

Pastor's Letter

"Why do you seek the living one among the dead?

He is not here, but he has been raised."

Luke 24:5

Welcome to all who gather with us this Easter morning, whether in person or via livestream. A special welcome to those who are returning to us after the separation and isolation of the coronavirus and its many variants. It is a joy to see your faces and hear your voices in song. We are blessed to have been given the gift of one another.

What do we seek in the empty tomb this **Easter morning?** Or perhaps, what are the empty, seemingly lifeless places in your life, in your family, or in the way you experience the world? Easter is God's proclamation that there is nothing on this earth more powerful than the transforming power of God's love. seeming emptiness are voices that send us out from the empty tombs to see and hear more clearly what God is doing. We will not find resurrected life among that which speaks only of death, no matter how hard we seek. We must seek the living presence of Jesus in the signs of new life that are all around us. And if events or feelings in our hearts prevent us from recognizing these signs, we must ask Jesus to come to us through the locked doors behind which we feel trapped at times. Like the first we come together to find in disciples, communion what we may lack in isolation.

What witness do we bring to others as we go forth from the empty tomb? We are sent as witnesses of new life in Christ and the promise that God persists in raising life from the midst of what appears to be lifeless. We are offered the grace to bring hope to the hopeless and that shines Christ's light into the darkness. Easter cannot be some beautiful garden that we enter once a year for a moment of joy. Easter must become in us a way of living that continually opens our eyes and hearts so that our lives in turn may do the same for others.

Three women, **Nour Otremba, Lauren Dawson,** and **Yesenia Gonzalez**, lead us forth this year as, they move through death to new life in Christ at the Easter Vigil, they entered into

new life in Christ and the Spirit through the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation, and became part of the Body of Christ through the Eucharist. Soon, over 100 high school teens will be sealed in the Spirit at Confirmation; over 100 children will join us as the Body of Christ in their First Communion. These women, youth, and children challenge us to remember and be grateful for the blessings of grace that God has bestowed upon us.

Thank you to the *many* ministers whose hands, hearts, and voices bring beauty, spirit, and joy to our worship. Many hours are given in preparing for these celebrations for which we strive to give our best to the holiest celebrations of our parish year. Thanks also to those who minister through our Food Pantry, to our children, and to those separated from us by illness or physical limitations. Thanks to those who step up to lead and coordinate the opportunities to share and deepen our faith during Lent and throughout the year, and those who participate and thereby enrich us all.

Where does the Risen Lord seek to lead and send us? How does the Spirit hope to set the world on fire through our words and actions? As with the first witnesses to Easter joy, the journey is just beginning!

Easter 2022

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

As we gather this year to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection, we cannot avoid our circumstances. Shadows of sin and death loom large over us. The pandemic, our experience of social unrest and daily violence on our streets, and, of course, the horrors of war in Ukraine and other parts of the world—all remind us how much we need the Lord's redemptive and healing power in our lives.

Our source of hope amid these challenges is anchored in all that we have witnessed in the liturgies of Holy Week. We have celebrated that the Lord Jesus entered into the fullness of our human experience. He went to the very darkest edges of that human experience. He entered into our suffering, struggle, and even our desperation, when he cried out on the cross, "My God, my God, why have your abandoned me?" He squarely faced sin and death on the cross.

And it was precisely in the moment he fully emptied himself, placing himself totally in the hands of God, that he was raised up from the dead victorious. But, his rising from the dead is not just a matter of his personal vindication, He came back from the dead for us, to give us a share in his victory. This is what takes place in our Baptism, which is confirmed in the Holy Spirit, and sustained by the Eucharistic. He lives in us, and his victory over sin and death lives in us as well.

As Pope Francis reminds us, we need to share the victory of the resurrection with others, as Jesus did with us. We do this by being sisters and brothers to one another. As Church, we are a family of faith that walks with each other in moments of pain, struggle, and are never abandoned. My prayer for all of us in the Archdiocese of Chicago is that we will stand firm in hope, confident that the One who has gone before us in death has come back from the dead for us. May the peace of the Risen Lord be with you and those you love.

THE FEAST OF MERCY

(Divine Mercy Sunday)



The Feast of Mercy or Divine Mercy Sunday has been celebrated in many countries, dioceses and parishes for many years. Pope John Paul II, the Cardinals, Bishops and Priests who have read the diary of St. Faustina have come to appreciate the significance of this feast. But now, ever since the Holy See had decreed that the "Second Sunday of Easter would be known as Divine Mercy Sunday," many more are seeking to go more deeply into the words of Our Lord to St. Faustina that were meant for all humanity.

Pope John Paul II in his homily at the canonization of Sr. Faustina on April 30, 2000 said: "Jesus shows His hands and His side. He points, that is, to the wounds of the Passion, especially the wound in His Heart, the source from which flows the great wave of mercy poured out on humanity".

The image of Jesus, The Divine Mercy, is to have a special place of honor on the Feast of Mercy, a visual reminder of all that Jesus did for us through His Passion, Death, and Resurrection ... and a reminder, too, of what He asks of us in return - to trust Him and be merciful to others.

The Eucharist is the "Fountain of Life". The Eucharist is Jesus, Himself, the Living God, longing to pour Himself as Mercy into our hearts.

Your Gift, God's Hands

Each month we feature how your stewardship contributes to the Parish mission. At the Easter Vigil, three women entered the Catholic Church by Baptism, First Eucharist, and Confirmation after 8 months on the RCIA journey (*Rite of Christian Initiation*) at SFX. Two of these women—Yesenia Gonzalez and Nour Otremba— share some of their faith journeys below.



"Mom, are you coming for communion?" Nour's 4-year-old asked as the church pews slowly emptied into communion lines. Over a year later, Nour recounts that this was the moment that she realized: "I need to make a decision." For the first time, it felt right for her – a Muslim woman – to explore the possibility of becoming Catholic.

Nour grew up in an Arabic-Muslim household, with a mother whose self-proclaimed goal was "to ensure that [her children] believe in God and have strong values." Nour's mother even sent her to an all-girl's Catholic school beginning in 6th grade. In school Nour never felt like an outsider, instead she saw so many similarities between her core values in Islam and the core values of Christianity. Those same core values eventually connected her to her husband, whom she met in college.

"We had such similar values – and our parents were both first generation immigrants," she explains. Joining her husband's Polish-Catholic family especially influenced Nour. Her husband's family was "extremely warm and welcoming," "family-oriented," and "dedicated – they will do anything for their kids." All in all, Nour describes them as amazing role models for raising one's family "in a village."

A huge part of the Otremba family culture includes the Catholic faith: "They showed me that it takes all of it – God, family, community – to make really solid, happy kids at the end of the day."

For Nour, attending Mass was strange in the beginning – but it "slowly became more natural." The more she attended Mass with her husband and children, the more she began to realize that it was a "really positive experience for the whole family."

She now sees how God actively worked to open her heart to the possibility of conversion, especially during the pandemic. "Being in quarantine really makes you realize what's important – I think a lot of people realized that family is so important – so [I started asking] what do I do to preserve that and make it the best it can be? And I think then my heart opened," Nour reflects.

After noticing an invitation to join RCIA in the bulletin, Nour reached out and received assurance from the team that she didn't have to commit right away, but could just come to check it out. "Each and every time I found more positives," Nour recounts, "it was very refreshing, each time I felt closer to God, closer to my family. As many questions as I had, I started getting a lot of answers and a lot of clarity." The RCIA process helped her work through other life experiences and challenges and has helped her feel even more united with her husband. "Having God at the center of your marriage is so critical!" she exclaims.

"I want to thank [the RCIA team], it's amazing to see how dedicated they are... this is something that they love! They are a huge source of the reason I am moving forward on this path," Nour continues, "the whole group is just excellent, I feel like we've formed our own little family."

When asked about how she will feel after entering the Church at the Easter Vigil, she says "I've already started to feel it... content? Is it clarity? Or just... more whole? At *peace!*"

"I kept feeling like I was missing something, I felt that for a long time... and I would try to explain it to my mom: 'I feel like there is something that I need."

Yesenia spent much of her childhood with her very Catholic grandmother, but she herself was never baptized. She recounts that she "always wanted to be part of the Church, to be Catholic and actually be baptized...but it was something I was always questioning because I didn't want to do it just because of my grandma. I wanted to choose it for me." Even as she entered adulthood, Yesenia kept asking questions.

The first answer to her questions came in the form of her husband, Eli, who was raised Catholic himself. "Before Eli, I didn't pray – I didn't know how to – I had seen my grandma pray, but she was very private. I always thought it was a private thing. But Eli would pray out loud while I was in the room." Yesenia remembers the beauty of the way Eli would pray with the intention of her listening in, "but it was for us... he was praying for us! It was very moving."



This experience not only taught Yesenia how to pray, but also helped her "realize that this man is close to God." She thought, "he has a relationship with God, and I wanted to be a part of that – and have my own relationship [with God] too!" Suddenly such a relationship seemed possible.

Her journey came to a decision point when she and Eli were struggling to conceive a child. "During that time I especially needed someone, and that someone was God. I wasn't sure how to pray, but I would have conversations with God... It felt like we were never going to get pregnant. Having those talks with God, [I felt] like someone was listening. [I felt like] this is what I was missing... and this is what I need in my life."

When they finally arrived at St. Francis Xavier – three months pregnant with their daughter, Luna – Yesenia knew she had found something special. After attending Mass at SFX, she thought: "This is it!" As she took the step to reach out about RCIA, she remembers feeling nervous that the Church would not want her. After her first conversation with a team member, she realized: "Wow! They actually want me to be a part of the RCIA program!"

"I didn't know what to expect, but it has been a beautiful journey. I'm just excited to finally get baptized... the fact that I'm going to do it is amazing!" Yesenia beams.


