

Pastor's Notes

After Jesus was baptized, he came up from the water and behold, a voice came from the heavens, saying, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased".

Matthew 3:16,17

The infant of Luke's gospel became the child of Matthew's gospel and now is the adult about to begin his ministry. An ancient tradition celebrates three distinct events as the "epiphany", manifestation, of Jesus as the Son of God: the arrival of the magi bearing gifts; the baptism of Jesus in the Jordan River; and the first miracle of Jesus as the wedding in Cana. The liturgical season of Christmas concludes with the second epiphany, the Baptism of Jesus. Matthew tells nothing of the life of Jesus from the time of the magi's appearance until now. We can presume that Joseph apprenticed him as a carpenter and that this was how he supported his mother after the death of Joseph. As far as we know, Jesus neither said nor did anything of note during these years, which sometimes are referred to as the "hidden years." This suggests that Jesus lived an ordinary human life for his first thirty years. He worked and he played; he succeeded at some things and failed at others; he developed friendships and learned the traditions and practices of his faith; he experienced illness and loss, the tensions of living under Roman occupation, and the judgments of people from the south that Galileans had compromised their religious practices through mingling with surrounding cultures.

We do not know what prompted Jesus to go to the Jordan on this particular day. We are told, however, that when he stepped into the Jordan waters and was baptized by John, a voice came from the heavens to proclaim him as God's beloved Son. Perhaps the voice of the Father is spoken as much for the sake of Jesus as it was for those who witnessed the moment. God affirms the call that


Jesus has been sensing in his mind and heart. After a period of reflection in the desert, Jesus enters boldly into his ministry, proclaiming the kingdom, choosing his first disciples, and setting forth, in the Sermon on the Mount, the path for those who choose to follow him.

Most of us are infants when we are baptized into Christ. As with Jesus, we live an ordinary life until some point at which God breaks into our lives and calls us to use our gifts and become the presence of Christ for others. Perhaps you can identify the moment at which you made a conscious choice to live out your baptismal call. Perhaps you cannot identify that moment or may not yet have even experienced it. Today's feast challenges us to accept the call of our baptism. We are reminded that each of us is a beloved child of God in whom God delights. Each of us has been given a way to make God present to others. Each of us is called up from the waters of the Jordan to proclaim God's kingdom, to invite others to join us, and to teach and encourage one another, through word and example, to follow the path that leads to life in God.

As we close the Christmas Season, I again thank our Art and Environment ministers, who brought Christmas splendor to our house of worship; our Music Ministry members, who delighted us with glorious and joyful sounds; and our many other liturgical ministers who planned, proclaimed, and otherwise served us in these special days. Many visitors to our worship in recent weeks commented on the welcoming spirit of those who worship here. You all created a warm home where the light of Christ shone brightly.

The best opportunity of the year to support Catholic schools

To increase the funds available for tax credit scholarships*, several donors partnered to create a **matching gift pool**. Every dollar donated to this program through the scholarship granting organization Empower Illinois between Dec. 1, 2019 and Feb. 29, 2020 and designated to a school operated by the Archdiocese of Chicago will be matched with two dollars from this pool (limitations apply). The program will end when all matching funds have been depleted or on Feb. 29, 2020, whichever comes first.

Example: A taxpayer donates \$2,000 to Empower Illinois through the match program. The taxpayer will be eligible to claim a \$1,500 tax credit when he/she files their previous year's taxes. The donation creates \$6,000 in scholarship support (after the \$4,000 match). For the net cost of \$500 (\$2,000 donation less \$1,500 tax credit), this donor will provide a student with a \$6,000 scholarship to attend a Catholic school of his/her choice.

^{*}The Illinois tax credit scholarship program provides a 75 percent state income tax credit to individuals who contribute money to fund scholarships for students from low-income families to attend private schools. Eligible students may use these scholarships to attend a non-public school of their choice, including the more than 200 Archdiocese of Chicago Catholic schools in Cook and Lake counties.

Children's Liturgy of the Word

Our Saturday evening 5:00 pm Mass offers the opportunity for children in Grades Kindergarten-Fourth to experience hearing and reflecting on the Word of the Lord in a way that is an empowering experience. Children in these grades are invited to follow their Reflector of the Word to a prayer space away from the gathered assembly to hear the Scriptures in words they can understand.

Children's Liturgy of the Word takes place in church whenever the children's choirs lead us in song/prayer AND when a Grade Level Mass is celebrated. The Scriptures we hear will then be taken from the Children's Lectionary and the homily will be given in a way that children are able to relate a little more readily. The children in Grades K thru 4 will go to their prayer space on the Saturdays that the choirs are not singing and when a specific grade is not scheduled to celebrate liturgy at the 5:00 Mass.

Here is the tentative schedule with the children's choirs: January 25; February 29; March 14.

Here is the schedule when a Grade Level Mass is celebrated: February 1 & 8; April 18.

Children in Grades K–4 will be invited to join their Reflector in a prayer space away from the adults and to hear the Word of the Lord in words they can better understand on the following Saturdays (subject to change): January 11 & 18; February 15 & 22; March 7, 21 & 28; and April 28.





Who benefits from blood donation?

At Versiti Blood Center of Illinois, formerly Heartland Blood Centers, we never forget the patients who receive the blood we collect. Every unit of blood is collected from volunteer donors who meet specific criteria and have been screened according to strict guidelines. Every unit (pint) is collected, transported, tested and stored according to tightly-controlled procedures.

Examples of transfusion needs are:

• Cancer: up to 8 units/month

• Bone Marrow Transplant: up to 2 units/day

• Liver Transplant: up to 100 units

• Auto Accident: up to 50 units

• Cardiovascular Surgery: 2-25 units




Parish Counselor


