

Pastor's Notes

Jesus went to live in Capernaum, in the region of Zebulun and Naphtali.

Matthew 4:13

Matthew places Jesus in a specific geographic location when Jesus calls his first disciples and begins his mission. While the names of these places mean little to us, they are an important detail for the Jewish Christians for whom Matthew writes his gospel. Jesus begins his ministry in the northern territories of Israel, which will cause the religious authorities in Jerusalem to challenge the authenticity of his mission. In the history of Israel, Jerusalem and the southern territories had avoided the invasion of "outsiders" during most of its history. Even when conquered by neighboring peoples, the people of the southern territories felt that they had kept their religion pure by resisting intermarriage or other mingling with foreign peoples or customs. In the northern territories, however, invasions lasted for much longer periods of time; intermarriage and the introduction of foreign customs was much more common. Those in Jerusalem felt it unlikely if not impossible that the Messiah would come from the northern territories.

What might keep us from recognizing the presence and action of God in our time? What prejudices, known or hidden, might cause us to fail to accept the words or actions of an individual, culture, or peoples as "coming from God"? Our nation continues to suffer the effects of limiting the speech and action of people because of their gender, the color of their skin, their religious preference, or their socioeconomic status. Too often these same biases have been reflected in our gatherings to worship and in our Church institutions. How are we being

challenged by Christ this day to open our minds and our hearts to his presence and action in this time and place?

We live in a time when some would divide us into opposing groups that could not possibly be reconciled with one another. In whatever way we label these groups, Jesus might have come from any one of them and called his disciples from all of them. In truth, Jesus is to be found in all of them, as are his disciples. Do we ask God's help to free us from the blindness that cannot see Christ in the face of the "other"; or the deafness that will not hear Christ in the words of the "other"? Can we experience another without regard for the "region" from which they come?

This Sunday morning, the staff and children of our parish elementary school invite you to come and see a bit of what happens in our education building on weekdays. We are blessed by the sacrifice and dedication of our teachers and staff. They and the families they serve are grateful for the ongoing support of Catholic education as a key part of our parish mission. Founded by the Congregation of St. Joseph over 100 years ago, St. Francis Xavier Elementary School continues its proud tradition of offering an excellent academic education and faith formation to all families who seek this for their children. All of us are blessed to be able to make this possible.

The best opportunity of the year to support Catholic schools

To increase the funds available for tax credit scholarships*, several donors partnered to create a **matching gift pool**. Every dollar donated to this program through the scholarship granting organization Empower Illinois between Dec. 1, 2019 and Feb. 29, 2020 and designated to a school operated by the Archdiocese of Chicago will be matched with two dollars from this pool (limitations apply). The program will end when all matching funds have been depleted or on Feb. 29, 2020 whichever comes first.

To take advantage of the matching gift program, follow the steps at empowerillinois.org/donors. For additional information, contact the Archdiocese of Chicago's Tax Credit Scholarship Office at tcs@archchicago.org or 312-534-2617.

*The Illinois tax credit scholarship program provides a 75 percent state income tax credit to individuals who contribute money to fund scholarships for students from low-income families to attend private schools. Eligible students may use these scholarships to attend a non-public school of their choice, including the more than 200 Archdiocese of Chicago Catholic schools in Cook and Lake counties.

Example: A taxpayer donates \$2,000 to Empower Illinois through the match program. The taxpayer will be eligible to claim a \$1,500 tax credit when he/she files their previous year's taxes. The donation creates \$6,000 in scholarship support (after the \$4,000 match). For the net cost of \$500 (\$2,000 donation less \$1,500 tax credit), this donor will provide a student with a \$6,000 scholarship to attend a Catholic school of his/her choice.






First Look for Charity February 7



Who benefits from blood donation?

At Versiti Blood Center of Illinois, formerly Heartland Blood Centers, we never forget the patients who receive the blood we collect. Every unit of blood is collected from volunteer donors who meet specific criteria and have been screened according to strict guidelines. Every unit (pint) is collected, transported, tested and stored according to tightly-controlled procedures.

Examples of transfusion needs are:

- Cancer: up to 8 units/month
- Bone Marrow Transplant: up to 2 units/day
- Liver Transplant: up to 100 units
- Auto Accident: up to 50 units
- Cardiovascular Surgery: 2-25 units




