

## Pastor's Letter

*"This cup is the new covenant in my blood,  
which will be shed for you."*

Luke 22:20

Once more this year we wave blessed palms and celebrate Jesus as Messiah as he is welcomed in Jerusalem and “even the stones cried out.” Luke proclaims this triumphal entry two chapters before he begins his account of the Passion of Jesus. In the intervening verses, he relates the teachings of Jesus that will cause increasing enmity between him and the religious authorities. Jesus proclaims that *it is time for everyone to take a stand.* God is about to intervene in a way never before seen, and that will have consequences for those who refuse to accept what God is doing.

Luke writes his gospel some 40 years after the death and resurrection of Jesus. Jerusalem has been conquered and the Temple destroyed. The people of the promise appear to have been abandoned while those once called pagans have embraced the message of Jesus. Yet God never abandons us. The words of Jesus continue to call each person, then and now, into a deeper relationship with God, who acts in unexpected ways and who resurrects life from a cruel death. As Jesus hung on the Cross, Luke tells us that only some women from Galilee, some acquaintances, and a repentant thief were there to comfort him. His chosen Twelve and the other disciples had fled in fear. Yet, in three days, *all* will be invited into the joy of resurrection.

Each year we are invited to go deeper into the most profound mysteries of our faith, which lead to Easter joy. This Thursday, we celebrate the Supper that began the night before his death and that we enter each time we gather for Mass. This is the first giving of himself for us, his Body and Blood, in the bread and wine of the Eucharist. On Friday we remember the second giving of himself for us on the wood of the Cross. We give thanks as we humbly receive the gift of life that he gave us that day. On Saturday night, we celebrate new life in Christ through fire and water. We enter the empty tomb in darkness, and then joy. We welcome three women who have been journeying with us for many months and who will receive Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.

The mysteries of these three celebrations are the font of Easter glory. **We are a resurrection people in the Risen Lord!** We reject the notion that death is the end or that evil is more powerful than God’s grace. We bring our faith and hope to the people of Ukraine and countries in Africa and Asia that experience war and hunger. We embrace life in an empty tomb and then are sent to live lives of faith, hope, and service that invite others to know Jesus.

Next Sunday, we hope to welcome *many* parishioners who will rejoin those of us who have been gathering each week for most of the past two years. There is no need to make a reservation in advance this year. Unity Hall and the two Masses in the gym will accommodate the overflow. Masks will be optional at all services. The Masses in the gym may be the best option for those who still want to maintain an extra distance from others for any reason. Gather your family, invite your neighbors, and **join in the song!**

# Holy Week Has Arrived!

Join us for the MANY liturgies that we are holding here in our beautiful church on Wednesday evening and during the Triduum.

Katie Justak, a parishioner of SFX for the past 15 years, invites us to take time to experience the grace of Holy Week:

*Humanity. This is one word that comes to mind when I reflect on Holy Week, particularly during the Triduum. The solemnity of Holy Week allows us to not only reflect on Jesus's sacrifice but also to get in touch with our true, honest selves, our raw humanity, if you will. A time to make a conscience effort to slow down and examine our consciousness - how are we true to Jesus as we are called to be his disciple?*

*It's a lot to unpack in a week! This is why I make a greater effort to join a Bible study or prayer group during Lent. It prepares me for Holy Week as I learn more about Jesus, my Catholicism, and my Christianity. Now, do I have good old Catholic guilt to ask myself why I don't make a better effort to reflect and learn about our faith throughout the year? Absolutely! That brings me to my point, we are human. Throughout the year, our humanity may get the best of us - work, kids, school, family - life! While that is not an excuse, what we see in front of us every day may become more important and is prioritized ahead of what we cannot see - the Holy Spirit.*

*As I sat down to write this, I realized I hadn't read my daily devotion so I did. Jesus works in mysterious ways as the devotion aligned with my thoughts. It read:*

*"Trust ME enough to spend ample time with Me, pushing back the demands of the day. Refuse to feel guilty about something that is so pleasing to Me, the King of the universe. Because I am omnipotent, I am able to bend time and events in your favor. You will find that you can accomplish more in less time, after you have given yourself to Me in rich communion. Also, as you align yourself with My perspective, you can sort out what is important and what is not. Don't fall into the trap of being constant on the go. Many, many things people do in My Name have no value in My kingdom. To avoid doing the meaningless works, stay in continual communications with Me. I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go; I will counsel you with My eye upon you." (Luke 10:41-42; Psalm 32:8 - NASB)*

*Jesus sacrificed his life for us, for our salvation. Lent is a time, ending with Holy Week, that we show Jesus gratitude for his sacrifice by focusing on our relationship with Him, sharing with Him our true humanity.*

### A Service of Darkness



**Wednesday, April 13 - 7pm in the church**

Come and be a part of a beautiful tradition of the church dating back to the eighth century. This service, through music and scripture, portrays the final hours of our Lord's life on earth, as he suffered death upon the cross. Candles are extinguished one by one to symbolize the fading loyalty of the disciples and friends of Jesus. The complete darkness at the end of the service portrays the diminishing light of the world as Christ was departing from it.

## Triduum Morning Prayer

**Instead of morning Mass, on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday, a lay leader presides over Morning Prayer at 8:30am in the church.**

- ◆ Morning prayer is a part of the "liturgy of the hours," most often prayed by religious communities. It is a gift to help Christians mark time with prayer
- ◆ Alongside the Mass, liturgy of the hours is considered the "official prayer life" of the Church
- ◆ Liturgy of the hours is prayed all over the world in different languages each day
- ◆ Morning prayer is based on Scripture, especially the Psalms. A great way to "internalize" Scripture!

### 4/14 HOLY THURSDAY

**Hand or Foot Washing:** Due to COVID we can't do our traditional hand washing at the Holy Thursday liturgies, but you can wash each other's hands or feet at home! This is an especially intimate and beautiful reminder of how we serve each other as the hands and feet of Christ in family life.

**Watch *The Prince of Egypt*:** On Holy Thursday we remember the Last Supper and the Passover celebrated by Jesus with his disciples. *The Prince of Egypt* is a great animated movie for kids that depicts the origins of the Jewish Passover feast! And it's fun for adults too.

### 4/15 GOOD FRIDAY

**Stations of the Cross**

**Set an alarm for 3:00pm:** Pray together as a family at 3pm, the time of Jesus' death.

**Veneration of the Cross:** Join us to venerate the cross at 3pm or 7pm at the parish church, or venerate the cross at home as a family.

**Watch *The Passion*:** This movie is intense, not suitable for young children. It's hard to watch – but oftentimes helpful in recognizing the depths of Jesus' suffering and love for us.

### 4/16 HOLY SATURDAY

**Quiet Preparation for Easter:** Take this day as a day of quiet preparation for the feast of Easter. Prepare food, decorate eggs, clean the house, put up Easter decorations.

**Easter Vigil!** Join us via livestream at 8pm as we celebrate the Easter Vigil – we have three wonderful women entering the Church by Baptism this Easter!

## THE FEAST OF MERCY (Divine Mercy Sunday)



The Feast of Mercy or Divine Mercy Sunday has been celebrated in many countries, dioceses and parishes for many years. Pope John Paul II, the Cardinals, Bishops and Priests who have read the diary of St. Faustina have come to appreciate the significance of this feast. But now, ever since the Holy See had decreed that the "Second Sunday of Easter would be known as Divine Mercy Sunday," many more are seeking to go more deeply into the words of Our Lord to St. Faustina that were meant for all humanity.

Pope John Paul II in his homily at the canonization of Sr. Faustina on April 30, 2000 said: "Jesus shows His hands and His side. He points, that is, to the wounds of the Passion, especially the wound in His Heart, the source from which flows the great wave of mercy poured out on humanity".

The image of Jesus, The Divine Mercy, is to have a special place of honor on the Feast of Mercy, a visual reminder of all that Jesus did for us through His Passion, Death, and Resurrection ... and a reminder, too, of what He asks of us in return - to trust Him and be merciful to others.

The Eucharist is the "Fountain of Life". The Eucharist is Jesus, Himself, the Living God, longing to pour Himself as Mercy into our hearts.

## **Weekend Mass Continues to Move Forward**

Thank you to all who have been patient as we attempted to provide options for as many parishioners as possible while easing COVID protocols several weeks ago. Members of the parish COVID Leadership Team recently met to set a schedule for our next steps forward. We have made the following changes in how we celebrate our weekend Masses.

- ◆ **Hymnals** have been returned to the hymnal racks.
- ◆ The **pews** are no longer sprayed with sanitizer on weekends.
- ◆ The **inner doors** at the Ogden and west entrances will no longer be kept in the open position. (The inner Spring Avenue door needs repair.)
- ◆ The tape that restricts seating to every other row in the east transept will be removed.
- ◆ **Masks are required only** at the Sunday 7:30 Mass.

### **On Easter Sunday, April 17**

- ◆ **Masks will be optional at all Masses.**
- ◆ **Reservations will not be required for the Masses on Easter Sunday.** Once the church and Unity Hall have reached capacity at the 9:00 and 11:00 Masses, people will be directed to the 9:15 and 11:15 Masses in the gym.


