Pastor's Notes

*"This is the time of fulfillment.
The kingdom of God is at hand."*

Mark 1:14

What does it mean that God's kingdom is "at hand"? The first followers of Jesus understood this to mean that Christ's coming in glory would happen at any moment. Hence St. Paul calls us to live without attachments to the things of a world that is "passing away." Over time, it became clear to the early Christians that the end of the world as we know it was not imminent. So, what did Jesus mean when he proclaimed the kingdom to be "at hand"? Did God change his mind? Was Jesus wrong? Has God abandoned us?

These are questions many may be asking amid the crises and tensions of the moment; they are made more real to us by 24-hour news reports and ever-present (though not always factual) social media. We who choose to be disciples of Christ cannot "know" the answers, any more than did Peter, Andrew, James, and John when they abandoned their nets on the seashore to follow Jesus. *We pray* for God's kingdom to come into our world, and *we believe* that, one day, it will indeed come into this world in its fullness. But what did Jesus mean when he proclaimed that God's kingdom **is** at hand?

Jesus came to plant the seeds of God's kingdom among us. God's kingdom *is* here, growing among us. *We are called* to nurture its growth through our attitudes, words, and actions toward one another. *We are commissioned* to reveal God's kingdom to others as God works in and through us to transform our world. *We are sent* to be agents of transformation in our families, communities, and society in the ways we respect one another and show a special care for the poor, the vulnerable, and the suffering. **God's kingdom is here, at hand, within and among us.** Will we respond to the call of Jesus to reveal the presence of God's kingdom to those most in need of its hope?

Every priest of the Archdiocese is asked to

engage in a periodic evaluation of his ministry. This evaluation has taken various forms over the years, always inviting parishioners to participate in some manner. The current evaluation tool of the Archdiocese, the Catholic Leadership 360 Review, is directed by an independent, national group. As part of this process, I have been asked to submit the names of at least 15 parishioners whom I believe can provide an honest and accurate evaluation of me and my ministry as priest and pastor. In addition, any parishioner who wants to participate in this process is invited to do so via a separate, online parish-wide survey. In this bulletin you will find a letter from our Vicar, Bishop John Manz, that tells you how to participate. You also can go to <https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/englishsurvey-2020-2021> or use the Quicklink on the parish website. Surveys must be submitted no later than February 23. At the end of the process in late April or early May, I will provide you with the insights that I gained from this process and my development plan for the remaining years until I retire.

May we all be messengers and witnesses that **the kingdom of God is at our hands**, if only we work toward its realization in our interactions with one another. May we all be an instrument of physical, emotional, and spiritual healing at a time when our world feels wounded and broken. Let us leave behind on the seashore all that would weigh us down and follow Jesus.

Support the Collection for the Church in Latin America

Near the Colombia–Venezuela border, Venezuelan emigrants and refugees present the Church with an urgent need for pastoral and material support. In response, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' Subcommittee on the Church in Latin America worked with the human rights office of the Archdiocese of Caracas, Caritas Venezuela, and the social justice ministry office of the Colombian conference of bishops to organize a January 2020 pastoral visit to programs serving refugees. During the visit,

bishops and ministry leaders from Venezuela and Colombia met to assess and to raise awareness of the crisis in both countries.

Your support for the Collection for the Church in Latin America allowed the subcommittee to award an emergency grant of \$10,000 to support humanitarian aid to migrants in the Diocese of Cúcuta in Colombia in February 2020. Located on the border, the Diocese of Cúcuta is a primary point of entry for fleeing Venezuelans who migrate to and through Colombia. In 2018 and 2019, the diocese was awarded three grants totaling \$125,000 from the collection to assist with its migrant outreach programs. However, in 2020 the need became unprecedented.

By early 2020, two diocesan welcome centers for migrants were providing thousands of meals daily. What was once a parish initiative had become a systemic diocesan effort to support the growing number of migrants in need. This emergency grant provided a much-needed supplement to ensure that the programs continued. By supporting the Collection for the Church in Latin America, you help local parishes address the immediate pastoral and material needs of these vulnerable refugee families. This review process is part of the ordinary structure required by Archdiocesan Policy of every diocesan priest approximately every five years. It is an opportunity for Fr. Tkachuk to recognize his talents and to grow to become a better priest and pastoral minister. Selected members of the parish staff and parish leadership, your Dean, and myself will be asked to be reviewers using this instrument.

According to Archdiocesan policies lay leadership and parishioners are to be given the opportunity to recognize Fr. Tkachuk's gifts and to share their sentiments about his ministry. So, we are providing a parish-wide survey as part of his review process. The survey can be easily accessed by going to the Archdiocese's web page (<https://www.archchicago.org/>) and clicking on Offices and Ministries on the top panel. This will bring you to an alphabetical listing of offices. Under 'M', select Ministerial Resources for Parishes. You will then be directed to the Ministerial Resources for Parishes webpage. In the middle of the page, you will find "Parish-wide survey review for priests". The survey is available in English, Spanish, and Polish. Please click on the work 'Link' next to your appropriate language to access the survey.

If you have any concerns or comments pertaining to Father's review, feel free to contact me directly. If you have any further questions or suggestions about the review process you may contact Fr. When the Catholic Leadership 360 Review process has been completed Fr. Tkachuk will be asked to share the insights he has received and his further developmental plans with you in the parish bulletin and on the parish web site.

As noted above, our offertory budget of \$1,643,000 anticipates an operating deficit of \$148,000. Typically, we set our collections budget to break even with expenses. However, with the restrictions in church attendance, we did not expect our collections to be at normal levels. This is evidenced in the graph above, whereby our collections to date are lower than the previous year at this time. The Payroll Protection Loan covered parish and school payroll from April until June, enabling us to conserve the offertory received during that time to cover the deficit with parish savings if needed.

Please note that our offertory through December is higher than where we expected to be at this time – every extra dollar reduces the anticipated operating deficit. God bless you for your stewardship of St. Francis Xavier Parish – we are so very grateful for your continued support through this pandemic!


