Pastor's Notes

"Remain in me, as I remain in you." John 15:4

The Eastertime gospels offer rich images of God's desire to be in an intimate relationship with us as individuals and as a community of believers. Perhaps the most vivid image is the one proclaimed this Sunday. *Christ is the vine; we are the branches*. God the Father is the vine grower; and the Spirit is the "juice" that flows through the vine into the branches, making it possible for the branches to bear fruit.

We see trees and bushes blossoming all around us. Most branches produce leaves and even flowers; some branches, however, remain barren and brittle. They have lost their ability to produce life; yet often these barren branches continue to take resources away from the branches that continue to produce life. When we trim away the barren branches, the remaining branches will grow even fuller.

Sometimes, even "living" branches need to be cut back so that growth is focused rather than haphazard. I must remember this every time the plant in my office begins to get a bit "leggy." When I let the plant grow, untended, the vines grow longer, yet the leaves remain small, and the plant suffers; when I prune the vines, the remaining leaves grow larger and greener.

Jesus speaks of his desire to *live in us,* so that we might have life in the Body of Christ and the power of the Spirit. But he also desires that we *live in him,* so that <u>all</u> we say and do is rooted in his life and love. **God** – Father, Son, and Spirit – **desires an** *intimate* **relationship with us**, as individuals and as a community of believers. In and through us, God desires to bear the *good* *fruit* of compassion, justice, and mercy in society and in our relationships with one another and those we serve.

This weekend, we welcome to the Table of Eucharist our young sisters and brothers in second grade. Christ welcomes them into his Body to become one with the rest of us and to go out with us to bring *Christ in us* to others. It is obvious that there can only be one moment of "First" Eucharist; yet this one moment initiates a life of "forever" Eucharist. Christ will continue to reshape these children and the rest of us into one body in Him. We, in turn, nurture and encourage one another, willing to have God prune away whatever no longer produces life and whatever weakens, rather than strengthens God's life in us. Welcome, boys and girls! May you always find a place of welcome and encouragement and use your gift in service of our mission to bring Christ to others.
