

Pastor's Notes

"A light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel". Luke 2:32

Two elders, Simeon and Anna, are in the Jerusalem temple on the day Mary and Joseph bring their child to perform the Jewish presentation rites. Simeon is drawn there by the promptings of the Spirit; Anna, we are told, is a widow of six decades who has worshipped in the temple night and day. On this ordinary day, amid the comings and goings of hundreds of people, these two recognize the presence of God in the child of this humble couple. For Simeon, it is a promise fulfilled that allows him to rest in peace; for Anna, a prophetess, it is a prophecy fulfilled that she begins to proclaim to all who will listen. For everyone else, it is just another day.

How often does God become present to us amid the ordinary moments of our day? And how often do we respond to the promptings of the Spirit or set aside moments for prayer that we might recognize the presence of God within the seemingly ordinary? The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord challenges us to allow time and space to listen and to be present to the moment. Jesus, God incarnate, is present to the world in this moment. He seeks to be recognized in the ordinary moments and people of our seemingly ordinary lives. But, like Anna and Simeon, we must be open to the possibilities of encountering Jesus when and how we might least expect.

I offer thanks to the members of the School Advisory Board, teachers and staff, and the many volunteers who provided a morning of hospitality and information for all wanting to see what occurs with our Education Building Monday through Friday. And I echo the thanks of the families who spoke at the Masses last weekend for the support that all parishioners provide to the significant part of our parish mission. May we continue to be able to provide the option of a Catholic school education to all families in our area who desire this for their children


I also thank the officers and volunteers of the parish Catholic Women's Club for providing an opportunity for the women of the parish to gather for fun, shopping, and conversation. Thank you to all who offered some stewardship of time to step away from

the busyness of your lives and enjoy and build relationships with one another. We sometimes forget that God also is present to us amid laughter and celebration. I hope those of you able to participate caught a glimpse of God amid the fun.

Our Parish Finance Council recently completed a review of where the parish stands financially at the midpoint of our fiscal year. Thank you to all households that were able to increase your regular offering to support the mission and ministries of the parish following my appeal in October. The absence of an associate pastor and unanticipated absence of a pastoral associate have reduced our costs during the first six months: this has enabled us to show a midyear surplus even though regular Sunday offerings to date are below those of this period last year. All parishioners soon will receive more information on our finances in a midvear report to be sent out electronically. If you are a household already invested in the parish, I encourage you to spread the good news of St. Francis Xavier Parish; encourage your neighbors and friends to invest their time, talent, and treasure in our vibrant presence and mission. We need everyone to be engaged!



Bringing Children to Church

Few things are more important for family and parish life than bringing children to church for our Eucharistic celebration. God bless all of you who do this. This is the best way for them to experience our gathering as a community, our prayer of thanksgiving, and our being sent to do God's work in the world. It brings joy to our lives when you bring your children with you.

Of course, we understand that at times your youngest children may need a break from the relative confinement of a pew. Sometimes they get anxious and just need to get up and move around. For this reason, a camera in church "broadcasts" the Mass into Unity Hall, complete with sound, at all Sunday morning Masses. If your child needs a break, you can bring them to Unity Hall while remaining connected to the liturgy yourself.

The Eucharist is a profoundly sophisticated ritual; it requires time and patience to integrate into our lives. Look at how it has deepened over time in our own lives as adults! Your ability to get everybody up and moving in the same direction at the same time astounds us. We are sure that it pleases God! Thank you for your ongoing efforts.

Children's Liturgy of the Word

Our Saturday evening 5:00 pm Mass offers the opportunity for children in Grades Kindergarten-Fourth to experience hearing and reflecting on the Word of the Lord in a way that is an empowering experience. Children in these grades are invited to follow their Reflector of the Word to a prayer space away from the gathered assembly to hear the Scriptures in words they can understand.

Children's Liturgy of the Word takes place in church whenever the children's choirs lead us in song/prayer AND when a Grade Level Mass is celebrated. The Scriptures we hear will then be taken from the Children's Lectionary and the homily will be given in a way that children are able to relate a little more readily. The children in Grades K thru 4 will go to their prayer space on the Saturdays that the choirs are not singing and when a specific grade is not scheduled to celebrate liturgy at the 5:00 Mass.

Here is the tentative schedule with the children's choirs: February 29; March 14.

Here is the schedule when a Grade Level Mass is celebrated: February 1 & 8; April 18.

Children in Grades K–4 will be invited to join their Reflector in a prayer space away from the adults and to hear the Word of the Lord in words they can better understand on the following Saturdays (subject to change): February 15 & 22; March 7, 21 & 28; and April 28.

ST. FRANCIS XAVIER PARISH SCHOOL STRATEGIC PLAN UPDATE – JANUARY 2020

Drafting and adoption of the St. Francis Xavier Parish School Strategic Plan was the culmination of nearly a year of work, which began in 2017. Under the direction of Catholic Schools Management, the country's premier Catholic school consultant, the leadership of St. Francis Xavier School and Parish conducted a comprehensive examination of the school. The process included individual interviews, focus groups, and on-line surveys of hundreds of current and past parents, students, administrators, faculty, and parishioners. From this process, the Strategic Planning Committee identified four **Strategic Areas** of focus. We then set eight **Goals**, each with multiple **Objectives** and **Action Plans** to help us achieve the Goals and track our progress.

We focused initially on the goals and objectives that would enable us to make a strategic decision on whether to maintain an "East Campus" for our early learning programs. Completion of these objectives led us to bring all our students "Under One Roof" at the beginning of the current school year, with classrooms redesigned for our early learning programs on the first floor of our Education Building. We also restructured the School Advisory Board to make it more effective in advising and supporting school administration, with committees dedicated to Catholic Identity, Finance, Marketing, and Development. We have developed tools to help us project enrollment figures and anticipate future costs more accurately. Our faculty and administration have enhanced teacher skills in the areas of differentiated learning and the use of technology in the classroom. These areas have been enriched through professional development, curriculum and team planning. We continue to develop the Positive School Program to foster a learning environment that is consistent with our mission as a Catholic school.

All of this has required the time, dedication, and skills of both school staff and volunteers. We are blessed by their generosity. The Strategic Planning Committee of the School Advisory Board continues to coordinate Action Plans for the remaining Goals and Objectives. Stay tuned for future updates.






