Pastor's Letter

Jesus went up the mountain,... and his disciples came to him. He began to teach them.

Matthew 5:1

The next four Sundays begin Matthew's collection of the teachings of Jesus known as The Sermon on the Mount, which extends from Chapter 5 through Chapter 7. St. Pope John Paul II included this sermon in the Third Luminous Mystery of the Rosary, which recalls the proclamation of the kingdom of God. Peter, Andrew, James, and John have been joined by a large crowd of those drawn by the miraculous healings that Jesus has been performing throughout Galilee. These teachings will cause some to walk away from a path that will seem too extreme, asking more than they are willing to give.

Jesus begins with the proclamation of the eight Beatitudes. He blesses the poor in spirit, the mourners, the meek, those hungry and thirsty for righteousness, the merciful, the clean of heart, the peacemakers, and the persecuted. His first disciples find some of these easy to understand; but they are challenged to understand how others such as the mourners and the persecuted are blessed. Jesus proclaims a kingdom whose virtues are not of this world and that sometimes overturn the values of this world. His way will not always be an easy one to follow; it requires sacrifice and identification with those whom the world will often despise or discount. For Jesus himself, it will lead to resurrection and new life, but only through suffering and death on the Cross.

What does Jesus challenge within <u>us</u> as he proclaims as blessed the mourners, the meek, the clean of heart, those who hunger for righteousness and those persecuted for its sake? What is our "growing edge" in coming to embrace the attitudes of those working for God's kingdom? Each of us may have to admit that we are challenged to embrace and live by at least one of these attitudes. The disciple is not one who understands all the teachings of Jesus; rather, the disciple is one who admits that they are still coming to understand but willing to continue to learn and walk the road with Jesus. The missionary disciple is one who tells the stories of what they have come to understand in their own experiences, while confessing that there is much more that they are still coming to embrace. We are learners on the way.

This year, the seasons of Lent and Easter interrupt this section of Matthew's gospel; we hear only the first half of these teachings. I encourage us all to set aside some time to read through *all* that Jesus proclaims in these chapters. As did those who gathered to listen that day, we continue to learn the way of the disciple and take it to heart.

This weekend marks the beginning of **Catholic Schools Week**, when we celebrate our commitment to provide a Catholic school education for all who seek it. St. Francis Xavier Elementary School has a proud history and an ongoing commitment to an excellent education in the context of our Catholic values. Our two National Blue Ribbon Awards attest to our academic excellence. Our practice of daily prayer in the classroom and the school, our incorporation of religious education in Religion class and within other subjects, and the values and behaviors taught and expected of our entire school community provide additional support to parents in growing as a Catholic family. Take advantage of the opportunity to experience our parish school by attending the **Open House this Sunday** between 10:00 AM and 12:30 PM.

COME GROW WITH US!



St. Francis Xavier School celebrated its 13th Annual Service Day in honor of our patron saint. "God's Work, Our Hands" was the theme for the day and this really set the tone for what we did as a school community. This year students were able to experience Service Day in its traditional format and travel throughout the Chicagoland area in service to others.



Nearly 200 parents help plan and execute the day – thank you to each and every one of you! We would also like to acknowledge all of our partnering organizations, many of which have been with us from the program's inception. This program could not exist without their generous partnership. A list of where our students were called to serve can be found below.



Pre K 4: took a tour of the SFX food pantry and learned how it is currently serving approximately 130 families, representing about 400 individuals each week. While there they learned about the mission of the Pantry, thank you Mrs. Freeman for having us. During collections week PK4 gathered and sorted 200+ non-perishable food items and delivered them to the Food Pantry. By gathering and helping with their little hands they cared for God's Creation.



Kindergarten: The Kindergarten class is learning about Caring for God's Creations. We adopted a polar bear named Hope for the year. We made 40 polar bear ornaments and met at the Brookfield Zoo with our families to decorate the SFX Kindergarten tree. We also got to see Hope while visiting the zoo. The donation of the tree provides many needed resources to all of God's creations at the zoo. Students went to the Palos Children's Farm and acted out a Nativity with real animals, sang Christmas carols and saw many of God's creations.



1st Grade: went to Bethlehem Woods to meet with our Older Friends for snacks, bingo and caroling. We made and distributed 22 blankets to residents there, we sang 7 amazing Christmas Carols with the help of Ms. Faris, played Bingo with 20 friends and made 41 Christmas cards!



2nd Grade: went to St. Catherine & St. Lucy Elementary School in Oak Park to do a joint Service Project with the students there and they together made 53 Christmas wreath ornaments to donate to The Mission of Our Lady of the Angels in the West Humboldt Park area of the City. They will give these wreaths out to the food pantry customers during the holiday season. They read a book with SCSL children which was donated afterwards and played Bingo with their new friends. During collections Week 2nd Grade collected 52 lbs of White Rice and 74 lbs of Pasta! Thats about as heavy as two 4th grade children! All items were delivered to the Mission of Our Lady of Angels. When they got back to school they wrote Thank You Cards to their new SCSL friends!



3rd Grade: Went to Marillac House, on the West Side where they found out about the organization & programs, they observed the programs and met with the Outreach Team. At Marillac they sorted all of the donated items from collections week and brought these items across the street to the Outreach office. During Collections week 3rd grade collected for Marillac House: 45 Kids Coats + 42 Adult Coats & many hats, gloves, snowpants. 19 boxes of diapers, 12 containers of baby formula, 40 packages of wipes, 50 containers of baby food.




4th Grade & 7th Grade both went to Feed My Starving Children and packed 71 boxes, they made 15,336 meals. The work they did will feed 42 children for a whole entire year! In addition before they left, our 7th graders packed 70 personal care bags for our own SFX Food Pantry.



5th Grade: went to American Legion where they made 72 care packages for the patients and Veterans at Hines VA Hospital, wrote many many letters and thank you cards.



6th Grade: went to Suburbanite Bowl and bowled with 58 SEASPAR friends. 128 games bowled, countless high fives and endless smiles!


