Pastor's Letter

"Father, forgive them, they know not what they do." Luke 23:34

Jesus has been kept awake throughout the night. He has been questioned, accused, and physically abused. He was brought before Pilate, then to Herod, and then back to Pilate as the civil authorities debated what to do with Jesus and the angry mob that had gathered. He was scourged, and a crown of thorns is pressed onto his head. He was sentenced to death and forced to carry the crossbeam of the cross on which he would be hung. He was made to walk through the crowded streets of Jerusalem as some cried, others jeered, and others went about their preparations for Passover. Stumbling up the hill of Calvary outside the city gates, Jesus was stripped of all but a loincloth, nailed to the crossbeam he had carried, lifted above the onlookers, left to die a slow and painful death.

Jesus is exhausted and thirsty. He feels shame of his nakedness and hears the taunts of those who think they have silenced him. Yet it is <u>at this moment</u> that **Jesus forgives** his persecutors. When he hears the plea for mercy of a criminal who has been crucified near him, Jesus assures the man that they will be together in paradise. Then Jesus quietly surrenders his spirit to the Father.

In the hours that lead to his death, Jesus gives his most powerful witness. <u>Forgiveness</u> is the path to freedom of spirit, no matter the offense that is being forgiven. God is with us in our hour of need, even if our pain makes it difficult to feel God's presence. Through our own pain, we can bring healing and comfort to others who seek mercy. The Cross is not the defeat of God's Beloved Son; the Cross is God's victory over sin and death – the worst death the world had to give. This symbol of fear and domination has been forever transformed by God into a symbol of hope and transformation.

We who have been participating in the Lenten series on the parish Hallow app have been challenged to understand that moments of suffering can deepen our faith when we invite God to journey with us. We can find great freedom when we surrender our spirits to God in trust rather than attempt to control everything through a false sense of our own power. God's presence <u>always</u> leads to life. This is a message we are sent to bring to those who are suffering. We are sent as *missionary disciples* to bring comfort and healing as we journey alongside those who struggle.

What will be our witness to others as we move through <u>this</u> Holy Week? Do we proclaim Christ crucified and God's victory over sin and death as a reason to have hope? Will we choose to be present to the self-giving of Jesus, both in the Eucharist and on the Cross? Will we proclaim to those who suffer, who despair, or who feel abandoned that **God is at their side** <u>in this moment</u> and at every moment. Will we choose to be companions on <u>their</u> journey with Christ, through his passion to new glory?

Many parishioners offer their time and talent through the music, environment, proclamation, and coordination of our services on the three holiest days of the Church year and the Easter morning that follows. **Join us** to the extent you are able. **Invite your family, friends, and neighbors** to join us for the celebrations of Easter Sunday. Be ready and willing **to make room. Welcome** the visitors, the travelers, and the seekers whom you encounter in your "regular" seats. Help them to feel welcome among us.

A CALL TO HELP SEMINARIANS IN NIGERIA FROM FR STAN ILO

Since 2015, 145 Nigerian priests and seminarians have been kidnapped with 15 killed and 4 still missing. The socio-political and economic situation in Nigeria is very troubling and painful. Poverty and suffering are widespread. Religious persecution of Christians is on the rise and churches and houses of formation have become soft targets. According to Vatican News, Nigerian Christians are the most persecuted group in the Western African sub-region. It is becoming increasingly difficult to feed seminarians and maintain the houses of formation in many dioceses affected by this situation. Most of the food is supplied from Northern Nigeria, some parts of which are ungovernable spaces. We appeal to our brothers and sisters at SFX to support the Church in two dioceses in Nigeria to meet the challenges of feeding the seminarians and keep the houses of formation open and secured to guarantee the future of the Church's pastoral agents

Last October in the annual report, we set forth our plan for a break -even budget, contingent on an offertory increase of \$110,000 (or 6%). Through the first nine months of this fiscal year, our offertory increased by \$77,000 (5.6%) - amazing! Thank you to all who demonstrate your commitment to the mission of St. Francis Xavier Parish through your financial support.

This month, the holiest days of the church year begin on Holy Thursday, April 17 and continue for three days. In Fr. Bill's pastor's letter on March 30 this year, he asks us...

- 3. When we gather in the dark to welcome the new light of Resurrection at the Easter Vigil?

While the questions above are most importantly of a spiritual nature, attending services with our SFX community is a beautiful way to demonstrate our mutual commitment to *Belong, Believe, and Be Love*. And so, for #1 and #2 above, on behalf of the parish staff, I invite everyone to join us on Holy Thursday and Good Friday in our church on April 17 and 18. Open your heart as the Holy Spirit fills you with the awesome deed which the Son has done for you! And of course, for #3, we look forward to seeing everyone at the Easter Vigil on April 19 or Easter Sunday morning on April 20!

Good Friday Holy Land Collection

This Jubilee Year is designated as a Year of Hope. Indeed, hope is a necessary virtue in a land marked by cycles of violence and relative calm. Gaza itself has been reduced to rubble. Missiles have hit many other places as well. People across the region are tasked with rebuilding homes, schools, hospitals, and even churches. Many of our faithful earn their living from pilgrimages. Still repaying debts from the pandemic shutdowns, they found themselves soon assaulted by war. Now, already in debt, many have again lost jobs. Fear and despair have driven many Christians to leave the Holy Land: over the past century. Christians have gone from 23% to less than 2% of the population. And more than 90 Christian families have already left Bethlehem since October 7, having lost hope in a good future for them in the land where Jesus and the Church were born.

Let us foster hope in our brothers and sisters who strive to remain in the land where the Son of God dwelled among us. How could we allow the land where Jesus Christ walked and called people to follow him become a place without a local Church?

As you know each year the Holy Father asks every Catholic parish around the world to take up a Collection on Good Friday to keep a Christian presence in the Holy Land. This year, help is needed more than ever. The Collection supports the work of the Franciscans in the sacred shrines, ministers to the parishes, provides formation and education in communities and schools, and cares for the basic needs of people in the Holy Land. During such a difficult time, where we must rebuild not only buildings but so many broken lives, your promotion of this important collection is essential.

The Feast of Mercy or Divine Mercy Sunday has been celebrated in many countries, dioceses and parishes for many years. Pope John Paul II, the Cardinals, Bishops and Priests who have read the diary of St. Faustina have come to appreciate the significance of this feast. But now, ever since the Holy See had decreed that the "Second Sunday of Easter would be known as Divine Mercy Sunday," many more are seeking to go more deeply into the words of Our Lord to St. Faustina that were meant for all humanity.

Pope John Paul II in his homily at the canonization of Sr. Faustina on April 30, 2000 said: "Jesus shows His hands and His side. He points, that is, to the wounds of the Passion, especially the wound in His Heart, the source from which flows the great wave of mercy poured out on humanity".

The image of Jesus, The Divine Mercy, is to have a special place of honor on the Feast of Mercy, a visual reminder of all that Jesus did for us through His Passion, Death, and Resurrection...and a reminder, too, of what He asks of us in return—to trust Him and be merciful to others.

The Eucharist is the "Fountain of Life". The Eucharist is Jesus, Himself, the Living God, longing to pour Himself as Mercy into our hearts.
