

Pastor's Notes

"Whoever lives the truth comes to the light, so that their works may be clearly seen as done in God." John 3:21

We reflected on today's gospel at Monday's Parish Pastoral Council meeting; one person noted the harshness of Jesus' message to those who walk in darkness. After all, don't we <u>all</u> walk in darkness when we allow sin to rule our thoughts, words, and actions? Yet what Jesus says is that "the light came into the world, but people *preferred* darkness to light." Jesus is not addressing the sinner who turns to God for forgiveness. Rather, he is speaking about those who <u>choose</u> the path of darkness because they want to hide their evil deeds to look good; they are unwilling to humble themselves and step into the light of God's love. "For God so loved that world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." (John 3:16)

Over the past two weeks, our children in second and fourth grades have studied and celebrated the Sacrament of Reconciliation: through communal celebration with individual absolution in second grade; and through individual confession in fourth grade. I encouraged them all to memorize these words: "When I sin, God forgives me right away no matter what." I told them that as they grew older, they might forget or begin to doubt these words, especially if they have done something difficult to admit. But Jesus reminds us that God <u>already</u> has forgiven me. God does not wait for me to admit my sin, apologize, and ask forgiveness. I do these things to open my heart to God's forgiveness, which cannot flow through me until I acknowledge my need for it and am willing to step into the light. The role of the priest is not to scold or judge but to remind me of God's loving mercy.

This week, we offer two extra opportunities for individual Reconciliation: Thursday 5PM - 7PM; and Friday, after

morning Mass, 9AM – 10AM. Enter the church through the Spring Avenue door, where you will be asked to sign in with your name and a phone number or email address. Then go to either of the two Unity Hall doors, where Fr. Rich and I will be waiting. We will not see the sign-up sheet, so you can sit behind a screen if you prefer to remain anonymous. You have the option to view a virtual Reconciliation Service on the parish website before arriving. Use the **Lenten Opportunities** link on the main page.

Some decisions have been made regarding the Holy Week and Easter celebrations within the current COVID protocols. **Palms will be available** as you enter church for the **Palm Sunday Masses** (we will provide an alternate time and place for those unable to attend Mass). After the **Holy Thursday Service** at 7PM, the church will remain open for private prayer until 9PM. Services on **Good Friday** will be at 3PM and 7PM; all will use a simple bow to venerate the Cross this year. The **Easter Vigil** has been simplified for time concerns; yet we *will* baptize one adult and two children, receive three adults into the Catholic Church, and confirm all four adults. **Easter Sunday** Masses will begin on the hour every hour from 8AM through Noon in either the church (with livestream and Communion to Joyce Hall) or the gym. Registration opens this Monday, March 15.

To the Irish among us, **Happy St. Patrick's Day**. To the Polish, Italians, Russians, and those from other countries that honor the stepfather of Jesus, a **Blessed St. Joseph's Day**, especially in this year that Pope Francis has dedicated to St. Joseph.

Reflection for the Fourth Sunday of Lent

If we feel demoralized at this point in our Lenten journey, we are invited by today's readings to find again the source of new energy and encouragement. In the midst of the deepest darkness the true Light shines! Israel finds that God's designs will not be frustrated by their selfishness - the conqueror of the Babylonians sends them back to rebuild the temple. Paul announces to those who are in danger of losing their way the astounding truth at the center of our faith - God's free gift of new life in Christ: our redeemed humanity is God's 'work of art', we each have our part to play in the realization of God's great designs.

The words spoken to Nichodemus, by Jesus - the Light of the World - that all our darkness is dispelled! These words are perhaps the most quoted of the Gospels. Let us not take them for granted, but take them to heart and rejoice in the new life they bring: 'God loved the world so much that he gave his own Son, so that everyone who believes in him ... may have eternal life'. A world weighed down by the darkness and selfishness must know, Jesus says, that he came from the Father, not 'to condemn' but to bring reconciliation and life.





The St. Francis Xavier School Advisory Board is accepting applications for a three-year term on the Board. Wonder what it takes or how the process works? Below are some common questions people have about becoming a board member.

Common Questions:

- Do you need to have experience on a board or have a career in education? NO, you do <u>not</u> need to have prior experience on a school board or experience in education to apply.
- How much time is this commitment? We meet once per month plus 1-2 supplementary meetings each month. Expect approximately 6-8 hours per month.
- Do you need to have a child at the school to apply? NO, we encourage parent (guardian) of a Religious Education student, young adult parishioners and alumna/us of SFX. Candidates need not be parents.
- How does the application/selection process work? There is a one page application, a face-to-face meeting with the members of the Board and then the Board votes on the slate of applicants.
