Pastor's Notes

"The Lord is God, and there is no other." Deuteronomy 4:35 "I am with you always." Matthew 28:20 "The Spirit bears witness with our spirit." Romans 8:16

We are created in the image and likeness of God. We are baptized in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. We are the children of God, the Body of Christ, and the dwelling place of the Spirit. In all the ways we identify ourselves, we are the visible presence of one God expressed in three Persons. Each Person is distinct; each has a specific activity, both within and beyond the created world as we know it. Yet these three persons live in such intimate communion that each always act in harmony with the other two. This is God, in whose likeness we are created.

We are diverse individuals in appearance, ability, and interests. And we are in communion with one another so intimately that we are most ourselves as individuals when we live and act in harmony. "I" fully express my purpose or mission only when in communion with others. "We" fully express our communion only when we recognize, nurture, and celebrate the gifts and talents of each individual. Such is the mystery in which we dwell: the reality of God and of humankind that we cannot fully comprehend and into which we continue to move more deeply.

Most of us can understand the attitude of the first disciples when, in the presence of the Risen Lord, "they

worshipped, but they doubted." Triangles and shamrocks only take us so far in explaining to ourselves or others the reality of one who are many. The Feast of the Trinity challenges us to worship one God in three Persons even as we embrace our doubts and confusion. The God who created us, formed us as communion, and dwells within us continues to bear witness to the world through us. The Trinity is at once both blessing and challenge.

* * * * * * * *

Memorial Day calls us to remember and honor countless men and women who gave their lives in service to country and the ideals we hold sacred. Even when the cause is opposed by some or later judged as less than honorable, we honor those who were willing to sacrifice their lives because of what they believed to be a just cause. Memorial Day is rooted in our nation's Civil War and was a call to decorate the graves of Union and Confederate soldiers. We are called in our day to honor the lives of those who died in war, or whose death came as an eventual physical or emotional result of serving in a war. We may even extend this to those who sacrificed their lives in struggles for justice and peace in a land that proclaims freedom and justice for all. May the souls of all who died in service to our country and its ideals rest in peace.

Scripture Reflection

When questioned about the Trinity, many catechists or others resort to, "It's a mystery. We can't understand it." While that may be true, it doesn't mean we don't think about it. A Mystery of faith is in some ways similar to the mystery of the universe. We plumb its depths. We examine it from various angles. We ask questions. We discuss. We debate. And we find that we have not exhausted the topic; rather, it has exhausted us. And we return to it again later, learning more with each engagement. Dismissing any consideration of the Trinity solely because it is a mystery does us a disservice as rational yet faith-filled Christians. Many theologians have sought to express various aspects of this mystery through the centuries, and many more will continue to do so into the future.

Part of our living the mystery is to know that we will never fully comprehend or understand all of what it means for God to be a Trinity. In the same manner, we will never fully comprehend or understand the entirety of the universe. But we can approach each mystery with humility and a sense of wonder and respect. Jesus is the incarnate God. He called God Father, and promised to send the Spirit who would remind his disciples about Jesus. Each of us has been baptized into the life of the Trinity and will continue to let that meaning unfold each day of our ongoing lives.




