

Pastor's Letter

<u>Making All Things New...</u> God's promise and our responsibility

Each year the Archdiocese of Chicago invites all people of the archdiocese to make a financial pledge to support the larger mission of the Archdiocese, both locally and globally. The past two weeks have been a time of initial confusion and gradual discernment following the archdiocesan decision to make masks optional in archdiocesan schools and parishes unless prohibited by local mandate. Our school provided a few days for teachers and parents to prepare our students and made masks optional this past Monday. Our parish response comes after our COVID Leadership Team has had time to consider our changes for the attendance at church services. Our revised protocols provide options both for those who prefer not to wear a mask and for families with young children, the immune compromised, and those not yet ready to worship in a masked optional environment. I thank the members of the parish team for their care and concern. I ask your support in our efforts to be one family in which members can make different decisions and in which all remain welcome. May we witness by example to those around us.

In honor of President's Day, the rectory will be closed on Monday, February 21. We will reopen on Tuesday, February 22 at 8:30 am.

Weekend Mass: A Home for All at St. Francis Xavier!

The Archdiocese recently revised its recommendation on wearing masks in church, allowing parishes to make masks optional. Parishioners with children too young for the vaccine and persons with compromised immunity issues for themselves or someone at home have asked us to provide an option for attending Mass in person. The parish COVID Leadership Team met on Tuesday to determine how to provide the safest possible environment for all who want to worship at St. Francis Xavier. We appreciate your patience in giving us one extra weekend to consider a plan that would be sensitive to the needs and preferences of all.

The following **changes** to our Sunday Mass protocols are in effect **beginning this weekend**.

- Masks are <u>now optional</u> at the <u>Sunday Masses 9AM, 11AM and 5PM</u>.

 Masks are <u>still required</u> at the <u>Saturday 5PM Mass and the Sunday 7:30AM Mass</u>.
- Masks are now optional at all daily Masses. Please allow appropriate distance if you are not wearing a mask.

We are **restoring the presentation of the gifts** from a table at the back of the center aisle.

Hand sanitizing is no longer required before receiving Communion. We encourage everyone to bring personal bottles for hand sanitizing. Spray bottles with hand sanitizer will be available in the front pews.

On Ash Wednesday, March 2, masks will be required at the 7:15 AM Mass and the 3PM Prayer **Service only.** All other Masses and services will be mask optional.

Decisions for Holy Week and Easter will be made after April 1 based on conditions at that point. **Thank you** for your continued understanding and patience.




