

Pastor's Notes

If I do not have love... I am a resounding gong or a clashing symbol.... I am nothing.... I gain nothing.... Love rejoices with the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never fails. 1 Corinthians 13:1.2.3.6-8

Love is the life breath of the Spirit in and among us. The love of God's Spirit inspires us, stretches us, frees us, challenges us, and binds us to one another in a bond that is stronger than death. We first know love as we develop as preconscious, vulnerable persons within the womb of the woman who gives us birth. Most of us who are members of the St. Francis Xavier Parish community experience love in the comfort, encouragement, and physical, emotional and spiritual nourishment of our childhood family. We experience the flashier sparks of love in teen crushes and early romances. We come to know the love of which St. Paul speaks as we grow and mature over decades. This love reveals to us the deepest parts of who we are and allows us to see the best in others. This love is the lifeblood of the significant commitments of our lives and carries us through the moments when we fail or are tempted to walk away. This love inspires the saints among us to do "small things with great love" that transform lives and systems. This love discourages us from the gossip or judgment or partisan thought that would set us at odds and *en* courages the patience and forgiveness and kindness that strengthens our connections.

The love of God's Spirit is offered to us as gift. Yet it challenges us to consider new ways of thought and being with one another. Those in the Nazareth synagogue on the day Jesus proclaimed his mission to "bring glad tidings" could not open their minds and hearts to the possibility that God's love could dwell so deeply in one they thought they knew well as "the son of Joseph." How often do we fail to recognize God's love in the one we think we know too well to consider that possibility? In fact, do we see the Spirit of God's love alive in each person, especially in those whom we are tempted to discount as ordinary or unimportant, or whom we judge as unworthy or sinful? Love never fails. All that can fail is our willingness to let God's love live in and through us.

Last weekend we all were invited to explore what happens inside the walls of our education building when it operates as St. Francis Xavier Elementary School. Five school families and one former school parent and teacher spoke of how living stewardship through their involvement in the parish school community has enriched the faith lives of their family. This week the School Advisory Board asks parishioners to consider a special contribution to our mission to make a Catholic school education available to parish families who seek this for their children. Thank you for the many ways parishioners support this mission. Our investment continues to bear much rich fruit.

Scripture Reflections

Living our baptismal call can at times be challenging. In our head, we know very well what is expected of us as Christians on life's journey. We can name the qualities that would be a good job description of being a Christian. The description is pretty generic: A good Christian is loving, caring, and shares resources with those in need. We do that very well. We teach our children to do that through example and encouragement, and they do it well. We make sure the food pantry gets stocked, we make meals for B.E.D.S., we visit the sick, we take up collections of both monetary and basic necessities for those in need. The list can and does go on and on. We do it well!!

I can recall the look on my students' faces years ago, when I ended my discussion question with....."And I want more than the generic answer." I can still remember the student who said to me..."What do you mean by that?" I responded with..."Tell me more than, loving, caring, or sharing, because that's a given. To be a follower of Jesus means we will love, care, and share. I challenge you to live beyond the given." Hands didn't go up as quickly as usual, but a good discussion followed based on the challenge.

I believe that's what St. Paul was talking about when he wrote the familiar words we hear in today's second reading to the Corinthians. Some people may refer to this reading as a "feeling good" scripture reading. But just as Paul was challenging the Corinthians some 2,000 years ago, we are faced with the same challenge today. Paul was challenging the Corinthians and getting on their case because Jesus' law of love that he commanded was far from what some of them were living. Jesus law of love is sometimes far from what we live. Sure it's easy to say I need to show love to others, I need to care for others, I need to share with others. We all know that and can do the generic part very well in word and in action. But what about the challenge we hear today? How can we be stretched to live Jesus' law of love so that:

> Love is patient, love is kind. It is not jealous, it is not pompous, it is not inflated, it is not rude, it does not seek its own interests, it is not quick tempered, it does not brood over injury, it does not rejoice over wrong doing but rejoices with the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never fails.

What do you think? Are we willing to get stretched beyond the given a little more and live up to this challenge?





Tax Reform and Charitable Giving

In December 2017, Congress approved the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act, which led to the most far-reaching changes to the tax code in more than 30 years. Taxpayer ability to take itemized deductions is subject to certain limitations. As a result of this tax code change, SFX has seen an increase in donations from donor-advised funds in the past few months as parishioners adjust their giving strategies.

Other strategies that could help taxpayers maximize the benefits of the new tax laws on charitable giving include:

- If you are age 70½ or older, consider making a taxfree gift to SFX through an IRA charitable rollover.
- If you have experienced gains in the financial markets this year, consider donating appreciated securities to avoid paying capital gain taxes.



Moving Through the Energy of Grief






Palestinian Film Screening and Discussion


