


Pastor's Notes

You were chosen in power, and in the Holy Spirit, and with much conviction.

1 Thessalonians 1:5

Our call to discipleship is anything but a passive one. St. Paul reminds us that the Spirit enters our hearts and minds and community with power and conviction. What we say and what we do, as individuals and in communion, is intended to be guided and often driven by the Spirit that was breathed upon the church after the resurrection of Christ. Yet this same Spirit speaks and acts through our diverse gifts and perspectives, which lead to a challenge when applying the Gospel and Church Tradition to specific issues and individual decisions. This challenge is no more apparent than in an election year, when the lines of separation of church and state often become blurry.

This month we are reflecting on the implications of nurturing a culture of life from conception throughout life on this earth until natural death, including the created world that God has entrusted to our care. This weekend we look to what sometimes is referred to as "the place between the dash" on a grave marker: throughout life on this earth. Affirming and protecting the dignity of each human person in the space between conception and birth and natural death is not always easy. The effort may demand much of us, including our willingness to listen to one another's viewpoints in discerning what is possible to uphold the dignity of each human life at any point in time. We must confront issues of poverty, domestic and civil violence, immigration, racial and economic injustice, social and educational barriers to growth, just labor conditions and a just wage, access to adequate health care, and many others. We Catholics, including our bishops, will not always come to similar positions as to how The whether to act. divergence perspectives grows even wider as we enter a conversation with other Christians, our Jewish and Muslim sisters and brothers, and people of other religions or no religion at all.

As an advocate for the dignity of human life, am I willing to open my mind and heart to listen to the Spirit speaking through diverse perspectives, some of which disagree with my own? Am I willing to seriously consider the teachings of the gospel and the church, especially when they challenge my personal preferences? Am I willing to develop and nurture a moral conscience that may, at times, lead me, as an individual, to a different path because God is calling me to do so? And do I respect the truth that God might do the same in the lives of those whose decisions or lifestyles do not "conform"? In civil society, do I advocate for human dignity and accept that no one program, policy, or party will ever perfectly reflect the demands of the gospel, and that we always will be working toward better and more comprehensive solutions?

Election years are challenging moments for people of faith. We advocate for the dignity of each person, knowing that we can only strive for better responses and that we never will achieve perfect solutions on earth. That is why it is so important that we listen to the Spirit speaking through each of us, especially the person of faith whose views seem so different from my own. In this way our convictions give voice to the power of the Spirit, and we raise and protect the dignity of all human lives on the earth.

Prevent the flu: Get vaccinated every year

With COVID-19 also affecting our community, the flu vaccine is more important this year than ever. Influenza, commonly called "the flu," is a viral infection of the respiratory tract that may cause symptoms very similar to those of COVID-19.

Everyone six months of age and older should get a flu vaccine every season.

Flu vaccine is provided at many local health departments, private health care providers and pharmacies across Illinois. Contact your health care provider to find out which flu vaccine is right for you or you can

find vaccine locations at **vaccinefinder.org**.

Most people who get the flu recover completely in one to two weeks, but some people develop serious and potentially life-threatening medical complications, such as pneumonia.

Over the past decade, influenza and pneumonia have been linked to an average of 3,500 deaths a year in Illinois.

Between 10 and 20 percent of Americans are infected during most flu seasons, which typically run from October through May.

More than **200,000 people** are hospitalized by the flu each year in the U.S.

Symptoms of flu include:

- Fever
- Headache
- Extreme tiredness
- Dry cough
- Sore throat
- · Runny or stuffy nose
- Muscle aches
- Stomach symptoms, such as nausea, vomiting, and diarrhea also can occur but are more common in children than adults.

Emergency Warning Signs

Seek emergency medical care if you or someone you know is having any of the following warning signs below.

need urgent medical attention include:

- Fast breathing or trouble breathing
- Bluish skin color
- Not drinking enough fluids
- Not waking up or not interacting
- Being so irritable that the child does not want to be held
- Fever with a rash

In children, emergency warning signs that In adults, emergency warning signs that need urgent medical attention include:

- · Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath
- Pain or pressure in the chest or abdomen
- Sudden dizziness
- Confusion
- Severe or persistent vomiting

Seek emergency medical care if you or someone you know is experiencing any of the signs above.

Dear Quest teens, parents, and leaders,

Come, Holy Spirit! We are so grateful for your patience as we navigate Quest logistics amidst COVID-19. We have been thinking long and hard about how to make Quest the most **life-giving** and **Spirit-inspired** program it can be for our teens as they prepare for the sacrament of Confirmation — an amazing sacrament that truly has the power to **transform our lives and the world** when we receive the gift of the Holy Spirit sincerely.

We are pleased to announce that **Quest will begin in**November – in-person and virtually according to teen and parent comfort levels. For in-person meetings to occur, Quest groups must have unanimous consensus on meeting in-person (amongst both the teens and the parents.) Each teen and parent will also sign an agreement not to attend in-person if they are ill. Groups of about 10 teens will meet **once a month** and will **set their own meeting dates/times**. All families who have registered for Quest will receive a survey to ensure that the groups formed share similar expectations and comfort levels regarding in-person or virtual meetings.

Domestic Violence Outreach



Who Are the Victims?

¹Twenty-five percent of American women and eight percent of American men will experience domestic violence at some point in their lives. Children are very often witnesses and victims themselves.

This statistic does not include the vast number of unreported incidents of violence.

There is no evidence that the prevalence of domestic violence is any lower within faith communities.

What is Domestic Violence?

²Domestic violence (also known as spouse abuse, partner violence, intimate-partner violence, battering, and numerous other terms) is a pattern of coercion used by one person to exert power and control over another person in the context of a dating, family, or household relationship. The spectrum of domestic violence includes much more than physical assault. Domestic violence encompasses a constellation of controlling behaviors that include:

Actual or threatened physical harm, psychological abuse, and forced sexual contact; Economic control; Social isolation; Destruction of a victim's property, keepsakes, or personal possessions; Abuse of animals/pets; Misuse of divine beings or religious beliefs, practices, teachings and traditions as well as asserting male superiority and attributing abusive behavior to cultural traditions.

These behaviors can occur in any combination, sporadically or chronically, over a period of up to several decades.

Most victims of domestic violence are women in heterosexual relationships. Men in heterosexual relationships can also be victims of domestic violence, in addition to both women and men in same-sex relationships. Regardless of culture, race, religion, or socio-economic class, approximately 90 percent of reported domestic violence cases involve men who abuse women.

Recognizing Anxiety in Men - In some men, anxiety can manifest in less recognized ways. Anxiety disorders are one of the most common mental health issues, estimated to affect close to 20% of Americans in a given year. But not everyone is affected equally—research consistently shows the number of women diagnosed with anxiety disorders is about double that of men. Researchers have yet to definitively determine the causes of this discrepancy, but anecdotal evidence and clinical experience suggests that some men respond to anxiety in ways that can cause it to be misinterpreted or else missed entirely.
