Pastor's Letter

They reported what God had done. Acts 14:27

Luke recounts the end of the church's first missionary journey. Paul and Barnabas return to the community that had sent them on their mission and share the news of what God has done.

Thirty years ago, this parish sent me out on mission. I returned in 2015 and in 2017 became the tenth pastor of St. Francis Xavier Parish. In between, I served as administrator for a parish that was dealing with the removal of their pastor due to allegations of sexual abuse that were deemed credible. I was named the second pastor of a young parish that was learning how to become a parish of two languages and three predominant cultures. I next served as pastor of a parish that was seeking deeper unity amid a diversity of language, culture, and opinions on what it means to be church.

Each assignment required things that I had learned from you all. We are the Body of Jesus, a communion in Christ formed from our willingness to listen to one another, to appreciate differences, to be sensitive to hurts and vulnerabilities, and to trust that all is possible when we allow the Spirit to dwell among us.

I have been supported and enriched by a staff of women and men who collaborate with one another to serve the vision and needs of this parish. I have been guided by the perspectives of parish leaders through their generous offer of time and talent. Thirty years ago, you restored my love for priesthood; over the past ten years, you restored my love of pastoring. God has done great things for, with, and through us. I have no doubt that you will be as much a blessing for Fr. John as you have been for me. I look forward to hearing the stories yet to be lived.

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

In just two short weeks we have said goodbye to our beloved Pope Francis, entered a time of uncertainty and now have a remarkable event to celebrate as Catholics, Chicagoans and people of good will. The fact that more than 130 cardinal electors from more than 70 countries could come to a decision in less than 24 hours is a clear sign of the unity, so needed in a world torn by division and conflict.

Many here know Pope Leo XIV as Robert Prevost, a classmate, friend and neighbor. Our pride in him as a native son is exceeded only by our pride in his service to the People of God and to our Church.

A missionary. Pope Leo knows firsthand the needs of those at the margins and holds them close. We expect he will carry on the regard for the poor so associated with Pope Francis but will lead us and teach us in his own way. His choice of name recalls Pope Leo XIII who defended the dignity of workers at a time when concern for their rights was scarce. This earlier Pope Leo, generally considered the father of Catholic social teaching, placed our church firmly in the world, speaking against injustice and for peace. As wars and discord continue and some deny human dignity with their words and deeds, such a voice is clearly needed.

I hope you will take a minute to say a prayer of thanksgiving to the Holy Spirit who surely was with us in this time. Let us rejoice that he has once again given us a Holy Father who will represent our values boldly and lead us to greater closeness with Jesus.

Know that I am deeply grateful for the prayers you offered for the repose of the soul of Pope Francis. The outpouring of condolences, including from people of other faith traditions was remarkable. His example of a happy death was his last gift to us. It is my wish that people of the Archdiocese of Chicago and beyond now offer their prayers for Pope Leo XIV as he takes up the work of lighting the world with God's love.



Our Mass is the heart of our FAITH. Our Parish School and Religious Education students are ONE IN COMMUNITY as they participate, by grade level, in Mass together each month from September through March. At each of these Masses we had six students from our Parish School and six students from our Religious Education Program engaged as lectors, commentators, gift bearers, and ushers. Many others were involved in the Parish Children's choir. These liturgies were child-focused, and the children's lectionary was used for all the readings so that it was easier for the children to understand the Word of God in their terms and to feel the love of Jesus. Each Mass was a wonderful monthly gathering for our SFX children, with beautiful and lively Masses.

This year we also introduced offertory envelopes to our students, and they were asked to bring them weekly to Mass and especially to these Children's Masses. Children were asked to write ways that gave of their time and talent during the week or month to give as their offering at Mass, and some even put in their own monetary donations, too.

Elis Guidice, our Director of Religious Education and Sacramental Prep shares: "These Masses have helped our students devote time to prayer with their peers, families, and their parish community. Through these Masses they are learning about the different ministries they can continue to be a part of as they grow in the Church. I am always in awe of our students who get up at the ambo and lector or sing; this is not something easy to do, not even for adults, yet our SFX Parish School and Religious Education students made it look so easy. I am proud of all of our students and the time and talent they put forth in our Parish Grade Level Masses this past school year."



We are pleased to announce that registration for Summer 2025 is now open. As you may know from previous announcements, SFX is partnering again with Grace Lutheran for this summer's VBS program. The VBS program will run June 23-27 (Monday-Friday) from 9:00am-12:00 noon. VBS is open to children aged 4 through 4th grade. 5th and 6th graders can participate as members of a "service crew" that will spend the week organizing and conducting a series of service projects.

The little ones will attend VBS at Grace Lutheran. The service crew will be based at SFX school this year. Due to space constraints attendance will be capped at 150 for the little ones and 30 for the service crew so please register early.


