier. As many of you know, our pipe organ is a work in progress. Previous fundraising efforts funded most of the initial installation. Between 2003 and 2022, we received donations that allowed us to install all but one of the components in the original design for the organ. These components were not included in the initial installation due to the need to allocate capital funds to replace the boiler that heats the entire campus. We are sharing this history openly with our community to ensure transparency in our history and our future plans.

The final component to complete the organ is the Trompette Royale, a distinguished addition to the Great 8' register. This component will amplify our music ministry and provide an inspiring sound experience for our community. The total cost to finish the organ, including all preparations and installation, is \$122,000.

If we are able to raise at least \$100,000 in commitments from our parish family **by December 31, 2024**, we can sign a contract to install the Trompette Royale and complete our organ in its full glory. Note that we are asking only for a commitment at this stage; please do not send any funds until we confirm sufficient support to proceed.

Those interested in committing to this meaningful project should email us at **organ@sfxlg.org**. Once we determine that we have enough pledges, we will provide further information to finalize the funding and begin work. The installation process, led by Berghaus Pipe Organ Builders, includes new electro-pneumatic chests, winding, a reservoir, and a blower. The Trompette Royale will be housed in the original organ chamber, and enhancements, including advanced expression controls, will allow for a nuanced, beautiful sound quality across all registers.

Thank you for considering this important request. With your support, we can enrich our worship experience for generations to come.

Reaching out in service to others is a foundation of our SFX community. Mary Freeman, our Director of Outreach, oversees the parish service efforts, leading hundreds of volunteers to "Do God's Work in our World." One of the ways is through our service to refugees and migrant families as we respond to calls to "Welcome the Stranger."

Mary shares: "Six years ago, Sr. Marlene Schemmel, CSJ connected us to Exodus World Service, an organization that partners with Catholic Charities and other agencies to provide support to refugees who have resettled in Chicagoland. Over those years, St. Francis Xavier has been a beacon of hope! We have hosted two Refugee Journey Simulations for parishioners and students to educate, engender empathy and inspire action on behalf of local refugees. Volunteers have delivered 12 care packs to families from Afghanistan, Columbia, the Congo, Rohingya, Rwanda, Syria and Venezuela. We are scheduled to deliver two more welcome packs in January, 2025." According to an Exodus rep, "we're incredibly grateful for local partners like St. Francis Xavier Catholic Church and School of LaGrange. Your compassion and dedication are truly inspiring. Thank you for the amazing work that you are doing to create a community where refugees can find friendship and belonging."



Mary also noted that "In the past year, Grace Lutheran and BEDS Plus have reached out for support for four migrant families they are sponsoring. Through your generous donations to our Thanksgiving and Holy Thursday collections last year as well as our Food Pantry Ministry and Giving Tree outreach, we have been able to offer support for these families' necessities. In addition, several parishioners are accompanying a few families through regular visits to offer support, guidance and a friendly face to help them feel less alone. None of

this is possible without the support and willingness of our faith community to live out the gospel as missionary disciples!"


