

Pastor's Notes

"Unless a grain of wheat falls to the earth and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat." John 12:24

Jesus uses this image to teach his disciples about his approaching passion and death. He, the Beloved Son of God, has come into the world as God's presence in their midst to proclaim the coming of God's kingdom into our midst. Yet his mission will not be complete until he surrenders himself to death for our sake, trusting that the Father will raise him from death to new life. His glory will come; but not in the way his disciples expect. Life will be born from death; what appears to be the end will be rather the revelation of God's glory.

This same mission extends to those who would follow him. We are called to keep a loose hold on the things of this world. To the extent that we work to acquire and maintain wealth, status, or complete control over any part of our lives, we risk being unwilling to surrender these things in service of God's kingdom. To the extent that we hold loosely to that which is ours and consider all as gift, we become willing to place these things in God's service and our mission in Christ to reach out to those most in need. Our Lenten practice of giving alms invites us to be aware of what we have been given and seek ways in which we are being invited to share our treasure, in whatever form it takes, with those more in need than ourselves. In that separation from, that "dying" to, what lies in our grasp, we open our hearts to the fullness of who we may become in Christ.

How will I "give alms" in these final days of this Lent? There are direct links to the parish St. Vincent de Paul Society and Operation Rice Bowl on the main page of the parish website. The Stewardship tab on the parish page provides a link to several worthy groups that would benefit from your assistance. Perhaps your almsgiving will take the form of time given to visit a neighbor or relative who has been isolated by COVID-19, or an act of kindness toward a family member, friend, or stranger. May we all grow in trust that in our giving of ourselves in Christ, we are coming to new and eternal life in him.

Next Saturday, from 9:00AM until Noon, we offer one final opportunity for the **individual celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation** before Easter. Fr. Rich and I will both be in Unity Hall, which you can enter via the Unity Hall vestibule between the church and education building. I also encourage you to participate in the virtual communal service of reconciliation that you can access via the parish website. May these final days of Lent be a time of opening our hearts to God's healing love and mercy.

The reservation system for all Masses and services from Palm Sunday through Easter Sunday opened last Monday. We are not able to increase our seating capacity above 20%, so we have scheduled **five Masses for Easter Sunday**, including overflow seating in Joyce Hall for the three Masses that will be celebrated in church. Please make a **reservation for your immediate family only** and **for only <u>one</u> of the Easter Masses**. Please call the office if you find that you will not need all the seats you reserved. As more of our seniors become fully vaccinated, more parishioners want to attend each week. At Christmas, we had a significant number of "no shows" that limited the number of people who were able to attend. Your cooperation in helping us to seat as many individuals as possible is appreciated.

The St. Francis Xavier School Advisory Board is accepting applications for a three-year term on the Board. Wonder what it takes or how the process works? Below are some common questions people have about becoming a board member.

Common Questions:

- Do you need to have experience on a board or have a career in education? NO, you do <u>not</u> need to have prior experience on a school board or experience in education to apply.
- How much time is this commitment? We meet once per month plus 1-2 supplementary meetings each month. Expect approximately 6-8 hours per month.
- Do you need to have a child at the school to apply? NO, we encourage parent (guardian) of a Religious Education student, young adult parishioners and alumna/us of SFX. Candidates need not be parents.
- How does the application/selection process work? There is a one page application, a face-to-face meeting with the members of the Board and then the Board votes on the slate of applicants.


Are you and your youth interested in doing community service this spring? Volunteers are needed for the Spring **Food for Families** Drive in April.
