They kept the matter to themselves, questioning what rising from the dead meant. Mark 9:10

Chapter 9 is the heart and center of Mark's gospel. We find this story of the transfigured Jesus, appearing in glory and conversing with two great figures of the old Covenant, Moses and Elijah. The disciples are overwhelmed and terrified by the experience and are at a loss for words. They have seen the glory of Christ in its fullness. Yet they also are shown a connection to two great prophets who each suffered because they followed God's call. They want to embrace the glory and their anticipated share in that glory. But Jesus has begun to tell them that he must suffer and die before rising to glory, and this part of the message they do not want to hear. They cannot accept that suffering is part of the mission and that Jesus must die before he can rise to glory. But they keep their questions to themselves, preferring to think that Jesus misspoke, or they misheard.

Isn't this true for most of us? We easily see and embrace the presence of God in the bright moments of life, even if we are at time overwhelmed by them. Yet we often struggle to "see God" in moments of discomfort, tension, or loss. We may ask why God has abandoned us, or question how any good can come from suffering and pain. We tire of snow and cold, masks and social distancing, and partisan bickering in politics and the church. We yearn for spring, yet it seems so far away. In *this* moment, what does "rising from the dead" mean?


The disciples silently question; yet, they continue to follow. They will not grasp the meaning of their mountaintop experience until sometime after the Resurrection. Still, they stay with Jesus even when they physically abandon him in fear on the day of his death. They open their minds and hearts to the presence of God in each moment, bringing life from death and assuring us that suffering and death will never have the final word. When were you last on the mountaintop with Jesus? Some women of our parish have been seeking him through the Women's Welcome Retreat in these days. Others seek him through private or communal prayer, small faith groups, or making space simply to sit with God. Mark tells us that Jesus will lead us to the mountaintop when we need and are open to receiving his reassurance. Here we learn anew that glory is not a path that avoids all suffering, but rather a path that transforms it into something life-giving through the loving power of God.

A word of affirmation to some of our volunteers. Despite several snowy and frigid Tuesdays, our Food Pantry served all the families that came to us by car and delivered to many more unable to get here by car for a variety of reasons. Art and Environment came in on one of those Tuesdays to prepare the church space for Lent. And our reopening volunteers made the time to support a series of funerals in recent weeks. Our facilities team shoveled more and more snow to make it all possible. (I hear they tried to pay off the groundhog a few weeks ago, but he refused to compromise his principles.)

Stay warm and be safe!

Imagine being Abraham who waited his whole life for a child. At a hundred years old, his son Isaac was eventually born. Imagine the shock and dismay Abraham felt when God asked him to sacrifice the very son he was given. How was he supposed to fulfill the promise of being the father of many nations without a child? Yet Abraham was obedient, trusting in God. God didn't let him down. He provided the lamb for the sacrifice and Isaac's life was spared. If you would like a priest or Minister of Care to visit, please contact the Parish Office directly. In the case of hospitalization, specifically request that the hospital contact the parish. Hospitals do not routinely inform churches of admissions due to Privacy Laws.

Marriage

Please call the rectory office at the time of your engagement to schedule your wedding. We ask that you are a registered parishioner for 6 months before requesting your wedding date. Saturday wedding times are 1:00 and 3:00 pm. Rehearsals are usually scheduled on Friday evening. We do not schedule weddings during Lent.
