#### Pastor's Notes

"Jesus told them, 'Let us go on to the nearby villages that I may preach there also. For this purpose, have I come.'" Mark 1:38

After a day of curing the sick in Capernaum, Jesus wants to move on. The disciples had expected Jesus to become the town healer, drawing others to their town in search of him. Jesus reverses their expectations. He has not come for people to seek him out. His mission is *to seek out those in need* of the healing he brings. It is not to any one specific community, but to all.

The *Annual Catholic Appeal* calls us to reach beyond our community and support the broader mission of the Church. In part, the Appeal supplements an annual parish assessment, through which each parish provides ten percent of its ordinary income to support Archdiocesan services in areas including elementary and religious education, employee benefit programs, and legal and personnel services. The Annual Appeal asks those with available resources to supplement these funds, and to support Catholic Relief Services, which provides emergency assistance on a global level. I encourage you to participate in the Annual Catholic Appeal to the extent that you can. Remember that all funds contributed beyond our parish goal will come back to the parish, and provide additional support for our own mission and ministries.

**Renew My Church** is an Archdiocesan initiative begun by Cardinal Cupich several years ago. Parish resources in many parts of the Archdiocese have been struggling to cover the cost of essential parish staff and ministries; the number

of available priests and certified lay pastoral ministers also has declined significantly. Renew My Church has grouped parishes that serve common geographical areas and populations. Over the next five years, groupings will come together to discern how best to use available resources in their area. In some cases, this will mean shared or collaborative ministries, such as youth ministry in the parishes that serve Lyons Township. In other areas, several smaller parishes will be served by one pastoral staff better to allocate resources in service of their shared mission. In yet other areas, existing parishes may be closed or consolidated under a new name; they may maintain several worship sites. All discernment and decisions will begin at the parish grouping level and ask local communities how best to "be church" in their area.

St. Francis Xavier has been grouped with St. Cletus and St. John of the Cross Parishes. We do not yet know when we will begin the official Renew My Church process. However, some members of our staff have begun conversations with their peers on the other two staffs; our youth and RCIA programs already serve collaboratively. And parish leaders will soon be encouraged to begin conversations with their peers. Our challenge is the challenge Jesus presents to his first disciples: to see our mission as reaching beyond the walls of our church and the boundaries of "our" parish; to reach out to others rather than to wait for them to come to us.

### **Scripture Reflections**

The gospel...gives us a snapshot of a typical day in the public ministry of Jesus—He cures diseases, He casts out demons, He teaches, He goes off to pray. Notice that He stays in Simon Peter's house, is concerned about the people who live there and in response to hearing of her ailment, heals the mother-in-law of Peter. Saint Mark also tells us that, "The whole town was gathered at the door." The townspeople may not have fully known who Jesus was, but they did know that the hand of God worked in Him and through Him to bring healing and wholeness to everyone.

Today, the Church as the community of Jesus' disciples who responds to his call: *Come, Follow Me* continues His mission and ministry in our time and in the world where we live. ... Every day, I am inspired and encouraged by the talent, commitment, and generosity of people I meet in our parishes and agencies. Together, we are pioneering new ways to be missionary disciples of Jesus in a world that is so desperately in need of healing and hope. ... More than ever, we are civic and social, contributing to the good of society through our anti-violence initiatives, school choice for all parents, and our advocacy on behalf of human dignity from conception to natural death. We are redoubling our efforts to do even more and fulfill the call of Pope Francis to go to the margins of society and be a field hospital that brings the healing of Christ to a world in need of hope. All of this is possible because of the support we all give to the Annual Catholic Appeal.

I am asking each of you on this Commitment Weekend to help once again in making the Annual Catholic Appeal a success. If we all do our part, inspired by gratitude for how Christ has changed our lives, we can continue his ministry and change the lives of others and our world. I need your help and I am grateful for your sacrifice.





We show concern for our brothers and sisters in the community, especially the elderly and chronically ill, when we follow these simple guidelines to ensure a healthier winter for us all!






