

Pastor's Notes

"If God is for us, who can be against us?"
Romans 8:31b

Two mountaintop experiences are set before us. In one, Abraham is about to sacrifice the son of the promise God made to him and Sara. On this mountaintop, he is willing to sacrifice his son if that be God's will. This story presents us with something impossible to consider. *How could God ask a father to sacrifice his son?* We cannot relate to Abraham's world, in which many religions considered human sacrifice a way to please the gods. For Abraham, it was not inconceivable that God would ask this of him. On the mountaintop, God responds to Abraham's willingness by praising Abraham's devotion and then clarifying that *God does not desire the sacrifice of human lives*. God asks only a willing heart that restores, rather than sacrifices, human life.

On another mountaintop, Peter, James, and John see Jesus transfigured and hear a voice proclaim Jesus as God's beloved Son. At the beginning of Mark's gospel, God proclaims this to Jesus. At the end of Mark's gospel, a centurion proclaims this to all who have witnessed the death of Jesus on the Cross. Here, in the center of Mark's gospel, God begins to reveal that God will make a sacrifice for our sake that he would not allow Abraham to make. God will allow humankind to crucify God's Son, so that in his death, we all will be saved. The disciples will not understand this until sometime after the resurrection. In time they will look back to this day, when God spoke to them of the depth of God's love and

willingness to destroy the power of death – whatever the cost to God. God, out of love for us, was willing to sacrifice more than God would ask of us. *If the God of love is for us, who can be against us* in any way we need fear?

This week we introduce a revised policy for accepting Mass intentions, effective this Thursday, March 1. We will limit the number of Masses for which we accept more than one intention to two per week. This is to comply with the policies of the Archdiocese and the universal Church. At the same time, we will begin accepting intentions for Sunday Masses, beginning on the weekend of April 7/8, 2018. We ask your patience and understanding as we transition to these new policies. All intentions that we already have accepted will be honored without change; and exceptions will be made for pastoral reasons. You can find more information elsewhere in this bulletin.

May our Lenten journey grace us with deeper trust in God, who is with us in times of joy as well as times of confusion, struggle, loss, and sadness. May our witness bring comfort and hope to others in a world so much in need of softer hearts and deeper love.

Scripture Reflection

Reflection for the 2nd Sunday of Lent Liturgy Planning Team #6 Susan Lindsay, Susan Nedza, Barbara Szulc, Marie Ann Barry and Susan Martin

The call of the Lenten gospel is a call to be transformed into a more hopeful, faithful and loving people. We see Abraham's faith as an example. Can we respond "Here I am?" Can we allow our faith to grow? After all, in the second reading we are told "If God is for us, who can be against us?" Can we be faithful to the love God showers on us? God speaks to us as well as to Peter, James and John when God says "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." Peter, James and John did listen: on the way down from the mountain, "questioning what rising from the dead meant." Do we listen? What does it mean to have faith? Do we contemplate the deep questions of our lives? How is the Lenten journey helping with that?

Lent 2018 Catholic Lenten Practices

Fasting and Abstinence

All Catholics 14 years of age and older follow the discipline of abstinence from all meat on Ash Wednesday and every Friday of Lent, including Good Friday.

All Catholics 18 years of age, but not yet 59 years of age, follow the discipline of fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. We eat only one full meal on a Fast Day and other smaller meals necessary to maintain strength and health.

Almsgiving

This traditional Lenten practice is associated with Fast and Abstinence. Money saved as a result of eating less or from "giving up" is given as alms to others who are hungry. CRS Rice Bowl or the St. Vincent de Paul Society are suggested charities for Lenten alms.

Prayer

During Lent all are called to renewal of our relationship with God through personal prayer. The community has opportunities for Lenten prayer as well:

Stations of the Cross

will be prayed at 8:20 am on Fridays

The Sacrament of Reconciliation

The Lenten Season of Repentance and Renewal is the most appropriate time for Catholics to confess sin and celebrate absolution.

REVISED PARISH MASS INTENTION POLICY

A long-standing Catholic practice has been to offer a Mass for the soul of someone who has died. Some also ask that a Mass be offered for a special intention, such as a birthday or wedding anniversary. Local policy recommends a \$10 donation, which the presider at that Mass receives as part of his income. If we accept additional intentions for any Mass, the additional donation is used to support parish ministries. Every parish is asked to accept multiple intentions for no more than two Masses each week.

We will begin accepting Mass intentions for 2019 on Thursday, March 1. To align parish policies with those of the Archdiocese, as of March 1, 2018 the parish office will accept new intention requests as follows.

- We will accept intentions for Sunday Masses as of the weekend of April 7-8. On a rotating basis, two Masses each weekend will be reserved as follows.
 - One Mass each weekend will be reserved for the "People of the Parish." Per Archdiocesan policy, no other intentions will be accepted for this Mass.
 - One Mass each weekend will be reserved for "Multiple Intentions." More than one intention will be accepted for this Mass.
- We will accept more than one intention for the *Monday 9:00 Mass each week*.
- We will accept only one intention for the remaining Sunday or weekday Masses.
- We will honor all multiple Mass intentions that we already have accepted.
- We will do our best to make exceptions for special circumstances, such as the anniversary of a death.

We appreciate your patience as the office staff transitions to these new procedures,

A few parishioners asked over the weekend why the American flag flying from our flagpole at Ogden and Spring had not been lowered to half staff. We realized that the parish had no procedure for responding to such requests at the federal, state, or local level. We have registered with a notification system to inform us when such requests are made in the future. We will respond to these requests whenever the appropriate staff is available to lower the flag, and then raise it again at the end of the designated period. As a reminder during cold and flu season, please remember to protect your health and that of others. Recommended steps include:

- * Be aware that others might not want to shake hands during the Sign of Peace or hold hands during the Our Father. They might be protecting YOU. Please don't attempt to force others to shake or hold hands against their will.
- * If you are not feeling up to par, but you are not sick enough to stay home, or if you are coughing or sneezing: please receive the Host in your hand, not on your tongue; refrain from receiving Communion from the cup; do not hold hands during the Our Father; do not shake hands or hug other people at the Sign of Peace a smile and nod of the head with the words, "The Peace of the Lord be with you" will suffice. Although there is no evidence that germs are transmitted in this way, your fellow communicants might be reluctant to receive.

We show concern for our brothers and sisters in the community, especially the elderly and chronically ill, when we follow these simple guidelines to ensure a healthier winter for us all!

The Presentation of the Creed, the Rite of Election, and the Call to Continuing Conversion

This Sunday, Feb. 25, the participants in the RCIA Process will move closer to receiving their sacraments. For the St. Francis Xavier group, the celebration will begin at the 10:30 am Mass, when they will be presented our Creed. Next, after Godparents, sponsors, RCIA Team Members and the assembly affirm that the catechumens and candidates are prepared to be admitted to the sacraments of Christian initiation, each will, as the rite states, come forward and inscribe their names in the Book of the Elect.
