

Pastor's Notes

Jesus did not need anyone to testify about human nature.

He himself understood it well.

John 2:25

I imagine that the Temple marketplace in today's gospel began with the best intentions. Faithful Jews came from throughout Israel and from many other countries to worship and offer sacrifice at the Jerusalem Temple. Since it was impractical to bring animals for the sacrifice from home, it was a gesture of hospitality to establish a common marketplace near the Temple. And since pilgrims often arrived from other countries without local currency; booths to change money were established. The noisy, crowded marketplace that Jesus encountered was not built in a day. It grew gradually over many years.

The bold actions and harsh words of Jesus call bystanders to realize that they have "adorned" their most sacred space with the concerns of this world. Profit drowned out prayer as merchants vied for customers and visitors bargained for the best deals. The Temple marketplace had become an enterprise unto itself at the Temple doors.

Jesus well understood human nature out of his own human experience. He had plied the carpenter's trade and learned to bargain and negotiate. He had seen how perspective could be lost, and priorities shifted. He knew that even the best intentions could lead people away from love of God and neighbor. Yet he also had confronted these human hungers and temptations in the wilderness and had come to a deep faith that *God alone* could satisfy our hungers and guide our hearts and minds to what is of lasting value.

What is the clutter in <u>my</u> life as I move through the "middle days" of Lent? What has crept into my life, perhaps

subtly and perhaps with the best of intentions, and now demands too much of my time and attention? What hides or leads me away from God's desires for me? How does Jesus invite me to "clean house" to place God at the center of my mind and heart? And what new life might I encounter this Easter Sunday if I just clear the ground of the weeds that get in the way of what God is growing in me?

This past week, the fourth grade children in our parish elementary school and religious education programs celebrated the individual form of the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time. This week, our second grade children will experience the communal form of Reconciliation with individual absolution. All have learned the truth that often we adults forget or struggle to believe: **God loves us and forgives us right away no matter what**. We come to Reconciliation not so that God will forgive us; that is a given. We come to the Sacrament to admit our need for and open our hearts to the grace of God's forgiveness. May we allow our children to remind us of the mystery of God's love for us and never fear to seek the grace of God's forgiveness through Reconciliation.

A Special Note. We have increased the number of reservation spaces for Sunday Masses from 100 to 110 to accommodate as many people as possible. This limits the number of people without a reservation whom we can admit, since our maximum seating capacity under the current protocols is 120. Please go to www.sfxlg.org or call the parish office to make a reservation for the weekend Mass you plan to attend and let us know if you will not be using your reservation. We will do all that we can to make room for all.

"I believe you." How many times have we said those words to someone? What they may be telling us may have no proof but we have confidence in them. We place our trust in what we hear. That is what believing involves. We have faith in their reliability and honesty. There may be some doubt but we brush that aside even though we might not be right in doing so.

Each Sunday at Mass and every time we begin the rosary, we say the following:

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, Our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell, on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there He will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen

It is our creed, our belief condensed into our prayer. Have we personally witnessed any of the things mentioned? But we BELIEVE what it says. It provides the tenets of our religion. It gives us reason to live our faith. It is our doctrine. It is the driving force which guides our conduct.

We believe because we have been gifted with God's grace and compassion and wisdom.

The St. Francis Xavier School Advisory Board is accepting applications for a three-year term on the Board. Wonder what it takes or how the process works? Below are some common questions people have about becoming a board member.

Common Questions:

- Do you need to have experience on a board or have a career in education? NO, you do <u>not</u> need to have prior experience on a school board or experience in education to apply.
- How much time is this commitment? We meet once per month plus 1-2 supplementary meetings each month. Expect approximately 6-8 hours per month.
- Do you need to have a child at the school to apply? NO, we encourage parent (guardian) of a Religious Education student, young adult parishioners and alumna/us of SFX. Candidates need not be parents.
- How does the application/selection process work? There is a one page application, a face-to-face
 meeting with the members of the Board and then the Board votes on the slate of applicants.


