Pastor's Letter

Dear friends in Christ,

This Monday our nation observes the birthday of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., a man whose faith in God shaped his tireless work for justice, dignity and peace. Dr. King did not simply dream of a better society. He believed, deeply and prayerfully, that God's purposes for humanity are rooted in freedom, truth and love. His life reminds us that Christian discipleship is never passive. It calls us to moral courage, perseverance and hope, even in the face of suffering.

Just weeks before his death, Dr. King preached a powerful sermon at Washington National Cathedral. In that sermon, he spoke of a people who endured slavery, injustice and cruelty, yet refused to surrender their faith in freedom. Again and again he proclaimed, "We shall overcome," not as wishful thinking, but as an act of trust in God's enduring justice. He reminded his listeners that while the struggle for justice is long, it is never meaningless.

Dr. King famously said that "the arc of the moral universe is long, but it bends toward justice." That arc does not bend on its own. Rather, it bends because women and men of faith choose truth over fear, mercy over hatred, and love over violence. Dr. King believed that God is always at work: sometimes quietly, sometimes through courageous voices, making all things new.

As Christians, we hear in Dr. King's words an echo of the Gospel itself: God's promise of a new heaven and a new earth, where justice and peace embrace. On this national holiday may we give thanks for his witness, and may we recommit ourselves to being participants in that "newness" he proclaimed by working, praying and living so that the beautiful symphony of justice, fellowship and peace may be heard in our own time and place.



The 2025-2026 school year at St. Francis Xavier kicked off with an addition on the 3rd floor... the New STREAM Lab! STREAM (Science, Technology, Religion, Engineering, Art, and Math) gives students an opportunity to have hands-on experience in a modern lab setting.

What truly sets this lab apart is incorporating Religion into the curriculum. By doing this, we are demonstrating that God is present in our everyday learning. This curriculum includes designing challenges based on bible stories, creating faith-based problem-solving scenarios, and presenting challenges that connect to Christian values.

The plans had been in the works for several years. According to Amy Ryan, Technology Coordinator, "One goal was to encourage innovative thinking with our students and expose them to different ways of learning. The 3D printers and laser cutter were chosen for this space to allow our students an opportunity to think about their learning from a new perspective."

The lab is a flexible student-centered design that can be rearranged to suit the needs of different projects. It also features interactive touch panels, a robot pathway built into the floor tiles, and lab tables that encourage collaboration. These unique elements will allow the program to grow as education changes.



To complement this state-of-the-art lab, a new curriculum has been incorporated that aligns with the Next Generation Science Standards. Students in kindergarten through eighth grade have the opportunity to explore a variety of units, including simple machines, coding basics, and ecosystems. Sam Lovera, the STREAM instructor, says, "A STREAM lab is designed to support and extend what scholars are already learning in their regular classroom, not replace it. We know how important it is for students to apply concepts hands-on, which improves overall understanding and retention."

Ministry of Care is Planning to Expand

A Minister of Care is a person who brings the gift of the eucharist and friendship to fellow parishioners and others who are homebound, living in nursing homes, or recovering in the hospital. Our visits help those in need stay connected to the parish and our faith community.

It's a very rewarding ministry and I promise you will receive more than you'll give.

The time required varies depending on the activity you choose. Perhaps a few minutes or more on a homebound visit to an hour or so conducting a Prayer and Communion Service or bringing the eucharist to those in the hospital. Those visiting the homebound schedule visits convenient for the minister and the person being visited. Nursing homes and the hospital have fixed schedules.

The Archdiocese requires new ministers to receive 12 hours of instruction prior to being commissioned. After training, you will “shadow” other ministers to learn about your chosen activity. When you are comfortable, you’ll receive a quarterly schedule.


